I am going to the library. The library is a big building with books and other things – like movies and music – that I can borrow and take home.



Before I go to the library, I pack the things I want to take with me. I might take my water bottle in case I get thirsty, my library card and a bag to carry books.



I will walk through sliding glass doors to enter the library. The doors make a noise when they open and close.



Inside the library, I will see people, shelves of books, computers and colourful posters.

I will be going to the children's area at the library for storytime.



At storytime the librarian will read stories. I will remember to sit on the floor and listen when the librarian is speaking.



The librarian will also sing songs and teach us the movements. I can sing and move too.




There will be other families and children at storytime. It can be noisy and crowded.

Before I leave the library, I might choose some books to borrow and read at home. I can borrow them for three weeks. Then I have to take them back to the library so other people can read them. My grown-up will help me to remember when to bring the books back to the library.



After storytime, my family and I might stay for a while or it might be time to go.
