

RESERVOIR CRUSH PRAHRAN

With better understanding and teamwork, Reservoir completely outplayed a disappointing Prahran at Crispe Park last Saturday and ran

out winners by 88 points.

With first use of the wind, Prahran opened confidently and drew first blood with a major. From the bounce, they attacked again and had the Reservoir backline working overtime. A point to open Reservoir's account and then cahran came down the centre to goal again. And Gellie, playing his first senior game passed to Ward who goaled. This was followed by a string of behinds until Ward "sunk" his second to give Reservoir a narrow lead.

With the breeze, Reservoir showed better teamwork, but could not kick goals, Gellie handballed to Ward for his 3rd. Prahran turned to negative football and bottled play on

the non-scoring flank.

Prahran goaled on the bell.

The last term was all Reservoir, and goals to Weir and Alan Chandler put them further ahead. Prahran surged forward but Hawkless cleared and started a chain of passes via Sutton and Hosking to Ward, who scored the maximum. Hosking and then Weir goaled to bring up Reservoir's 14th goal.

Goals: Ward 6, Weir 3, Chandler 3, Hosking 2.




