RESERVOIR TOO GOOD FOR HAWKS

With solid backing up and greater strength Reservoir knocked East Hawthorn from fourth billing in a tough game played under adverse conditions at St. James Park last Saturday. The defeat of North by Y.C.W. gives the "red

The ground was very slippery as players took the field and neither end had any scoring advantage. Play was reasonable under the conditions and small men had a decided advantage. McArthur was reliable in defence and Wood was prominent on the ball. Reservoir could only manage one point in the first quarter to Hawks goal.




