

Once again Reservoir journey to North Melb to do battle with the "Kanga's". Many support -ers are still discussing last year's clash, when after one of the season's most spirited and hard bumping matches, the Northerners

scraped home by one point.

Eager to avenge this defeat, coach ALAN CHANDLER has the Reservoir boys training very well. The side has been strengthened by the inclusion of new players notably JOHN WALLACE and "SOB" RAE who gave outstanding performancs in the opening game against Preston Y.C.W. The feature of this win was the dominance of the half-back line with RON McARTHUR unbeatable at the centre-half-back post and the support given him by flankers BARRY McCRIMMON and "Berlei"HAWKLESS. This first line of defence promises to be a stumbling block to the "Kanga's", and with the ever reliable DON SUTTON already in top gear, and GORDON RICHMOND and KEN HOSKING providing "nippiness" around the packs the side really looks "the goods". The forward line appeared over-anxious against Y.C.W. and took some time to settle down. but if full-forward NEV WARD and "TINY" KEOGH are given more room today they are sure to post plenty of "sixers".

North also have improved and are certainly playing on. Their big men dominated the game against last years finalists, Brunswick and heir rovers and half-forward line did the rest; - a most impressive opening performance.

This match should be a thriller. North has the home ground advantage and will be keen to post their second win. However, I think "REZZA" can overcome this and with their great physical strength take the points in what could be a "photo-finish".

RESERVOIR TOO STRONG FOR PRESTON Y.C.W.

Reservoir proved too strong for Preston Y.C.W. in the opening game at Crispe Park on the 18th April and ran out winners by 38 points after being down early.

Before the game both sides paid tribute to Mr. George Thorpe, life member of Reser-

voir, who passed away on Tuesday 14th.

Alan Chandler won the toss and elected to kick with a slight breeze. Reservoir goaled within seconds of the bounce through Tony Merrett. Preston responded quiely and with two goals took the lead, but stern defence by Ron McArthur repelled further determined attacks. Reservoir surged forward and Ward goaled, but Preston, outplaying the home side, added 2 goals to give them a handy lead at the first change.

Newcomer John Wallace began to "take over" in the ruck, and with the small brigade, led by John Rae taking full advantage of these opportunities, Reservoir regained the lead. Preston attacked but were repelled by McCrimmon and Hawkless. Don Sutton and Key Chatley were on top across the centre and gave the forwards many chances but poor accuracy let the side down, and in contrast 2 good goals to Preston gave the visitors a 7 point lead at half-time.

After the break, Reservoir moved more like a final side and goals to Keogh and Lard restored the lead within minutes, Tony Merrett then booted his second. Preston rallied for another goal but Keogh with 2 more goals put the locals well ahead. In the last quarter Reservoir called the tune, to kick 4 goals to Preston's 1 and ran out easy winners. 


