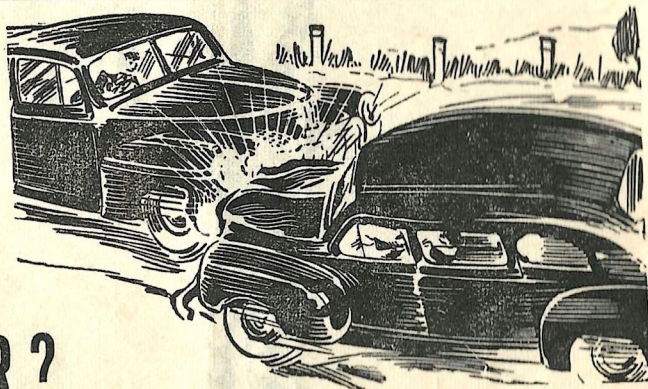

RESERVOIR OPPOSE SUNSHINE TODAY

"Home Sweet Home" would be the most popular song among the Reservoir players this week, I'm sure. What with "kite-shaped" ovals, the playing surface having more ups and downs than a lift at Myers, and inaccurate kicking, Reservoir were in more trouble than a "centipede with tinea" down at North Melb. last week.

Today against Sunshine, they will be anxious to avenge this defeat, and I expect to see about 3 changes in the line-up. The inclusion of experienced BILL McLAUGHLAN, who has transferred over from Lakeside, will bolster the last line of defence, while last years stars "BIGGER" BOB CHANDLER, and "PUDDIN WOOD" are expected to be over injuries and available for selection. With TONY MERRETT absent this week, "Puddin" will share the roving with GORDON RICHMOND. REZZA'S centre line of RAE SUTTON & CHATLEY will give great drive, and with NEV WARD and BRIAN OSMOND showing good form early in the season, the locals look a real good side.

The goal to goal line is a good one on paper, and they seem to be settling down and playing as a team.

Sunshine are a much better side than last season, and they seem to have found that extra yard of pace which is so vital on a big ground like Crispe Park. Their fast play-on brand of football usually gets them away to a good start, and this could be a telling factor because Reservoir are notorious slow starters.

However, the "red and whites" always play well at home, and their more direct game, combined with vigour would make them slight favourites today, but the result should be close in a hard fought struggle..... TSHAF.

RESERVOIR FAIL IN CLOSE FINISH

Due mainly to inaccuracy and a slow start, Reservoir just failed against North Melbourne at North last Saturday.

North attacked from the bounce and after 5 minutes had scored 2 goals. Reservoir were being beaten around the packs, although small men Richmond and Rae were in everything, Reservoir surged forward but could not kick goals on the awkward shaped ground and only behinds resulted. North used vigor freely & Ward was felled twice. A goal to North made then 15 points up at the first change.

Putting the pressure on, North opened the second quarter with two more goals. Then Reservoir attacked, and when ~~Bahen~~ handballed to Chandler who booted their first goal, Reservoir "came to life". Goals to Rae & Ward brought the visitors to within 10 points, but a major to North gave then a handy lead at half-time.

The third quarter saw Sutton, Weir and McArthur take control in the air; Rae and Chatley began to dominate on the wings, and Osmond, rarely sighted early, kicked two glorious goals. Ward followed with a 60 yarder and Reservoir were 3 points down. North rallied for 2 goals and Richmond replied with 1 for Reservoir.

An early goal to North took them further ahead, but Merrett flashed in for a good goal to Reservoir. McLaughlin, McArthur, and James repeatedly turned the opposition out and with clearing dashes turned defence into attack. Ward goaled and Keogh kicked a behind to level the scores, but North surged forward and with 2 points, & then a goal from a free, took an 8 point lead with seconds to go.
