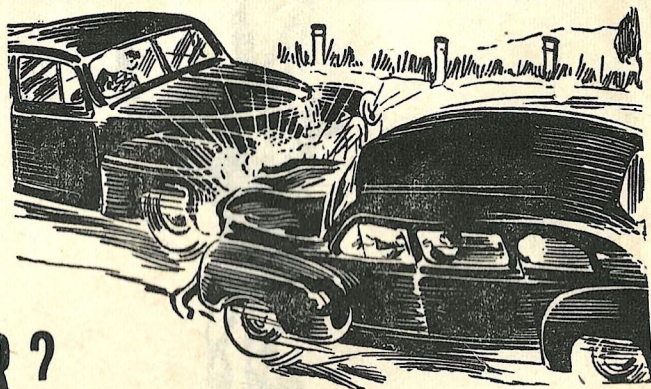

"Veteran", Alan Chandler has been battling grandly in the ruck and with Ian Wood back in the side roving, Reservoir should control the game around the packs.

"Isaac" Osmond is now running "in top gear" and his long kicks will penetrate to the goal square where champion full forward Nev. Ward is having a great season.

"Rezza" are trying to build up their percentage and with some very hard games ahead they will be "flat out" today, to win and win well.
