#### RESERVOIR UNTROUBLED AT RICHMOND

Richmond then kicked their 3rd but ward booted another 2 majors to give Reservoir a 33 point lead at half-time.

Richmond attacked but Hawkless cleared three times. Sutton was coming into his own in the centre. Gordon Richmond goaled, and then the play was scrambly by the close play of the Richmond backs.

a good forward display.




