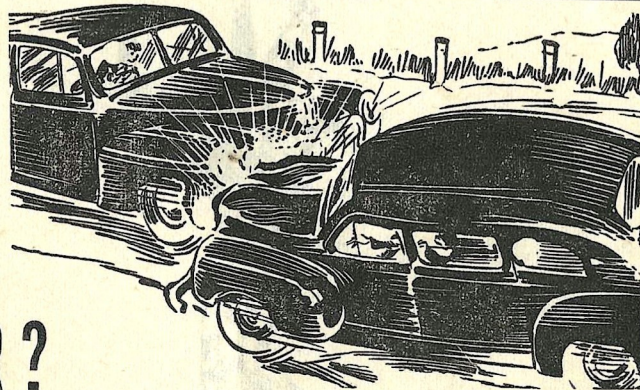

With fast systematic football at Crispo Park, Reservoir completely outclassed Wanderers to run out the easiest of winners.

Reservoir kicked against a light breeze and after 8 minutes play had scored 3 goals, all to Ward. Wanderers had no answer for Reservoir's "new look" half forward line of Bahen, Sutton, and Rodda who continually drove the ball forward to full-forward Ward. Wanderers fought hard, but could not penetrate the solid half back line, where McArthur was in everything.

In the second term, Wanderers forged forward and scored their first and only major, and followed up with two hard-earned behinds. From then on, however, Reservoir took full control. Allwell and Faulkingham were winning on the wings and McLaughlin was sending the ball forward continually from the pivot.

Both combinations of Whittenbury and Alan Chandler and Weir and Hatton were dominating the ruck duels whilst Merrett and Richmond capitalised on this winning department. At half-time Reservoir led 11-18 to 1-2.

After the break Wanderers were a more determined side, but could not pass James and Hawkless who were marking brilliantly. McCrimmon was also marking well and his "straight ahead" type of game was pushing the ball into the Reservoir scoring zone.

The last quarter saw Reservoir going further ahead with players kicking goals from everywhere. Ward continued to boot them through and finished with a tally of 15. Final scores: Reservoir 28-31-199 defeated Wanderers 1-2-8.

GOALS: Ward 15, Rodda, Merrett, Sutton 3 each; McLaughlan 2, Richmond and Allwell.

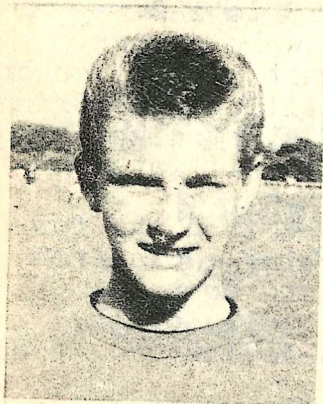

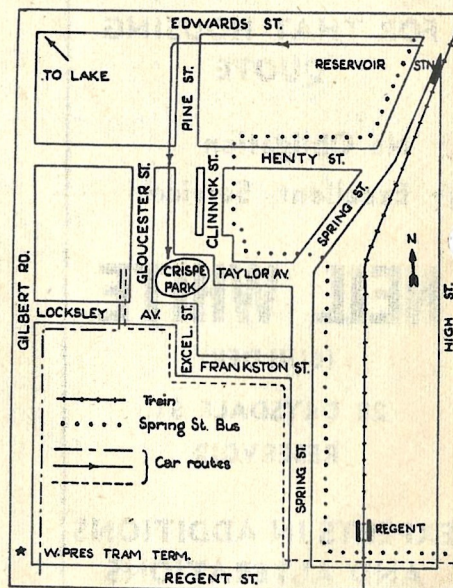
