Notes & Comments.

The Preston Fire Brigade competition last Saturday was not such a great success as anticipated, owing to the rain. Some of the events were held over till to-day. The events which were run off are as follows: Best team of eight in brigade was won by No. 1 team; time 53 secs. Ladder race was by J. E. Walker, from scratch; time, 11 and one-fifth secs; J. H. Thomson, second. The remaining heats to be run off this afternoon are—Best team of four in brigade; hydrant race, for two medals; and married v single, team of eight each.

On Monday, about 11 a.m., a man named James Cooney, whilst driving a horse in a drag, in Separation-street, Northcote, fell down in a fit. He was conveyed to the Melbourne Hospital by Constable Warren. On examination, he was found to be suffering from a hysterical fit.

An unfortunate accident happened to a man named George Duncan on Thursday morning, in High-street, Preston. Duncan, who is a driver on one of the Preston cabs, got down to hand a woman a parcel when the horses moved on, he went to stop them and fell over the gas pipe track, and the wheels went over him. He was attended by Dr Wilkinson, and it was found his thigh had been broken in two places. He was taken to the Melbourne Hospital.

Anniversary services were held in Trinity Church, Upper Northcote, on Sunday last and were largely attended. On Monday evening a tea and entertainment took place, and proved very successful.

On Tuesday evening, at about a quarter to 12, the Northcote fire-bell tolled out the alarm of fire. The brigade turned out in double quick time. When the scene of the conflagration was reached, it was found to be a tree on fire off Clarke-street. The brigade soon settled the blazing.

Advertising

The Garonne Collision.

The Colombo mail brought on by the R.M.S. Ballarat has no account of the collision between the Orient Company's R.M.S. Garonne and the steamship Lucinda in the Red Sea, but one of the Garonne's late passengers has furnished the following statement:—The officer of the watch on the Garonne saw the Lucinda approaching, green light to green light, 10 min. before the collision. The Garonne whistled and signalled to the Lucinda to port her helm, but with no effect. The Garonne's engines were reversed for five minutes but there appeared to be no watch on board the Lucinda, as no attention was paid to the signals. The Garonne must have struck the Lucinda amid-ship, and having overhanging bows she stretched over the Lucinda. At once 20 men clambered over from the sinking ship and were saved. One man was supposed to have been killed in the collision, and another, a cripple declined to make any attempt to save himself though repeatedly urged to do so, saying he could not swim, and he was sucked down with the wreck. The Lucinda sank in between 20 minutes to half-an-hour after being struck. The Garonne's bows were so much smashed that water was only kept out by the forward bulkhead, which was full of water. The Garonne steamed back towards Suez at 6 knots an hour and after 36 hours travelling met the steamship City of Agra, which vessel took on board a number of third class passengers, thereby lightening the Garonne considerably forward. The vessel then turned back to Aden. The accident occurred midway in the Red Sea, at about 4 o'clock in the morning.—Age.

Some members of the Heideberg shire council on Wednesday complained to the Railway Commissioners that during the construction of Heideberg railway the approach roads to Fairfield and Alphington stations had been rendered almost impassable by the contractors' traffic. As these roads were private roads, and were now to be thrown open to the public, they hoped the department would assist in providing funds for their re-construction. The commissioners said that in view of the exceptional character of the circumstances attending the application, they would contribute half the cost.

Undelivered Letters.

The Postmaster-General has deter-
mined to institute fresh proceedings
against the lad Stephenson, who was
employed to deliver letters at Malvern
and being recently prosecuted for neg-
lecting to deliver correspondence en-
trusted to his charge, escaped with a
nominal fine. In addition to the second
batch of letters that were notified in
Monday's papers as having been found
under a hedge, the department is now
informed of another find of about 100
undelivered letters in the same vicinity.
All of them bear postmarks showing
that they passed through the office be-
tween the 4th and 9th May, at which
time Stephenson was responsible for
their delivery. They had not been
opened but were much damaged by the
rain. Included amongst them were two
important business communications,
the miscarriage of which has been the
subject of much enquiry. Stephenson
does not appear to have been actually
dishonest, but merely too lazy to per-
form his duties.
