PRESTON SHIRE COUNCIL.

MONDAY, DECEMBER 3RD.

COMMEMORATION.

CONSTRUCTION JEFFREY STREET.

F. Hickey wrote against the construction of Jeffrey Street. In the first place he did not consider the work necessary, and in the second he could not afford the money. For some years he had been living in lodgings this part of two years. He entered his protest against being put to the expense of legal proceedings.

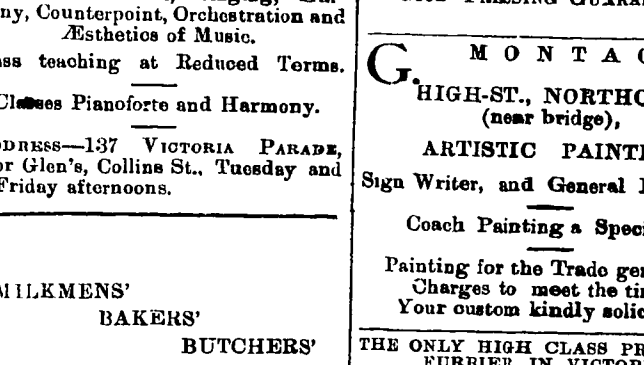
