PRESTON SHIRE COUNCIL.

MONDAY, 2ND APRIL.

Present:—Mr. Braithwaite (in the chair), Crispe, Newton, Marshall, and Robertson.

STAGNANT DRAINAGE. Charles Stanlake wrote requesting that the channelling in Arthur street be started as soon as possible, as fever may arise from the present stagnant drainage.—To be considered with surveyor's report.

METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS MANAGEMENT. F. J. Healey wrote relative to the proposed inquiry into the management of the Metropolitan Board of Works, requesting the council to forward any complaints or suggestions which it might desire placed before the Inquiry Board for investigation.

Cr. Crispe (the council's representative on the Board) observed that the Preston council had no charges to make and should not be made the complainant of the Richmond council, which had formulated certain charges. No action was taken.

Mr. J. Lang, secretary of the Preston Rifle Club, made application for the hall (then of the club) for a period of about three months, also for the use of a room in which to hold the meetings of the club. The water stated that before the club would be allowed to use an open-air target it was imperative that lectures on the theory and practice of marksmanship (without charges) be given. Cr. Newton moved that the request be complied with. Considering the activity prevailing in respect to military matters, the assistance offered by the Government in establishing rifle clubs, he thought the council should do all in its power to encourage the movement.

Cr. Crispe seconded the motion. When the proposal was first made he considered the club a military organization, but, on further consideration, he came to the conclusion that the council should help the young fellows, as much as possible, more especially as past governments had pursued such a cheerless policy in respect to military matters.

The chairman remarked that the granting of the hall would be a boon to the club. He hoped the council would not only make the concession asked for, but that it would be prepared to go further when the erection of the hall was being considered. The club had for its captain an officer second to none in the colony. Major Palmer had made military knowledge and study and was consequently well qualified to give instruction in the use and management of the rifle. He trusted the council would graciously comply with the request.

The motion was carried unanimously. ADDITIONAL POSTAL ACCOMMODATION. Mr. J. S. Gair forwarded correspondence to the effect that the Postmaster General would receive a deputation request in addition to postal conveniences on Wednesday, 12th inst., the deputation being unable to attend on the date fixed, and the deputation was requested to be postponed for a week.

FIRE BRIGADE ACCOUNT. An account for £22 3s 4d was received from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board. In reply to a question the secretary said that the account was based on the valuation of each property. The last account was £27.

Cr. Crispe moved that the account be sent to their representative (Mr. Robertson) for his consideration. Cr. Newton seconded.—Carried.

WORKERS' WAGES. The Hawthorn council forwarded a statement, showing the wages paid to laborers by the various metropolitan municipalities.—Deferred to the committee of the whole on the motion of Crs. Crispe and Robertson.

DESTRUCTIVE DAMAGE. Gilbert Robinson complained that several small drains across Carlisle street required immediate attention. Cr. Robertson said the work was urgent and moved that it be referred to surveyor for report.—Carried.

PERMISSION TO USE PARK. Salvation Army, South Melbourne, applied for the use of the park on Easter Monday for their annual gathering. Granted, subject to the usual conditions, on the motion of Crs. Newton and Crispe.

DANGER SIGNAL. Secretary League Victoria Wheelmen drew council's attention to the dangerous character of the road at corner of Dool street, near the sewer road, and asked the council to erect a notice-board if the league supplied it.

Cr. Crispe moved and Cr. Marshall seconded that the request be complied with.—Carried.

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE. Cr. Crispe submitted the report, recommending—Adopted. That accounts amounting to £73 12s 1d be passed for payment.—Adopted.

That five lamp pillars and lanterns be obtained from the city council at a cost of £2 10s.—Adopted. That the accounts of the Public Works Committee be referred for consideration till next meeting.—Adopted.

Cr. Robertson called for a division. For—Crs. Crispe, Marshall, and the chairman; against—Crs. Robertson and Newton.

FINANCE COMMITTEE. Cr. Robertson submitted the report, recommending—Adopted. That accounts amounting to £123 11s 6d (including £73 12s 1d public works, and £50 7s 6d, ap-

proceeds of the sale of the property of the late Mr. J. H. Smith, be referred to the committee of the whole, and moved an amendment to that effect.

These being no second, the motion for the adoption of the clause was put and carried.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE. Subject to the provisions of the Health Act permission was granted to J. Healy, A. Strangman, and E. Sullivan to use signboards.

That consideration of solicitor's letter re non-payment of license be held over.—Adopted.

Northcote drainage.—That action be deferred until next meeting.—Adopted.

Dr. Williams reported that the order made by the Governor-in-Council on 23rd March for the suppression of the pest was carried out.
