

Preston District F.C. wrote stating that on giving up park for season they left everything clean and in good condition, and objecting to be saddled with the expense of repairing windows which had been broken subsequent to their giving up possession.—Referred to parks committee, on the motion of Crs. Warr and Stanlake.

Lamp at R.C. Church. E. J. Sullivan, secretary R.C. Church committee, wrote thanking council for promise to erect lamp opposite the R.C. Church in Hill Street, and asking that same might be put up by the 12th, as a night mission starts on that date.

The engineer said he had been trying to procure lamp pillars, but had been unsuccessful so far. It was resolved that the lamp be erected as soon as possible.
