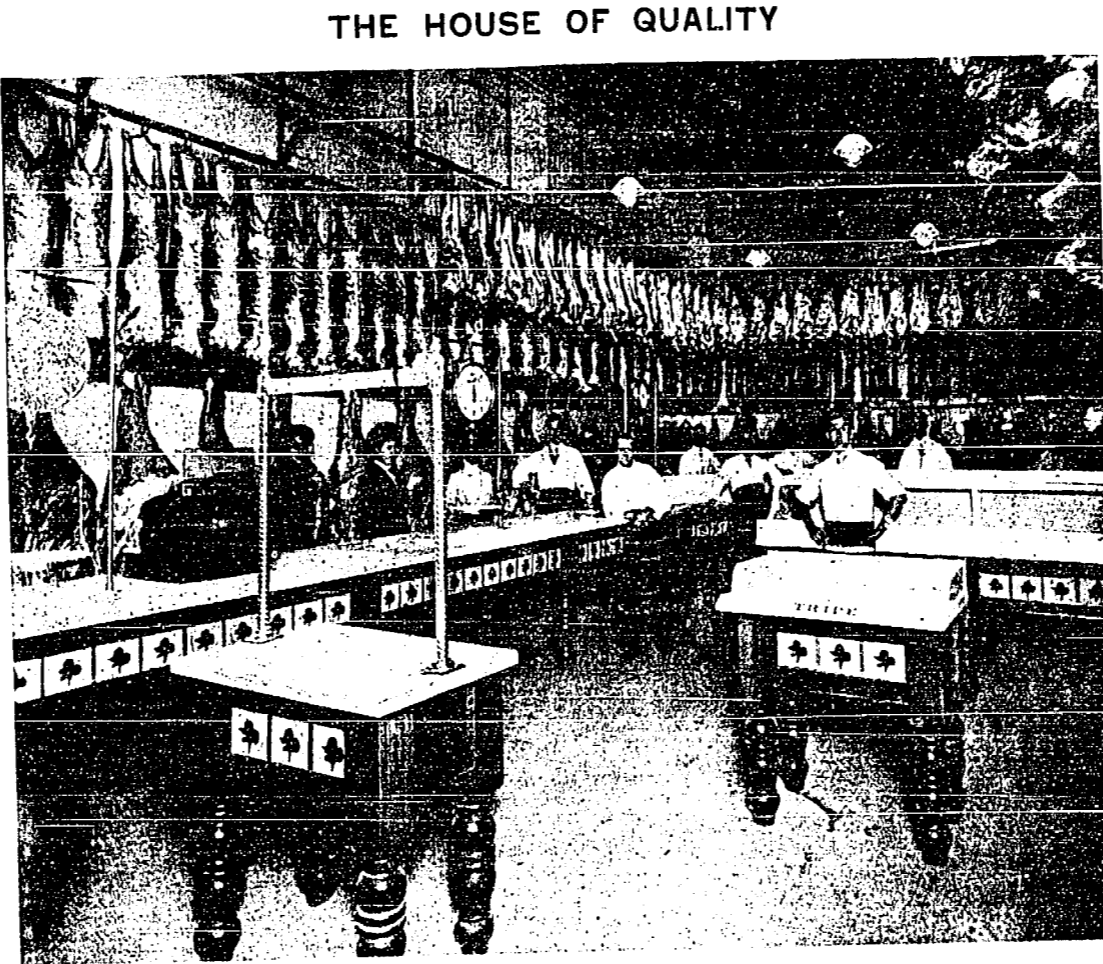

**J. C. HUTTON'S PIGSTIES.**

Pursuant to notice given, Cr. Allekin moved, at the meeting of the Preston Council, on Monday evening.

That the resolution carried on February 20th, 1911, viz., "that Messrs. J. C. Hutton be notified that the council objects to the building of the pig sties on the site shown on the plan submitted," and any other resolution or resolutions bearing on the same be rescinded, and continuing on the above being carried, that the following resolution be substituted, viz., "that this council hereby approves of and grants permission to Messrs. J. C. Hutton Pty. Ltd. to use the site premises, on the site above mentioned, for pig sties."

He did not intend to dwell long on this question, as it had already been thoroughly thrashed out. His object in tabling this motion was to put J. C. Hutton on a fair footing. They (the council) knew they were using the site illegally, and he wished the question to be settled once and for all. They should either give them permission to use the premises or else prosecute them for illegally using them. It was said the sties would be detrimental to the value of property in the locality, but, on the other hand, the value of property in Wan-savenne had gone up; besides, there were four fine shops going up within a stone's throw of the factory. The council knew the value of the premises, and they should be fair to them.

The President: No; we don't know. Cr. Allekin: They also had their solicitor's opinion, which said the council had a weak case. The council had received the plans of the sties before they were commenced, but they had not been submitted in open council, and it was only an oversight on Hutton's part that they did not apply when the time of notice had elapsed. He (Cr. Allekin) asked the president to have the letters received from the Board of Health read.

The President: I have refused to have the letters read before, and I cannot grant the request now.

Cr. Hovess seconded the resolution, stating he considered that it would be wise for councillors to carry the resolution.

The motion was then put, and declared lost.

Cr. Allekin called for a division. For—Cr. Allekin, Hovess, Hovess and Patterson. Against—The President, and Crs. Warr, Crisp and Stanlake.

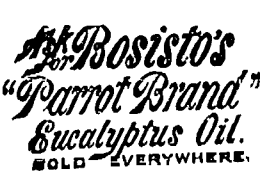






**A SUGGESTION.**

To the Editor.  
 Sir, Now that we are to have a valuation at a cost of £100,000 that all property is valued at its fair value, having regard for those people who are as yet unimproved with a decent roadway. If we will permit, I would like to see the blocks held up for speculation or if not built upon within 12 months compel the owners of those blocks to pay rates as if a house were erected on the ground. Why should residents who keep their houses and surroundings worthy of the locality and have to put up with muddy roads be compelled to pay heavy rates, while other men hold vacant blocks and the hope that as we improve our property their land will increase in value, thus depriving the council of revenue, the business men of trade, and retarding the progress of the town in general, not to say that a few shillings per year? This is a problem that will have to be dealt with sooner or later by our council. Have we got a public man good enough to take the odds and face the music? He would be a public benefactor. I would like to raise our rates 1d. or 2d. in the £, say, for 2 or 3 years, a limit of time to be a distinct understanding. The whole revenue, about £1000 per annum, derived from this source to be expended on street construction and repairs. Surely no resident who intends to make Northcote his permanent abode would object. We must have better roads. We must go ahead, and I do not care who our councillors may be, they cannot bring Northcote forward and place it in its natural position, Melbourne's ideal suburb, on the funds now available. Finding fault with the council is very easy, but we must give them the opportunity and the capital before we can censure them.  
 I put these suggestions through the medium of your most useful paper for the serious consideration of our public men—Yours, etc.,

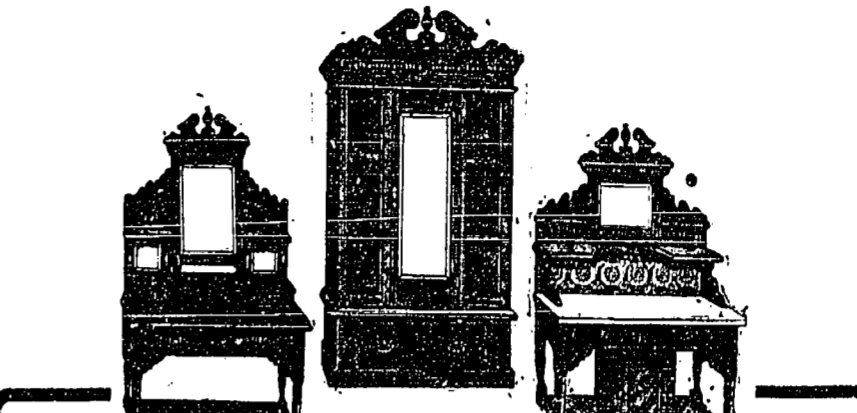
