HIGH STREET IMPROVEMENT WORKS.
A HITCH OCCURS.
NORTH WARD DRAINAGE TO BE
GONE ON WITH.
Regarding the above works the following recommendation was made by the public works committee at its last meeting of the Northcote Council, viz:—"Taking up and re-laying channels, etc., High Street, and storm-water channel, north ward. That the tenders received being in excess of the amount provided, such tenders be accepted, and the city surveyor be instructed to carry out the works by day labor."
Mr. Mason (chairman of the committee) in moving the adoption of the clause, said it was now proposed to knock out the £1200 for underground drains through the park and take away the storm-water by way of Clarke, Steane and Union streets.
Mr. Henderson seconded the motion—considering it was a matter of expediency that Lake's tender of £1227 for the works in High Street be accepted. As they had only a limited amount to spend they should know their exact liability. With day labor they wouldn't know.
Mr. Johnson seconded the amendment, considering it was a matter of expediency if a contractor carried out the work.
Mr. Lees said he thought the new proposal of getting rid of the storm-water drainage needed consideration. At the same time he thought the work would be best left to day labor.
Mr. McDonald supported the day labor plan more particularly as the money was borrowed with the special idea of giving work to the local unemployed.
Mr. Henderson said the engineer had assured them he could carry out the work by day labor for the money provided.
Mr. Redmond said that under the special circumstances he would support the work being carried out by day labor.
The mayor said it was an extremely dangerous policy to put as it were a fence round the municipality and say only local men could apply for the work. Other municipalities could do the same. The engineer, while saying he believed the work could be done by day labor for the amount provided, did not recommend that course.
Mr. Mason said there was no intention to limit the work to local men. The engineer was to be given a free hand to let the work be done by any one offering to do it, but not different to letting the work be done by day labor. Mr. Hayes supported the amendment, which was lost.
Mr. Dennis considered it unwise to divert the storm-water in the manner suggested and with a view to further consideration moved that the whole matter be referred to the committee of the whole.
The motion passed for want of a second. The committee will now apply for so being barred through having spoken previously.
Mr. Hunt suggested that they go on with the central portion and re-consider the southern portion.
Mr. Mason, in replying, said it was a reflection on their engineer to refer the matter back. It was not good in saying that he had not considered the drainage problems.
The scheme was knocked out on a point raised by Mr. Lees that the scheme was a new one and was therefore not proper before the council.
It was decided, however, on the motion of Mr. Mason and Redmond—to instruct the surveyor to carry out by day labor the drainage work in the north ward to the amount of £200.
Mr. Backings moved that the High Street and other works be referred to the committee of the whole.
