CORRESPONDENCE.

From Metropolitan Board of Works, stating they are not prepared to make a further extension of the water in Shaftesbury parade.—Received.

From Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board, intimating that Northcote's quota for the quarter towards the Board's expenses would be £227 19s 1d.—Referred to finance committee.

From Preston council, asking for necessary letter from this council stating that they had no objection to their high tension main along St. George's road.—Request to be complied with—on the motion of Cr. Cain and the mayor.

From same, notifying that the deputations to the chairman of the Finance Committee on the question of transfer from Tyler street electric line to High street cable line would be held on Tuesday, 6th inst.—The mayor and Crs. Slater and Sutch were appointed to attend.

From C. H. Davis, Government auditor, stating that he had examined the accounts up to 31st May and found everything in order. He approved of the system of ordering and paying for goods by the town clerk and surveyor, which rendered it scarcely possible for dummy invoices to be passed for payment.

The town clerk's method of dealing with permit deposits also guards this department from fraud.

SHADOWS ON THE SCREEN. THE WORLD'S GREATEST MAN. (By Old Northcote Boy).

Close on 400 years have passed since the grave closed over the "artistic remains" of Leonardo da Vinci, and it might well be said of Leonardo—"Nature made him and then broke the mould." It is impossible to account for the heritage of pure genius which came to this man. His father was a lawyer on a small way and lived at Vinci—a village on the outskirts of lovely Florence—"the fairest city in the world." Leonardo was born in 1452. What an immortal roll of great artists that 15th century contains! It has been well-named "The Golden Age." Here we have a few of its products: Holbein, Dürer, Donatello, and Ghiberti, whose bronze gates, or doors, with their thirty marvelous panels that picture "Creation of Man" down to the "Fall of Jericho." His gates occupied Ghiberti's time for 18 years, and he has been called the "Florentine Michelangelo." When Angelo saw them he summed them up in seven words: "Worthy to be the gates of heaven." The first was also the first Raphael, Michael Angelo, and with Leonardo you have a trio of "giants" such as the world has never seen. In his poem on Andrea del Sarto says: "That in heaven the four great walls of the New Jerusalem, met on each side, by the least of his disciples, for Leonardo, Angelo, and Andrea del Sarto, to cover."

Most of us have known somebody of whom it is said that he is "Jack of all trades, but master of none"—but Leonardo was Jack of all trades and master of all. He seemed to have had the gift of genius from the entrance to the world. He had learnt everything that his masters had taught him—outstripping all teaching but his own. From his boyhood he was a musician, a poet, a sculptor, a scientist, an architect, a painter, a mathematician, an engineer, a botanist, and a philosopher. He confounded the masters who taught him by his reasonings, and by the difficulty of problems he proposed. He read arithmetic, geometry, and physics for children. It has often been said upon that there is no such thing as a free lunch, and the manner and methods of his life, there was a thread of mystery. This mysteriousness declared itself in his school days by his unaccountable way of always seeming to have known before, everything which it was desired to teach him. Like David he played on the lute with exquisite skill, but Leonardo invented his own instruments, and he improvised at once both words and music. At 29 years of age he wrote to the Duke of Milan, "offering to plan, manufacture and carry into execution pretty well every kind of work in sculpture, painting, architecture, and engineering. He declared that he could do anything that can be demanded as well as anyone whosoever. He declared that in the sciences, in the arts, in metaphysics and law, and truly he has written on every branch of natural science."

In experimental philosophy and inventions he was a great mechanician, an engineer, an anatomist, a physiologist, an astronomer, a chemist, a geologist and geographer, and we have his notes also in statics, dynamics, hydrostatics, optics, and acoustics. When Leonardo came back to his native land after serving as an engineer in Milan and to the Sultan of Cairo in Egypt, he set to work to fill up the time between painting his great picture and fortifying the Castello of Milan, in planning and making canals, and in the irrigation of the lands. He was the first painter who stands good to this day, and when ever smart Americans profess to be great masters of recent discovery in their field, they find no more profitable field than that presented by Lombardy and Piedmont in Upper Italy.

In Leonardo's theories of combustion he recognized the air as the supporter of combustion nearly 200 years before that approximation to the truth was arrived at. The works of art which he produced were of an excellence unapproached by his contemporaries, and generation after him, and profited by his example; even Michael Angelo, his junior by 20 years, profited by studying Leonardo, who was the first painter who scorned the example of other ages and went to Nature herself for his models and painted Nature as he saw her. All that has been written or taught about painting is based on Leonardo's works; while in science, both theoretical and applied, his unpublished writings and the record of his inventions prove him to have anticipated at a hundred points the great masters of recent discovery in the ensuing age.

There was nothing almost that this wonderful man could not do. He was great alike in intellect, in feeling, and in physique. It is said that he could draw better with his "cunning" left hand than with his right, and was the only man that could draw a complete circle with one sweep of his hand. He was the founder of the study of the anatomy, and structured classification of plants, and anticipated many of the geometrical discoveries of Autolycus and Tartaglia. He gave years of his life to the industrious and careful study of limbs and muscles and tendons, and wrote a handbook on the subject, which revolutionized the methods of all subsequent painters; which reminds us that he was also the first painter to represent his figures round and full instead of flat. He used to say:—"We have just discovered that the earth is not flat, neither must we paint any more flat men." When he gave it out that a man's head travelled faster than his feet, he was laughed at. He also discovered the construction of the eye and optical laws of vision, and invented the camera obscura, also the first camera in still use in the great marble quarries of Carrara in Italy, and a rope-making machine said to be better than any in use to-day. He investigated the composition of explosives, the application of steam power, and perceived that boats could be made to go by steam (this 350 years before the first steam boat was built in Europe, 1812), and designed both steam cannon and cannon loaders—the breech of the latter.

While he was planning a court ball he was also busy inventing a process for printing photographs by sunlight—a process which was to be rediscovered 200 years later by Daguerre and his friends. He also made the first suspension wheel, as it is called, the light wheel with the spokes from which the hub is suspended. One of our greatest historians tells us that the series of his investigations and discoveries and anticipation of discoveries within the compass of a few pages as to strikes his mind as the most wonderful laborer at his inventions and his poems. His writings alone would make a library. The first Leonardo who appeared on the horizon no man had attempted the question of human flight from a purely scientific standpoint. There had been least six attempts before him in the field, and it is quite clear that Dante, the great Italian mathematician, and the first discoverer of the secret of aerial navigation, but he lacked the ability to appreciate its significance, and abandoned the task on meeting with his first serious reverse. Leonardo took up the problem where Dante let it drop, and after a long series of exhaustive observations and experiments he wrote the strange and wonderful work on which the whole modern science of aviation is founded, and it was not until his series of experiments were completed to the world began even to be dimly recognized. The appearance of this work in our day the other day was due directly to the genius of Leonardo da Vinci who died in 1519.

There was no personal accomplishment of which Leonardo was not a master. He excelled in dancing, in horsemanship, and especially in fencing, and he was the first to write. He was so strong that when he was in his prime he could bend a horse shoe double, and yet such delicacy went with his strength that his face is said to be one of the most winning in the world. His nature was large, sympathetic, and in his wanderings, if he came across any caged birds for sale, he bought them so that he might have the pleasure of giving them their liberty. He was nothing short of a compendium of all graces and forces. He saw everything—the fall of the leaves, the motion of the birds, the play of emotion, the duration of the echo, the veins in the leaf, and the struggle of the snail. And when to this is added his insatiable passion for perfection of finish and quintessential detail, the marvel is how he performed so much. You find this in the plastic nature of his work, and who said in later years—"Perfection is made up of trifles." Leonardo possessed what has never been imagined as existing, still less has it ever been known to actually exist in combination; that is, the artist's gift of creation, the ingenuity of the mechanical inventor, and the philosopher's passion for truth—three powers which were all combined in Leonardo. He has been four centuries in the grave, yet his influence is felt in every part of the world to-day where beauty and art are loved. Every one of us who has been taught to measure in some measure to Leonardo, for he was the first and greatest of modern artists, and he is the fountain from which all good teaching in art has flowed. At the foundation of Leonardo's nature was that profound religious faith without which, as Ruskin has never weary of reminding us, "there can be no really great art."

Though calmly confident of his real powers, he was a very humble man, and at the close of his vast achievements he professed himself deeply dissatisfied with his own work. It has been well said that Leonardo da Vinci was the only man who came near to a complete education.
