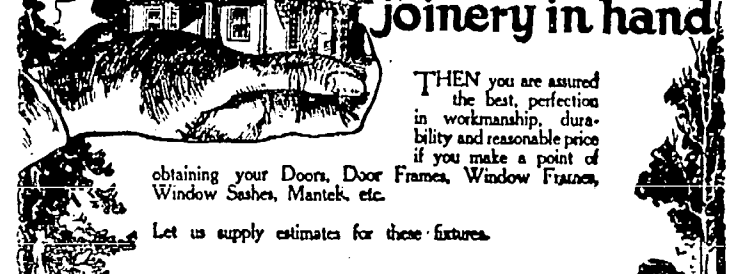

DRUNK IN CHARGE OF CAR.

ONE MONTH AND 5s.

At the Preston Police Court on Thursday before Mr. Macnamara, P.M., and Messrs. Elson and Lewis, J.P.s, James Alfred Edwards, St. David street, Northcote, was charged with no reply to the influence of drink on Epping road, near Waller's. A further charge was driving a motor car in a manner dangerous to the public was also heard.

Inspector Anwarah prosecuted. Defendant pleaded not guilty to each charge. Stanford Bluntish, tramway employee, of Northcote, said at 6.15 on April 10 he was driving a motor cycle with a side car near Waller's. Witness was on his left side of the road, travelling at about 15 miles per hour. Mr. Murray was in the side car and his son was on the back. Near the Waller's church he felt a crash on the back of his bike, causing witness to be thrown on to his head on the road, and he was rendered unconscious. He did not hear any horn blown. The only other traffic on the road were three cyclists in front. Witness had been in hospital for eight days.

Cross-examined, witness denied that he had ever been in an accident before. He had never had anyone on the back of the cycle before. The person on the back would cling hold of witness or of the side car. It was daylight. The push bikes were about 100 yards ahead. Alfred George Murray, male, said he was in Barnett's side car on April 10 at about 6.10 p.m. on the Epping road, near Albert street, when he saw something crash into the cycle, and the cycle ran into a stone wall on the side of the road. When he looked round witness's son was picking himself up off the road. Bluntish was unconcerned. He saw the car which had struck them about 100 yards ahead. Defendant and defendant and a companion were walking back. Witness said to Edwards "You're drunk" and Edwards made no reply. Edwards said he blew his horn, and later said his tyre blew out. There were two other men in the car, and both were drunk. Prior to the accident the motor cycle had passed the car about a mile back, and the occupants were drinking out of a bottle. After the accident defendant's car passed at about 30 miles per hour, and travelled about 120 yards before it stopped. Defendant could not stand straight, and witness came to the conclusion that he was under the influence of drink and fit to drive a motor car. He appeared muddled.

George Murray, son of the last witness, said he was sitting on the back of the cycle, and he first noticed defendant's car when it was about 30 yds. distant, and zig-zagging across the road and travelling at a fast pace. Shortly afterwards the car hit the motor bicycle. The car proceeded about 200 yards before stopping. Defendant and another man got out and they appeared to be drunk and were wobbling about. H. C. Dyer, chemist of High street, Thornbury, said on Good Friday, he was going to Epping and was by Murray, and gave attention to Bluntish who had been injured. Edwards admitted he was driving the car, and he appeared to be under the influence of liquor.

To Mr. Barnett: A man's nerves could be shaken by a motor accident. To the P.M.: Defendant was not so drunk that he could not stand. George William Alexander said on Good Friday he was with the last witness. Alfred Rowe, a cyclist, said Edwards appeared to be sober. From the traces the outfit appeared to be on the metal track. The car travelled about 150 yards after the accident. Frank L. Rowe said after the accident the car was travelling about 10 m.p.h. James Alfred Edwards said on April 10, he gave two men, who were drunk, a lift to Epping. Near the church at Waller's he saw a motor cycle and side car, and when near their front tyre blew out, and he had to steady the car down or it would have turned over. Witness did not know that he struck the cycle. Upon returning to his car he began to repair the tyre when George Murray came along. He denied being drunk. Edwin Norman Hale said he went to Epping with Edwards, and at Bell street invited two friends, who had "had a few," to ride with them. Just before they got to the cycle they saw a bang, and the front wheel was found to be punctured.

Thus, R. Dyer, of Daresburg Motors, said on the night of April 10, he put a new tube in the tyre of Edward's car. He was sober. Defendant was sentenced to one month's imprisonment, on the first charge, and fined 5s with 2s/18s costs on the second. A stay of proceedings for 28 days was granted.

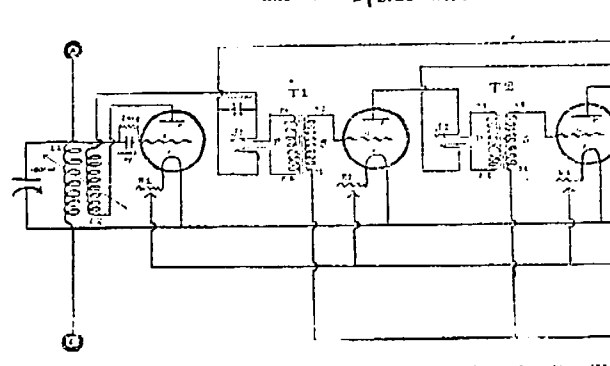

WIRELESS. By R. J. COLLINS.

A THREE VALVE RECEIVER. Most people who intend to install wireless receiving sets are confounded by the dozens of different circuits which appear in various Wireless Journals each week. The wiring diagram gives a clearer idea of the wiring used in this set than a diagram in which the components are shown pictorially. The two coils L1 and L2 are mounted on the Polar two coil holder, and the left hand or fixed coil the aerial inductance, while the right hand or moving coil is used for reaction.
