Cross Country Bus Service. WHY PEOPLE DON'T VOTE.

SEPARATION STREET ROUTE REFUSED. To the Editor. The problem amongst governing bodies at the present time is "Why people don't vote."

Cr. Timmins, as chairman of the Committee of the Council, moved that the following clause be struck out of the Northcote City Council, on 20th inst.:

Northcote Motor Service application for motor bus route from Brunswick to Ivanhoe, via Arthurton Road, Separation Street, Derby Street, Mitchell Street, and Hastings Street. That the application be refused.

Cr. McDowell said they were opposed to Separation Street being used as a bus route, as it was too narrow, but were not opposed to the use of Mitchell Street or Darwin Road.

Cr. Johnson said the cross route ought to be welcomed as it would bring traffic into High Street. No law could come up Mitchell Street or Hastings Street with a full load on account of the hill.

Cr. Turner said Darwin Road had been stated to be a bus route. Cr. Cain said Darwin Road could not be used as there was a bus service there already.

Cr. Jones said Separation Street was so narrow that it was unsafe for buses to go down it. The street was in a bad condition and on the fence could be seen mud splashes four or five feet up on the fence.

Cr. Sutch supported the amendment and said if built with a recommendation that would get over the difficulty.

Cr. Mitchell said the widening of the road was against buses running down Separation Street. In other places heavier grades than Mitchell Street had to be surmounted.

Cr. Dennis said the main complaint seemed to be the bad service in Darwin Road. The Council was recommending in refusing permission to buses to run in Separation Street, as it was too narrow.

Cr. Hayes suggested that a unanimous protest be made to the Board against all bus services in Northcote. The Council in a motion of getting Tramway buses on Darwin Road, had spent a large sum of money on that road, but the result had been given to private individuals, and the present service was most unsatisfactory.

The Mayor (Cr. Oldis) said the clause in its present form had been adopted by the committee. There was objection to the use of Hastings and Mitchell Streets. A bus was using Hastings Street at present, and Hastings Street was a bus route. He could not get up Mitchell Street. He felt inclined to foster the bringing of residents of Ivanhoe to Northcote.

The clause was adopted, the amendment being lost.

A GOOD SAMARITAN. FINED £2. Percival Castello, aged 21, of Clarence street, Northcote, was charged with disorderly on July 11th, and in the same date with resisting arrest.

Constable A. R. Feldman said on July 11, in High Street, Thornbury, he saw defendant who was very drunk, and had fallen down. All were making a noise. Witness went to arrest the man, and when near Clarence street, defendant resisted violently, and witness had to let the first man go. Defendant had had a drink.

Mr. Roe said the defendant had acted the part of a good Samaritan, doing another a good turn, and through it had fallen into trouble himself.
