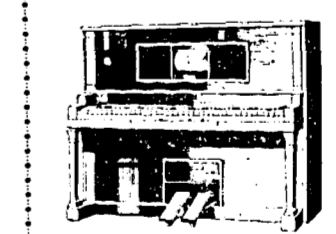

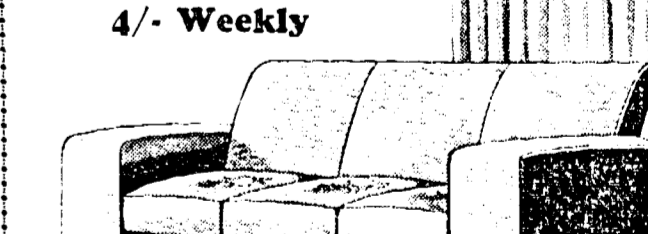

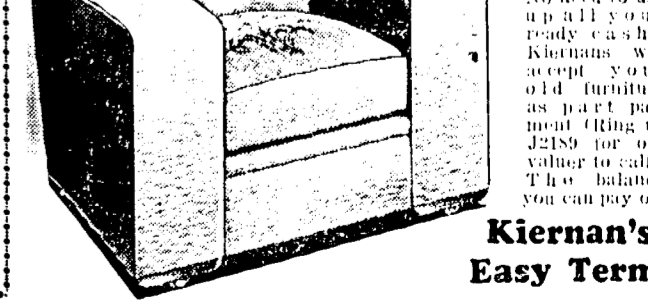

### LET THE BLIND LEAD THE BLIND

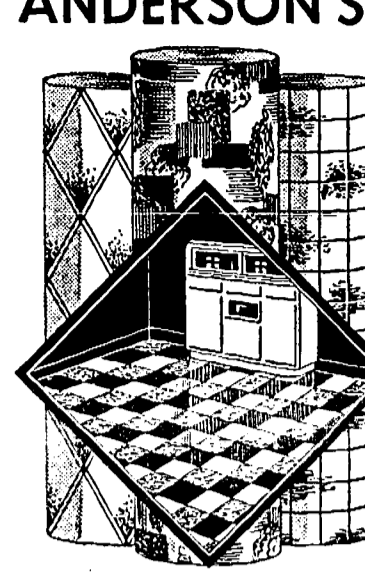
(To the Editor)
