Proposed New Bridge At Normanby Ave.

SATISFACTORY ARRANGEMENTS BEING MADE

Arrangements for the construction of the Normanby Ave. bridge are being made satisfactorily, according to the report made available at the meeting of the West Ward Council on April 21 over which the president (Mr. J. G. Goude) presided.

The Council, M.L.A., forwarded knowing this, the Board was of the opinion that it should not contribute towards the cost.

Mr. Goude further advised that the matter was being expedited, and the Department would take it up further with the parties concerned.

Mr. Cain pointed out that the matter was now the subject of negotiations between the Metropolitan Board and the Northcote City Council. The Board considered that the construction of the bridge should not be undertaken until the Metropolitan Board had been consulted for the provision of suitable material to fill the old course of the creek within 12 months.

By means of a grant this difficulty could be overcome, he was inclined to think that the necessary arrangements could be made to proceed with the construction of the bridge.

The Mayor (Mr. A. C. Bird) said that the Board had never been asked to contribute to the cost of the bridge. Out of the £23,000 which approach Mr. Jessop in connection with the bridge would cost, Northcote with a drain through the creek would contribute £4,000. The other adjoining council had contributed £1,000 each. The balance would be found by the Government.

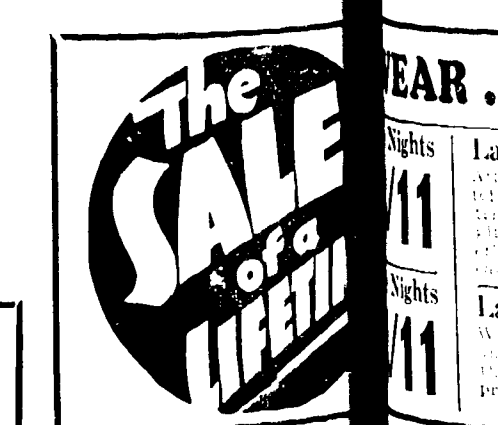

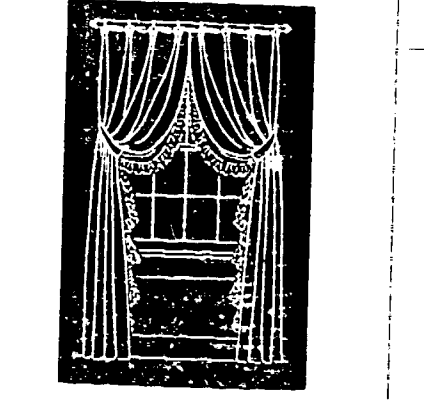

KNITTING INSTRUCTIONS

The following general instructions are included in the directions:—

Socks should be without seams or knots in heel or sole.

Never knot the wool. Join either by beginning to knit with the fresh ball a few inches before the end of the old ball, or with a darning needle, run an end of the new ball into the end thread of the old one, thus making a "splice."

To avoid disappointment, use the correct gully wool and the right size needles. If you use the coarser ones, choose the finer needles; if tightly.

When completed, press the socks with a damp cloth, but do not press or damp ribbing.

SOCK WITH FRENCH HEEL

Use 4 ply wool, No. 11 needles, 72 stitches. 4in cut off welt; length of leg to top of gusset is 12 inches, the length of foot is 11 inches. Toe is to be grafted. About 4 skeins needed for one pair of socks.

Cast on loosely to avoid a tight ring at the top.

The names of parts of a sock used in these instructions are—(1) Welt or ribbing; (2) leg; (3) instep; (4) heel flap; (5) heel gusset; (6) ankle; (7) foot; (8) toe.

Welt or Ribbing—Cast on a number of stitches chosen, 72, knit one round plain, then 2 plain 2 puri for four and a half inches.

Leg—Now plain till you have 11 inches with No. 12 needle, 12 and 13 inches with Nos. 11 and 10, as the larger needles allow a longer leg to be knitted out of the quantity of wool given.

Heel Flap—Now, put half the stitches on one needle, and equally divide the remainder (required for instep) on the second and third needles, which are left until heel is finished. On the single needle knit alternate rows of plain and puri till a good square is formed, measuring 2 1/2 to 3 inches along the sides, and having 26 to 28 rows in it according to your needles and style of knitting. The first stitch in each row always is slipped.

Heel Gusset—With inside of heel towards you, puri to centre of heel and 2 stitches beyond; then puri 2 together, puri 1 and turn over to plain side. Slip 1, knit to centre and 2 beyond. Knit 2 together (by slipping 1, knitting 1 and pulling slipped stitch over) and knit 1. Now turn and proceed as from before, always taking in at 1 stitch further away from the centre, till all the stitches are used up.

MEASUREMENTS

When finished under heel to top of welt equals 14 inches, 15 inches, 16 inches, from back of heel to tip of toe equals 10 1/2 inches or 11 inches.

Keen interest is being displayed in the competition and inquiries for wool at various stores which have co-operated in this effort prove that knitting needles are merrily clicking in large numbers. Don't hesitate, you knitters, to make use of the men folk, who can, with firm handling, become quite adept at winding wool.

News from abroad indicates that we must dismiss all thoughts of either a speedy victory or a patched-up peace. The struggle is just commencing in real earnest and shortly every available ounce of civilian assistance will be wanted.

A competition of this nature will ensure stocks of two very necessary garments being readily available when required. Much credit must go to the executive officers of our local Red Cross Branch for the efficient methods they pursue in furthering the interests of their Society. Great credit is due also to that little band of women who, Friday after Friday, meet at the Northcote Town Hall and spend an afternoon in useful and necessary tasks for the Branch.

This Knitting Competition represents practically the first effort in which active help has been asked of citizens as a whole. BALACLAVA COMPETITION

1ST £3 — 2ND £1
3RD: CUP

KNITTING INSTRUCTIONS

"Zinnia," "Totem," "Azalea," "Widowmaker" or any 4 ply yarn of similar thickness is suitable for the Balaclava Helmet.

One pair No. 6 knitting needles. One set of four No. 6 needles with points at both ends. Work at a tension to produce 5 stitches to the inch.

Using the No. 6 needles, cast on 24 stitches.

1st Row—K.4, slip 1, K.1, p.20, turn.

2nd Row—K.23, slip 1, K.1, p.20, turn.

Repeat the 2nd row until all the stitches are worked on to one needle (24 stitches). Break off the wool.

Commencing again on the 18 stitches which were left, work across in rib, knit up 15 stitches, and, taking a second needle, knit up 24 stitches along the edge of the plain, knit 2 rows, work across the 24 stitches at the top of the face in rib of (K.2, P.2); with a third needle, knit up 29 stitches along the edge of the plain knitted rows.

Work 11 rounds in rib of (K.2, P.2). Cut off.

TO MAKE UP THE HELMET—Wash in slightly damp cloth and warm iron, press lightly.

KNITTING INSTRUCTIONS

THE following general instructions are included in the directions:—

Socks should be without seams or knots in heel or sole.

Never knot the wool. Join either by beginning to knit with the fresh ball a few inches before the end of the old ball, or with a darning needle, run an end of the new ball into the end thread of the old one, thus making a "splice."

To avoid disappointment, use the correct ply wool and the right size needles. If you knit loosely, choose the finer needles; if tightly the coarser ones.

When completed, press the socks with a damp cloth, but do not press or damp ribbing.

SOCK WITH FRENCH HEEL

Use 4 ply wool, No. 11 needles, 7 1/2 stitches, 4in cut or welt; length of leg to top of gusset is 12 inches, length of foot is 11 inches. Toe is to be grafted. About 4 skeins needed for one pair of socks.

Cast on loosely to avoid a tight ring at the top.

The names of parts of a sock used in these instructions are—(1) Welt or ribbing; (2) leg; (3) instep; (4) heel flap; (5) heel gusset; (6) ankle; (7) foot; (8) toe.

Welt or Ribbing—Cast on a number of stitches chosen, 72 knit one round plain, then 2 plain 2 purl for four and a half inches.

Leg—Now plain till you have 11 inches with No. 12 needle, 12 and 13 inches with Nos. 11 and 10, as the larger needles allow a longer leg to be knitted out of the quantity of wool given.

Heel Flap—Now, put half the stitches on one needle, and equally divide the remainder (required for instep) on the second and third needles, which are left until heel is finished. On the single needle knit alternate rows of plain and purl till the heel square is formed, around the heel. Slip 1, knit on to centre and 2nd round. Knit 2 together (by slipping 1, knitting 1 and pulling slipped stitch over) and knit 1. Now turn and proceed as from * always taking in at 1 stitch further away from the centre, till all the stitches are used up.

Heel Gusset—With inside of heel towards you, * purl to centre of heel and 2 stitches beyond, then purl 2 together, purl 1 and turn over to plain side. Slip 1, knit on to centre and 2nd round. Knit 2 together (by slipping 1, knitting 1 and pulling slipped stitch over) and knit 1. Now turn and proceed as from * always taking in at 1 stitch further away from the centre, till all the stitches are used up.

Toe—Begin on needle 1. Knit 2, slip 1, pull slipped stitch over; knit to 4 from end, knit 2 together, knit 2. Needle III, knit 2, slip 1, knit 1, pull over slipped stitch, knit to end of needle. Needle I, knit to 4 from end, knit 2 together, knit 2. Knit 3 plain rounds, decrease as before; knit another 3 plain rounds, decrease as before; knit 2 plain rounds, decrease; another 2 plain rounds, decrease; a third 2 plain rounds, decrease. Now only 1 plain row left between each decrease till there are 29 or 28 left. Transfer stitches from Needle III to I, so an equal number on front and back needles. Break off your wool, leaving 9 inches, and thread it into a darning needle. * Begin with stitches next you, and use the darning needle to knit and take off the first stitch, pulling wool well through. Put darning through 2nd stitch as if purling, draw wool closely through, but leave stitch on. Now, pass wool under (not over) knitting needle) to back needle and purl the first stitch and take it off. Knit the 2nd stitch (with the darning), but leave it on the needle. Repeat from * till the toe is grafted together. Draw wool closely up and secure by neatly running it down the side of the toe.

MEASUREMENTS

When finished from under heel to top of welt equals 14 inches, 15 inches, 16 inches. From back of heel to tip of toe equals 10 1/2 inches or 11 inches.

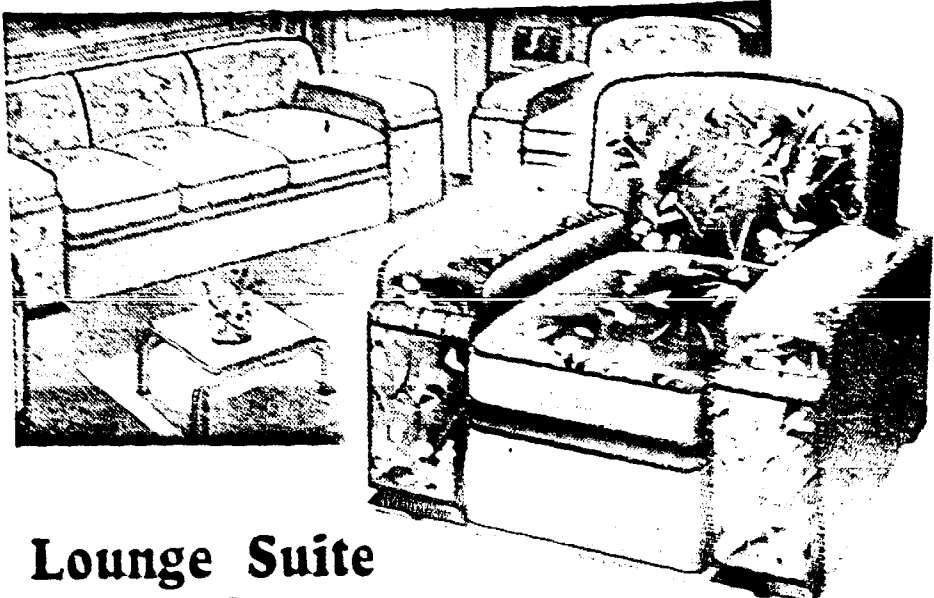

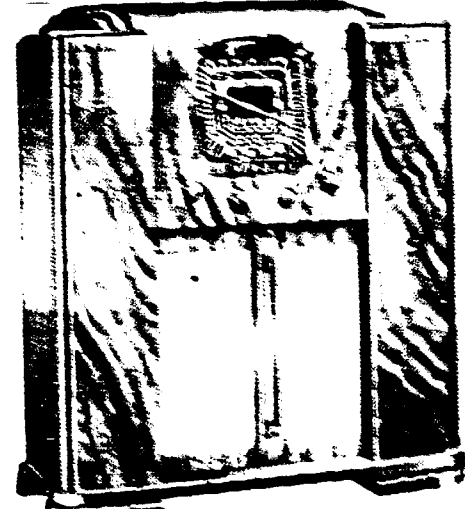

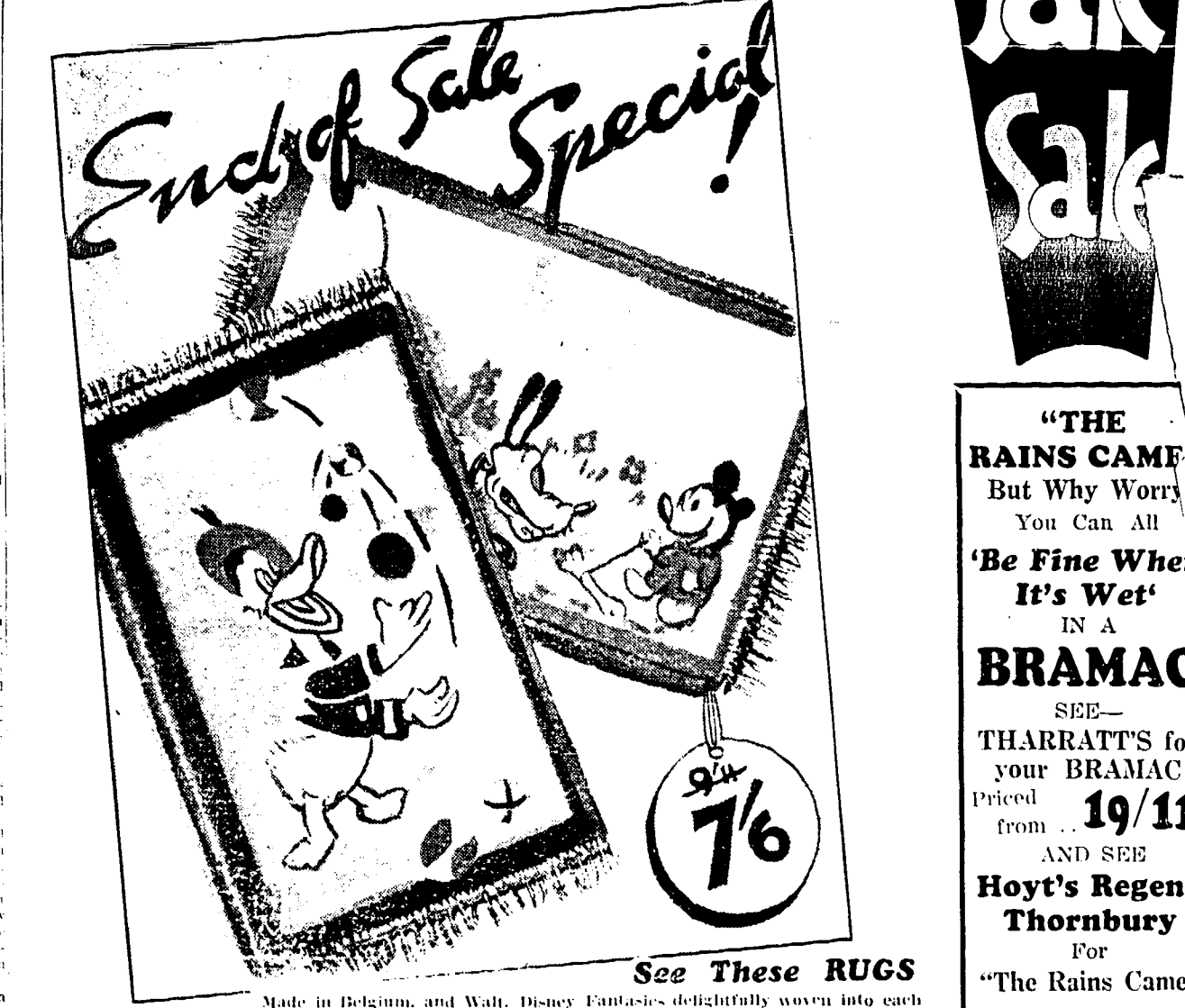

The proposals of Mr. Kiernan for overcoming deadlocks by a joint sitting of both Houses, to quote the "Age"—"provide that, if the two Houses have returned from an election, finally, if the quarrel persists, will be reached at a joint sitting. A moderate rational measure of reform has removed from the Constitution features which were most repugnant to a democratic community. The supremacy of the people is no longer a debatable matter, but a reality."—"Age" leading article. He secured a Select Committee to investigate allegations in the "Truth" and the "Guardian" newspapers that money had been subscribed to obstruct the passage of the Milk Board Bill and implied that Members of Parliament were guilty of bribery and corruption.
- 4—He moved, by Special Resolution, the thanks of Penal Officers' Union for his services in Parliament of their endeavours to secure improved conditions for their members. At that time both wages and conditions under which Warders were employed were very bad.
- 5—He sought for dental and medical inspection for all children from infancy to post-teething age.

- 10—Besides tens of thousands of pounds received in cash subscriptions, the State Relief Committee has received very valuable donations of goods of every description, and have tons of which have been received. Up to September, 1939, the Committee has raised £100,000 all of which has been donated to the relief of the unemployed and persons in distressed circumstances of charity throughout Victoria was entirely due to Mr. Kiernan.
- 11—He secured an amendment of the Health Act inhibiting "Habituees" Saloons within its scope, and thus secured regulations now in operation for cleanliness and prevention of infection.

BALACLAVA COMPETITION

1ST £3 — 2ND £1
3RD: CUP

KNITTING INSTRUCTIONS

"Zinnia," "Totem," "Bytrade," "Wildflower" or any 4 ply yarn of similar thickness is suitable for the Balaclava Helmet.

One pair No. 6 knitting needles. One set of four No. 6 needles with points at both ends.

Work at a tension to produce 5 stitches to the inch.

Using the No. 6 needles, cast on 21 stitches.

1st Row—K1, increase once in the next stitch, knit plain to the last 3 stitches, increase once in the next stitch, K2.

2nd Row—Knit plain.

Repeat the 1st and 2nd rows until there are 44 stitches on the needle.

Work 5 inches in plain knitting.

Leave these stitches on a spare needle, and work another piece in the same manner.

Place the two pieces together, and, using a needle with points at both ends, K2; taking a second needle, K2; taking a third needle, K2.

Work 11 rounds in rib of (K2, P2) for 4 inches.

Proceed as follows:—

K13, slip the 18 stitches on to a thread, leaving these stitches for the face opening.

Work backwards and forwards in plain knitting on the remaining stitches for 58 rows.

Proceed as follows:—

K13, slip the 18 stitches on to a thread, leaving these stitches for the face opening.

Work backwards and forwards in plain knitting on the remaining stitches for 58 rows.

Proceed as follows:—

1st Row—K4, slip 1, K1, p.s.s.o., turn.

2nd Row—K2, slip 1, K1, p.s.s.o., turn.

Repeat the 2nd row until all the stitches are worked on to one needle (21 stitches). Break off the wool.

Commencing again on the 18 stitches which were left, work across in rib, knit up 15 stitches, and, taking a second needle, knit up 11 stitches along the edge of the plain, knitted rows, work across the 24 stitches at the top of the face in rib of (K2, P2); with a third needle, knit up 29 stitches along the edge of the plain knitted rows.

Work 11 rounds in rib of (K2, P2). Cast off.

TO MAKE UP THE HELMET—With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, press lightly.

KNITTING INSTRUCTIONS

The following general instructions are included in the directions:—

Socks should be without seams or knots in heel or sole.

Never knot the wool. Join either by beginning to knit with the fresh ball a few inches before the end of the old ball, or with a darning needle, run an end of the new ball into the end thread of the old one, thus making a "splice".

To avoid disappointment, use the correct size wool and the right size needles. If you are possibly, choose the finer needles; if tightly to larger ones.

When completed, press the socks with a damp cloth, but do not press or damp ribbing.

SOCK WITH FRENCH HEEL

Use 4 ply wool, No. 11 needles, 72 stitches, 4½ cut off welt, length of leg to top of gusset 12 inches, length of foot is 11 inches. Toe is to be graced. About 4 skeins needed for one pair of socks.

Cast on loosely to avoid a tight ring at the top.

The names of parts of a sock used in these instructions are—(1) Welt or ribbing; (2) leg; (3) instep; (4) heel flap; (5) heel gusset; (6) ankle; (7) foot; (8) toe.

Welt or Ribbing—Cast on a number of stitches chosen, 72, knit one round plain, then 2 plain 2 puri for four and a half inches.

Leg—Now plain till you have 11 inches with No. 12 needle, 12 and 13 inches with Nos. 11 and 10, as the larger needles allow a longer leg to be knitted out of the quantity of wool given.

Heel Flap—Now, put half the stitches on one needle, and equally divide the remainder (required for instep) on the second and third needles, which are left until heel is finished. On the single needle knit alternate rows of plain and puri till a good square is formed, measuring over two inches along the sides, and having 2½ to 3½ rows in it according to your needles and style of knitting. The first stitch in each row always is slipped.

Heel Gusset—With inside of heel towards you, * puri to centre of heel and 2 stitches beyond; then puri 2 together, puri 1 and turn over to plain side. Slip 1, knit on to centre and 2 beyond. Knit 2 together by slipping 1, having 1 and pulling slipped stitch over) and knit 1. Now turn and proceed as from * always taking in at 1 stitch further away from the centre, till all the stitches are used up

MEASUREMENTS

When finished from under heel to top of welt equals 14 inches, 15 inches, 16 inches. From back of heel to tip of toe equals 12 inches or 11 inches.

HOTEL PROPRIETRESS WINS LONG LEGAL BATTLE

In October 1931 Mrs. Mary Kelly, of the Carrer's Arms Hotel, High St., Northcote, took out a \$100000 Court order claiming £2250 from Albert Edwards, of Lower Henry St., Haddington, builder for money lent. After protracted and costly litigation—the proceedings were estimated to total from £2000 to £3000—the case came to a definite conclusion in the Full Court on May 18.

Edwards had counter-claimed £2511 for money lent and goods sold.

When the matter came before Mr. Justice Gavan Duffy in October 1937, Mrs. Kelly referred the whole of the transactions to the Chief Clerk of the Supreme Court (Mr. M. M. Phillips) for investigation.
