## THE PROBLEMS TO BE FACED IN POST WAR LEGISLATION

REFERENCES BY SPEAKERS AT A.N.A. SMOKE NIGHT

### Mistakes After Last War Must Not Be Repeated

References were made by a number of the speakers at a smoke night held by the Northcote branch of the Australian Natives' Association on September 27 to problems that would be faced in Australia at the conclusion of the war and to the need for legislation which would prevent a recurrence of such a condition of affairs as existed after the 1914-18 war.

Perhaps one of the most significant utterances was that made by the Mayor of Northcote (Mr. W. Oliver) when he said that the brotherhood of man and the Fatherhood of God would play an important part in solving the world's troubles at the conclusion of the war when men who were bombed together in the same trenches would live together with equal rights and opportunities.

There was an attendance of which was helping to frame the political careers of men who had presided over by the President of the local branch (Mr. R. A.N.A. meetings. The Board was making provision for the aftermath of the war by urging the employment of their members and returned soldiers.

**RECRUITING GROUND FOR POLITICIANS**  
The toast of Australia, the A.N.A. and the Metropolitan Committee was proposed by Mr. E. Watkins, who said that probably some of those present might understand the three phases of the toast. He congratulated the Chief President (Mr. H. G. Hughes) on his recovery from illness. Many people residing in the suburbs were envious of the position of Australia which enjoyed so much liberty and freedom. The A.N.A. had provided for the dependents of members who were at the war, and it was the greatest friendly society in Australia in his opinion, and one

that was that the resources of the country should be utilised to the fullest in the prosecution of the war. They knew quite well what happened after the 1914-18 war, and it was up to them to take steps to see that there was not a repetition of these things. They had been fighting for democratic principles for years, and Australia led the world in social legislation.

It behoved them as a component part of the Empire to meet force with force, and call upon the Government to exercise a maximum war effort. But what of the victory when it was won by Britain? Out of it a new social order must be born. If we were going to drift back into the old rut it would only be a breathing space before another war. They hoped this would be the last war. The Association was imbued with ideals, and to mould public opinion would assist in planning for post war problems. Unless something was done now, they would face an unprecedented period of depression.

**PASSING THROUGH STRENUOUS TIMES.**  
It fell to the lot of Mr. H. Swanson to propose "Parliaments" and in doing so, he said that the A.N.A. had done a good deal in connection with Australian Parliaments.

It was remarkable that at present so many men and women could be found work whereas in normal times there were many thousands walking the streets. Surely something could be done to obviate this kind of thing. The Board of Directors sent many recommendations which had been adopted by Parliament to the benefit of the country.

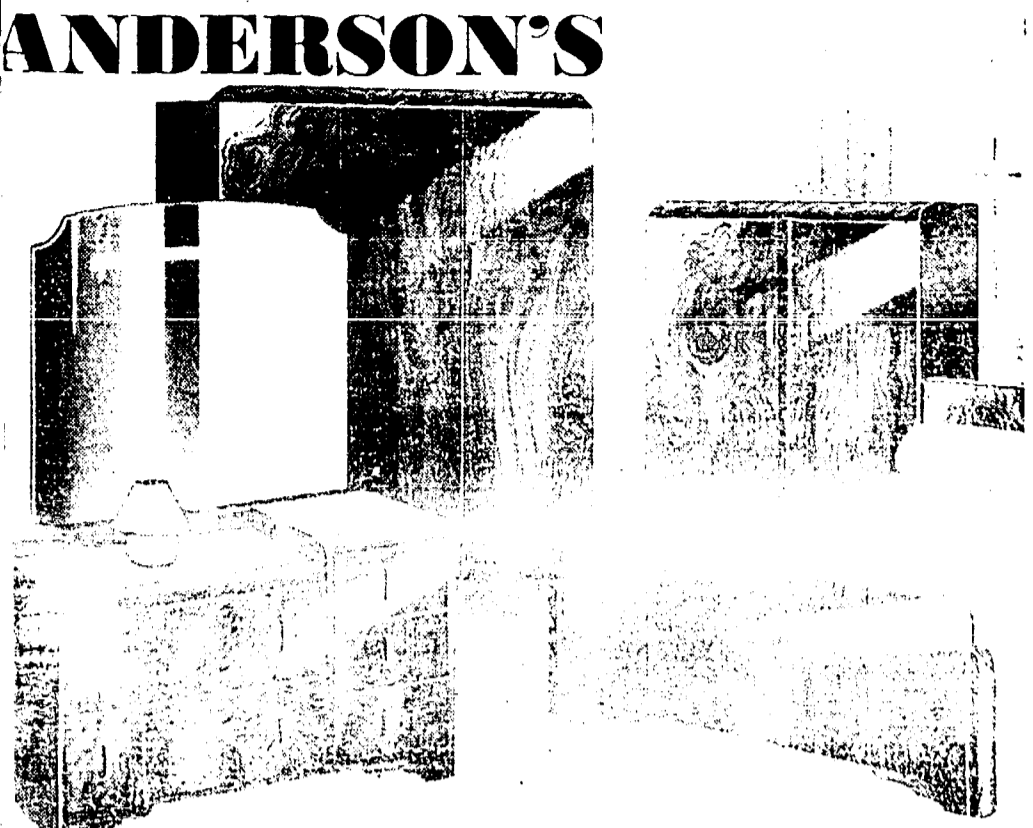
