MR. ANDREW WHYTE A CANDIDATE

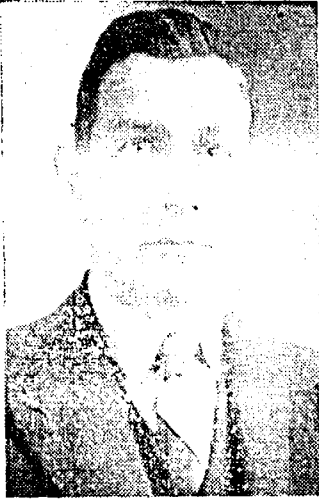

Sisters Air Their Grievances In Court

DISTURBANCE IN EAST NORTHCOTE HOUSE

A disturbance over a bicycle was primarily the cause of two married women (who are sisters), proceeding against each other on charges of unlawful assault and using insulting words. One of the husbands was also charged with assaulting his sister-in-law, the cases coming before the Northcote Court on October 29.

Mary Christine Pocock, Christmas St. East Northcote, proceeded against Maggie Ellen McMullen, of May St. Kew, on charges of unlawful assault and with using abusive words in a public place. She also charged John McMullen, husband of the previous defendant, with unlawful assault.

There were counter-charges by Mrs. McMullen of unlawful assault and using insulting words against Mrs. Pocock.

Mr. Gray (of Gray and Gray) appeared for Mrs. Pocock.

A medical practitioner said he had examined Mrs. Pocock and found she was suffering from shock. She had bruises on her neck and arms.

William Alfred Hamer, grocer's assistant, said that on October 22 he saw Mrs. McMullen pulling Mrs. Pocock's hair at the latter's house. Mrs. McMullen also called Mrs. Pocock insulting names. She also called out to her husband, John McMullen, who came from a car, leaned over the gate, and pushed Mrs. Pocock away.

Keith Joseph Pocock, 13, said his mother told him to bring a child's pram. It was given to Mrs. McMullen, who was on the porch of his parents' home. He heard someone call out "They are a lot of hats." Mrs. McMullen said something about a bicycle, and his mother went inside and brought out a letter for Mrs. McMullen to read. Mrs. McMullen then struck his mother on the arm with the pram, and grabbed her by the head, dragging her towards the gate. Mrs. McMullen next called for her husband, who came on the scene.

The boy here described some of the language used by the McMullens to his mother.

Under cross-examination witness said his mother was not doing anything to his aunt when the latter was assaulting her. His mother was not in the habit of swearing, and did not use bad language to Mrs. McMullen.

In reply to Mr. Gray, witness said that when McMullen hit his mother, witness told him to leave her alone.

The case is not heard.

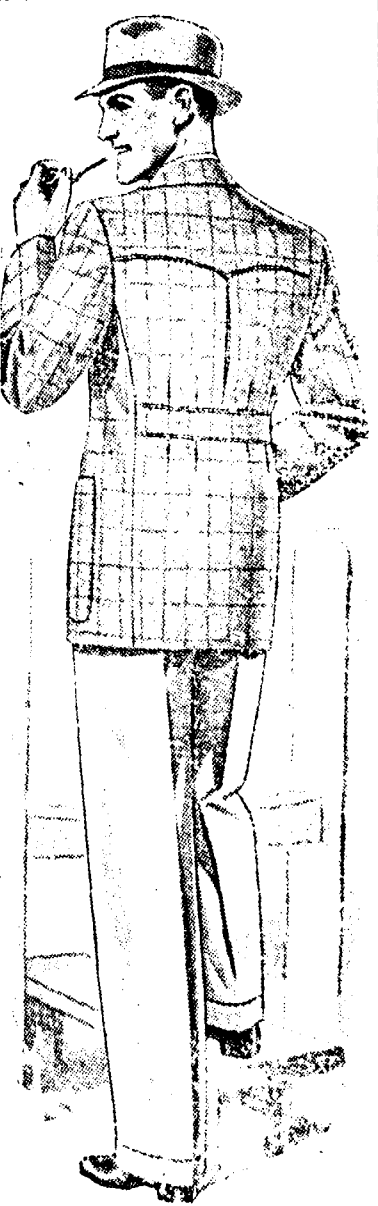

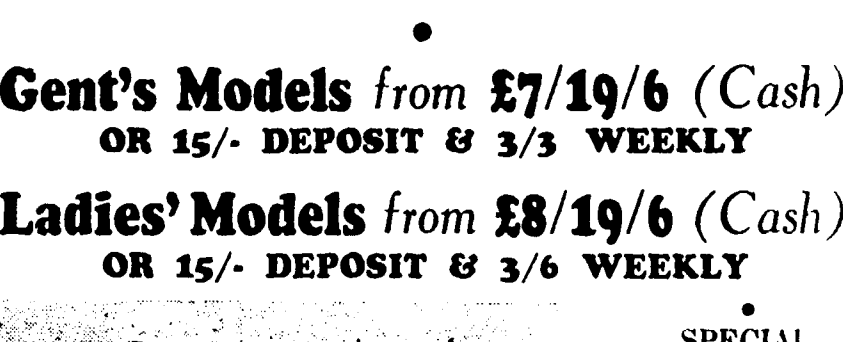
THE EVOLUTION OF THE PNEUMATIC
