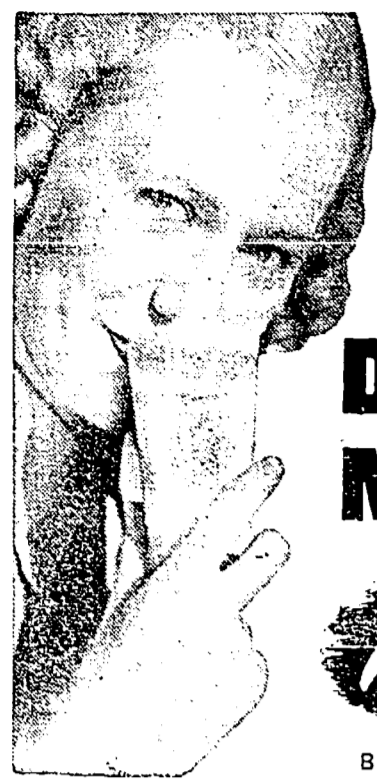

Council Highlights

The Northcote City Council held its usual meeting on Monday, February 24. Present, the Mayor (Cr. W. Oliver J.P.) and Crs. M. J. French, A. McAdam, J. W. Dennis, W. J. Findlay, G. H. Turner, A. V. Peters, A. Gray, H. Hayes, A. C. Bird, H. W. Sheehan and H. Ellis.

Reporting on the activities of the Municipal Association the Mayor (Cr. Oliver) said that some discussion had taken place on the revenue which the metropolitan councils once got and had not received for many years, and it had been decided to ask the Government for the grant once more.

The Sandringham Council had had some trouble over the conversion of single dwellings into flats without the council being notified of the alterations, and a movement is now on foot through the Municipal Association, Cr. Oliver reported, so that councils would cooperate with the Health Dept. and be notified in such cases.

Who Owns the Dog? - It often happens that when an unregistered dog is located, the person in whose charge it is, claims that the dog is away in another State, or in the country, or his address is unknown etc; and the Municipal Association is now seeking an amendment of the Dog Act by which the person in charge of the dog will be liable for its registration, Cr. Oliver reported.

A.R.P. Work. - Speaking on A.R.P. work, Cr. Oliver said that little encouragement was being given by the Federal Government to help arouse interest in this matter, some proposals had been put forward in the government's schedules but had been pushed into the background by works.

A. Edwards requested the Council to provide a through street from Abbot St Northcote to St. Albans St.

Cr. Hayes said that if the thoroughfare were not provided, a long walk to get to the bus and station when vacant land in this area was built up.

The Mayor said Northcote Council would have to cut out "Huddellburg on the matter" committee, engineer to report.

Cr. Gray said he wanted to make it quite clear that the council had had nothing to do with the stopping of this route.

Cr. Turner said the West Ward people understood quite clearly that the Northcote Council was 100 per cent in favor of keeping the West Ward bus route open.

Cr. Gill spoke of the state of affairs in the E.W. committee. Cr. Gill said that the P.M.G.'s Department had not yet provided a public telephone at the corner of High and Westgarth Sts - It was decided to ask Mr. Brennan M.L.A. to make inquiries.

Cr. Hayes said that after a long wait a fine public telephone cabinet had been erected at the corner of St. David and Spelgish Sts. Last Saturday night vandals had wrecked the cabinet and had torn the instrument out. A large amount of damage had been done by vandals in this part of the ward. Mr. Hayes referred to council's officers to see what steps can be taken to check vandalism.

Cr. Gill said that patches of dirt were often left by the street sweeper near the corner of High and Westgarth Sts. - Referred to engineer.

Cr. Gray spoke of condition of road between Reid and St. David Sts. - P.W. committee.

**NORTHCOTE'S ONLY DAIRY FARM**

**Milk Direct from Farm to Consumer**  
**Novel Features at Daley's Dairy**

WE can introduce this article in the Ripley manner for Believe it or Not, there exists within the confines of the City of Northcote a flourishing dairy farm. It is quite safe to say that the majority of Northcote residents, if approached, would have been quite willing to wager that such a farm did not exist in Northcote. Farus conjure up visions of the wide open spaces, and such spaces are conspicuous by their absence in this our closely-habitat City.

Yet at the corner of Collins and James Streets is Daley's Dairy Farm, cows, fresh paddocks, silos and all the necessary appliances of farm life complete.

The "Index" thought this anomaly would prove of interest to its readers. We therefore detailed a reporter and a staff photographer to pay the farm a visit. We are indebted to Mr. P. Daley for the courtesy, attention and time he devoted to our representatives.

**THE FARM**

The farm and dairy was established some seven years ago by Mr. Frank Daley, and its steady growth and the consequent improvement of the property is a fitting reward, and speaks volumes for the industry of its owner, and his family who staff the farm. Practically the only outside labor engaged is the milk carters.

Mr. Daley is the daughter of a farmer and takes a keen practical interest in the working of the farm. There is a family of ten children and from the eldest, their sturdy vigor is a fitting tribute to the stimulating qualities of milk. In fact two of the boys and one of the girls have won first prizes in Northcote Baby Shows.

The herd is composed of Ayrshire and Jersey cows, and their quality is evident even to the uninitiated. As Mr. Daley puts it: "It costs just as much to feed a poor cow as a good one." Consequently he is fastidious in seeing that the high standard of his herd is maintained.

**SILOS FEATURED**

A feature that immediately strikes the eye of all passers-by is a series of silos erected at the rear of the house. These are what are known as Silokraft silos and are a new development on

Australian farms. In fact, as far as is known, there are only about 20-10 erected in Victoria. Many farmers, on the advice of the Department of Agriculture, have visited Mr. Daley's farm to inspect them. The silos are constructed of a special "S.K." reinforced ironback paper, which was expressly processed for this type of work. Being portable, the silos can be erected in any convenient position and their capital cost is, of course, only a fraction of the cost of the concrete silo. The principal behind these ensilage silos is the conservation of fodder. Legumes, cereals and grasses are fed into the silos and then to enrich and preserve them molasses is added. The resultant mash can be kept practically indefinitely and result in a rich high content protein and carotin fodder. This in turn reflects itself in the quantity and quality of the milk. Cows fed regularly on this mixture, as are Mr. Daley's herd, evidence the fact by their splendid glossy appearance and the production of rich creamy milk that by the time it reaches the customers of Daley's Dairy could truly be described as bottled health.

**SPLENDID PADDOCKS**

As with babies, so in cows. Correct feeding is a most important factor where dairy herds are concerned and two paddocks are ample tribute to Mr. Daley's belief in this fact. Sown with Sudan grass and maize they have achieved a prodigious growth

of the crops, particularly pleasing to the eye and, we would think, equally pleasing to the herd's taste. Those, with their sleek, eye-appealing coats, are kept continually sown on the rotation system, that allows for the soil to be rested in turn and thus is always in a fit state to produce luscious crops.

The actual dairy itself is contained in a clean brick and concrete structure wherein is the bottling equipment, brine-cooling system and all the necessary machines that enable the milk to be treated and bottled ready for delivery in 100% hygienic and pure conditions.

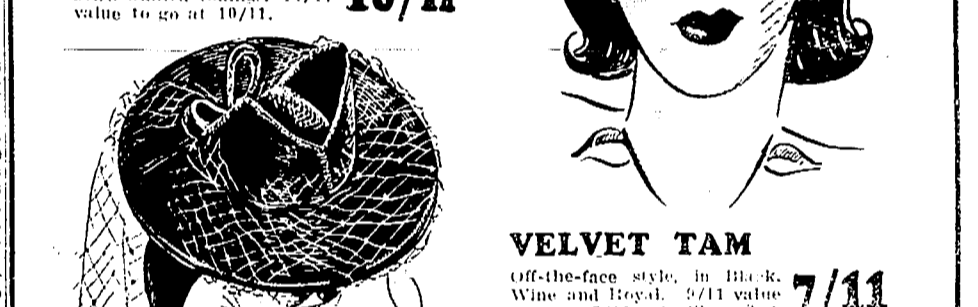
