MONEY FOR RED CROSS AND COMFORTS FUND DIRECT GIVING SCHEME ADVOCATED

"LESS EXPENSIVE SCHEME DESIRED" SAYS CR. OLVER

AT the conclusion of the finalising of the business of the recent Patriotic Carnival by the General Committee in the Town Hall on June 26, the committee discussed the question of direct giving versus Carnivals for the purpose of raising money for Red Cross and Comforts Funds. Cr. A. C. Bird, the chairman of the Carnival Committee, occupied the chair, and the Mayor (Cr. W. Olver) in extolling the virtues of direct giving in preference to other methods, painted a glowing picture of what was being done by this means in some of the other suburbs.

Against that were the opinions of some of Northcote's veteran and prominent war working campaigners that the system of direct giving under voluntary collectors would not achieve anything like the results aimed at, and had been a long way from being successful when previously put into operation in Northcote.

The Mayor said he had attended a lunch hour meeting in Melbourne when a general discussion took place as to whether a better method of raising money for patriotic purposes could not be discovered. There had been, he thought, a falling off in attractions of spinning wheels in the City, and it had been claimed that by a regular house to house contribution of 1d per person, £200,000 could be raised for the Comforts Fund, of which Northcote's quota had been set down at £85 per week. In other suburbs the matter was being taken up with enthusiasm.

Appeals through carnivals, the Mayor said, were showing signs of losing their potency, and he considered the meeting was the most expert body that could be called together to discuss the situation in a free and frank manner to devise a direct giving scheme, during which time the carnival idea could stand over.

SCHEME COULD BE TRIED
Cr. Bird said he had also attended a meeting in the city which had been held for a similar purpose. The majority of those present were ladies who were of the opinion that the scheme could be tried.

that the scheme could be tried out. The success of the venture depended upon the number of collectors who could be induced to carry out the work, and unless 200 collectors could be secured in Northcote, the effort would fall through. The real question was: "Could they get the workers?" He suggested that nothing definite be done that night, but he had thought that the Mayor would like to get the opinion of those who had worked so hard for the carnivals.

COMPARISON IN FIGURES
Mr. A. S. McNabb said that some places had turned down the direct giving scheme, and he could mention Preston, where it had been shown by the vice-chairman of the Appeals Committee, that the result from Carnivals held there would average £200 per week against the £75 per week which would be the quota attempted to be raised under the direct giving scheme.

NORTHCOTE COULD DO MORE
Mr. Cross (West Ward Progress Association) said that at his place of employment they had raised £290 for patriotic funds, and if his fellow employees could do that, then Northcote could do much better.

OPPOSITION TO SCHEME
Mr. Strickland (secretary of Thornbury Traders' Association) said that the principal opposition to the scheme seemed to be the difficulty of collecting the money. It would be almost an impossibility to get people to collect each week for 52 weeks in the year. One of the troubles would be the running around which would be necessary in voluntary collections. Appeal to Northcote Citizens

AT the request of the Commonwealth Government, a Committee has been formed in our City for the purpose of assisting to provide funds for the prosecution of the war. War Savings Certificates are now by the Committee. Members of a group may pay 6d. a week or any multiple of 6d., and for every 16 subscriptions, a certificate for the face value of 20/- will be delivered. Citizens may also start groups by combining with neighbors. The minimum number in a group is six. We aim to have a group in every street. Will you assist? Talk it over with your neighbor and arrange a group. One enthusiast in each street can do much for the Empire. Here is a wonderful opportunity to teach the benefit of 'saving' to the young people so many of whom are now receiving good wages. Parents, see to it that they join a group.

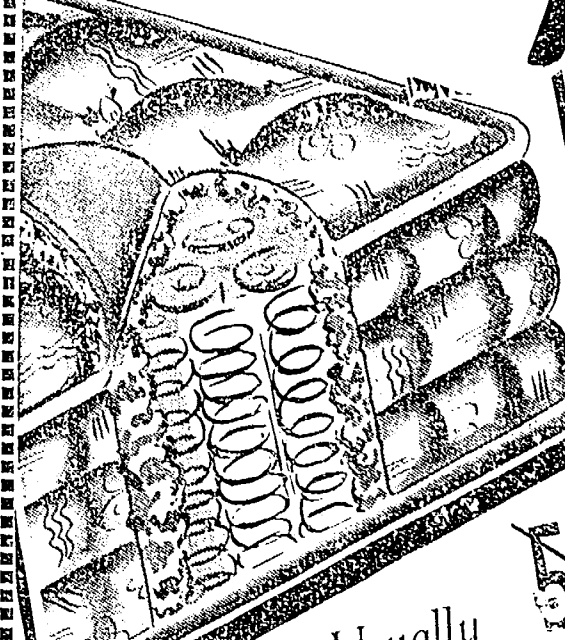

Malayan Custom.

DESCRIBED BY NORTHCOTE SOLIMIER

Mrs. E. Burwell, Rosemary St. Thornbury, has received an interesting summary of Malayan customs from her son, Cpl. Alan D. Burwell, who is amongst the first Australian troops to go to that country.

Touching the custom of the paddy fields, Cpl. Burwell stated that after they were cleared up, the festivities commencing these usually lasted seven days, but they had been a bit of a failure since the women "got the wind up." This, he considers, was apparently due to the presence of Australian troops. They were very afraid of the Australians at first but after having seen just how kindly disposed and harmless they really were, they did not "bleek off" half as fast. When they first saw the soldiers, even the most nervous would have had a job to keep up with them.

The usual three meals a day stood out there. One day meat, next vegetables, next day fish. Breakfast mainly consisted of tea and bread, or occasionally rice cakes and butter on the bread. The natives indulge in mostly hard meat but the town folk were partial to mutton. Goat's flesh was also an item very often on the menu. Malaysians were of the Mahomedan faith. Therefore in any form was definitely out. They were not allowed to eat anything in contact with pork or dead animals.

The most important papers are Pravda, organ of the Central Committee of the Communist Party (circulation over two millions daily); Izvestia, organ of the Presidium of the Supreme Soviet (circulation 1,650,000); and Red Star, organ of the Central Council of the Trades Unions (circulation about half a million). In addition to its many newspapers, the Soviet Press and propaganda machine publishes 1,830 periodicals with a combined circulation of 250 million copies.

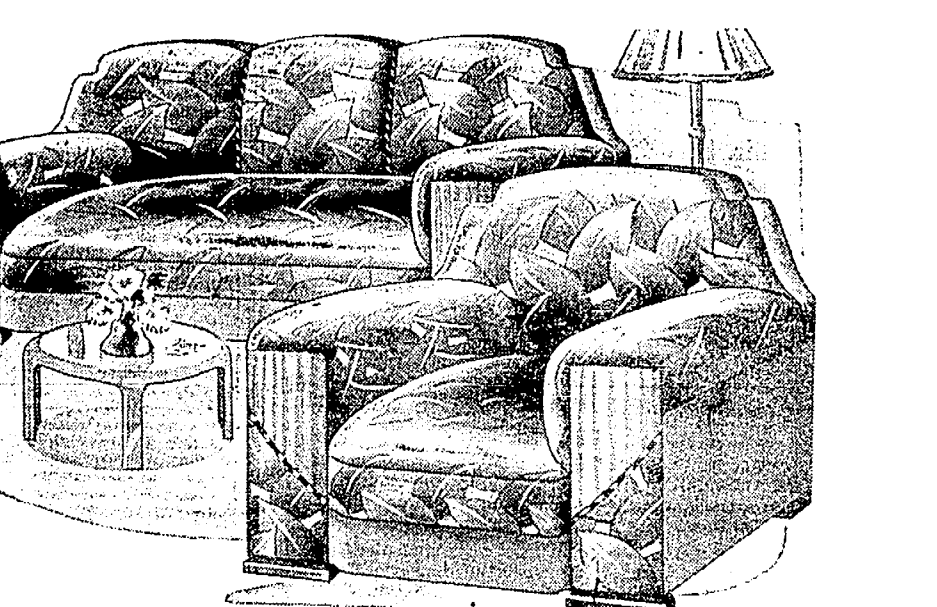

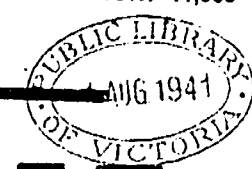
