## HOUSING COMMISSION AND OLD FITZROY RACECOURSE

### Lively Meeting Demonstrates Against Acquisition

#### NORTHCOTE MEMBER'S VIEWS NOT ACCEPTED

THE meeting called for Sunday afternoon last on the old racecourse in St. George's Road to protest against the taking over by the Housing Commission of the racecourse, after it had been purchased by a company for £27,000 and plans prepared for the erection of modern homes, became at times turbulent.

Especially were interludes lively and interjections frequent when the member for Northcote (Mr. J. Cain) was attempting to explain his views and these of the Labor Party on the housing problem.

The Mayor (Cr. W. Olver, J.P.) handled the meeting, which was attended by approximately 600 people, in an admirable manner, and assured those interested, after a resolution of protest had been carried, that no time would be lost in carrying the protest to the right quarter. According to the statement of Mr. Cain, however, there is little chance of the Premier (Mr. Dunstan) changing his mind that the Commission would take over the area.

**PROGRESS ASSOCIATION ORGANISES PROTEST**  
In opening the proceedings and introducing the Mayor of Northcote (Cr. W. Olver, J.P.), Mr. J. McMahon, President of the Northcote West Ward Progress Association (convenors of the meeting) said he was pleased to see such a large number present to voice their indignation at the attitude of the Commission. The Association had been to endeavour to place before the Housing Commission the proposals of certain people and to test that would be submitted and the work they had been doing to prevent the site from eventually becoming a slum area. In other places the Commission had built areas which did not conform to the local councils' building regulations, and had the audacity to say that they would erect homes of the dimensions of which they would fix for themselves. A huge petition was being signed opposing the proposal and with the idea of getting an alleviation of the position.

land so as to be able to participate when the racecourse was subdivided. It had always been the contention of the Housing Commission that they had to build homes against a price and at a reasonable rental, so that public money would not be lost.

**OTHER AREAS COULD BE BROUGHT CHEAPER**  
At 16 per foot, each allotment would work out at about £235. The Council could show the Commission other areas, and emphatically said it was not the right thing for the Commission to take up such a valuable piece of land for the purpose of building homes. If the Commission said money was no object, they could buy land at uneconomic prices in other places as well as at Northcote.

It was a great mistake to place a sub-economic community within another community and house people on it who would be subject to ostracism, and at one fell blow reduce the value of other homes in the vicinity.

In places where houses had been condemned, those areas could be built on again and if the Commission adopted the policy of spreading the houses over those areas and not building so many in one particular locality such a policy would be in the interests of everybody.

The area would be developed much more rapidly with a finer class of people, more in keeping with the ideals and objects of a great city if private enterprise were allowed to handle it. (Applause.)

#### RESOLUTION OF PROTEST

Cr. W. H. Turner submitted the following resolution:—

That this meeting of ratepayers and residents of Northcote enter an emphatic protest against the proposal of the Housing Commission to acquire the Fitzroy racecourse property for the purpose of erecting thereon residences in accordance with their policy. We point out that this property is situated in one of the main thoroughfares of the City, and the erection thereon of a type of residence now being built by the Commission will have the immediate effect of reducing values of all the surrounding properties. Further, it will have the effect of concentrating in a central position of our City an undesirable community of buildings on land which is of high value, which must in the rent of houses to be let to some of the poorer members of our community, whose ability to pay is greatly restricted. We suggest that in this City there is more suitable land at less than half the price, which might be utilised for this purpose."

**NO UNNECESSARY CRITICISM**  
Cr. Turner said he did not intend to unduly criticise the Housing Commission, whose objects were to do away with slums and provide decent homes for people who were in unfortunate positions. The Housing Commission was taking the conception of its duties too seriously. People coming from slum areas into ones such as the proposed racecourse settlement would be ostracised. It was not the fault of the people themselves, because they might never previously have had the opportunity of becoming civic-minded. By spreading the Commission homes out and eliminating so much concentration, it would be possible to give the people an environment which would inculcate in them a greater degree of civic pride.

The Northcote Council and the people had complained about the racecourse being used for racing purposes. The Government had to be applauded for stopping racing there. A good type of people had settled in the vicinity and they had applauded loudly when they heard that a company had purchased the land and would build a type of house in keeping with the type of those in the vicinity. They now feared very much that people living in the locality would be "fenced off" by the proposed Commission homes.

**SMALLER AREAS FAVORED**  
They had every right to criticise the actions of the Commission because instead of establishing communities, it would have been better had they purchased smaller blocks. St. George's Rd. was one of the main thoroughfares of the City and the people knew how earnest had been the Council's efforts to beautify that part of the City, in which they had one of the finest reserves in Melbourne, faced with the right type of houses.

There were thousands of acres of land in Northcote which could have been purchased by the Commission for £2 per foot. The types of houses which the Commission desired to erect were habitations which could be let at 10/ per week. If the blocks were to cost something in the vicinity of £250 each, how would it be possible to let the homes at 10/ a week?

The Housing Commission had originally offered £20,000 for the property. Another offer of £25,000 had been made by a company and the land had eventually been acquired by another company at an advance on that figure. A plan of subdivision had been drawn up, which conformed in every way with the Council's regulations, and the company had been prepared to proceed with the scheme.

The Commission had then served notice to treat on the new owners. It had been proposed to put two roads in the area which

## DOUBLE SHOOTING TRAGEDY

### VERDICT: "MURDER AND SUICIDE"

The Coroner (Mr. Tingate, P.M.) found at an inquest on Monday that Clement Matthew Nagle, 22, Mitchell St., Northcote, leather dresser, had killed his former fiancée, Lorna McLaren, better known as Lorna Watson, and then shot himself.

Mrs. Annie Watson, of Mitchell St., Northcote, said that Lorna McLaren was her foster-daughter. Lorna met Nagle in 1937 and later he came to live with them as a boarder. They were engaged about 12 months ago and Nagle was very jealous of Lorna.

Because Nagle ill-treated her, Lorna broke the engagement, and when she refused to go back to him Nagle said: "If I can't have you myself, I will do you in so that no one else will."

After breakfast next morning, she was in the kitchen with Lorna when she called out: "Oh, Mummy!" She turned to see Nagle with a gun. She heard a shot and Lorna collapsed. Another shot followed and Nagle fell to the floor.

George Watson, son of Mrs. Watson, said that Lorna was a happy girl and was never despondent. One of the reasons for her quarrels with Nagle, who was very jealous, was her objection to him bringing beer home and to his drinking generally. In June, 1940 his father took a pea-rifle away from Nagle, who denied that he had threatened Lorna. On that occasion Nagle said that he was bluffing. A few days before the tragedy, Lorna told him she believed Nagle had a gun and she was frightened of him. He looked for the gun, but could not find one.

First Constable R. H. Clark, of Northcote, said that on August 11—two days before the tragedy—Nagle was given a permit to buy a rifle for "sporting purposes."

Philip Edwin Barnes, assistant salesman employed at a city sporting goods shop, said that on August 11, a young man bought the .22 rifle (produced). The customer said he expected to be going to the country, but if this did not happen, he wanted to know if he could return the rifle and get a refund.

# EXPANDING NORTHCOTE'S A.R.P. SCHEME

## MANY MORE CITIZENS STATE SCHOOLS' WAR RELIEF EFFORT CAN HELP

If the reason advocated by the State Emergency Council for Civil Defence as to the necessity for building up a trained personnel for the Air Raid Precautions scheme some months ago were urgent, they are doubly so at present when there is a very grave danger of Australia being brought within a zone from which bombing operations can be carried out from the air. Every day the danger becomes more apparent and it is unpleasant to even hazard a guess as to what condition of chaos would develop if it came more quickly than is anticipated.

Men, women, and even boys and girls can do their part by linking up with the movement, and doing it NOW. The Boy Scout motto "Be Prepared" surely applies in this case. Training is free, equipment is supplied, and all that citizens need to do is to attend a short series of lectures and practical nights, in which they will gain interesting and valuable information which will fit them to be of great service in a national emergency and act as an insurance from their own personal point of view.

There was a period not so long ago when the Federal Government practically turned a cold shoulder to the overtures made through the course, but they are now being met with a more sympathetic attitude. The people are being urged to recognize that they have brought havoc and loss of life in Britain, and which is being experienced by Germany herself to-day.

But to-day things are different. The Federal Government has set aside a large amount of money for the benefit of the State Emergency Council of Civil Defence. It is a woman who is in charge of the elaborate precautions can be taken, so that we will not be unprepared and ignorant of after conditions if such a thing unfortunately does eventuate.

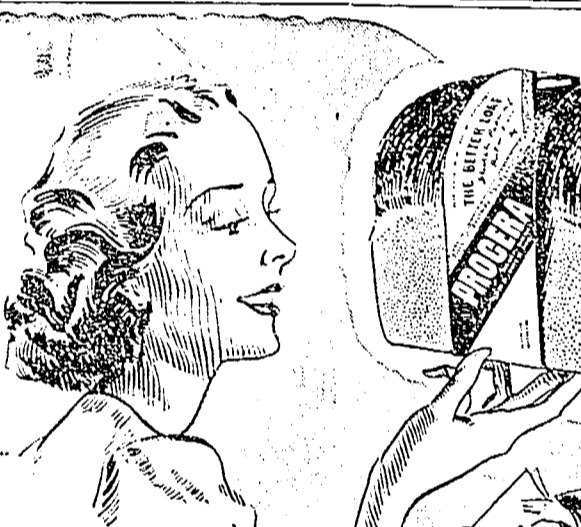

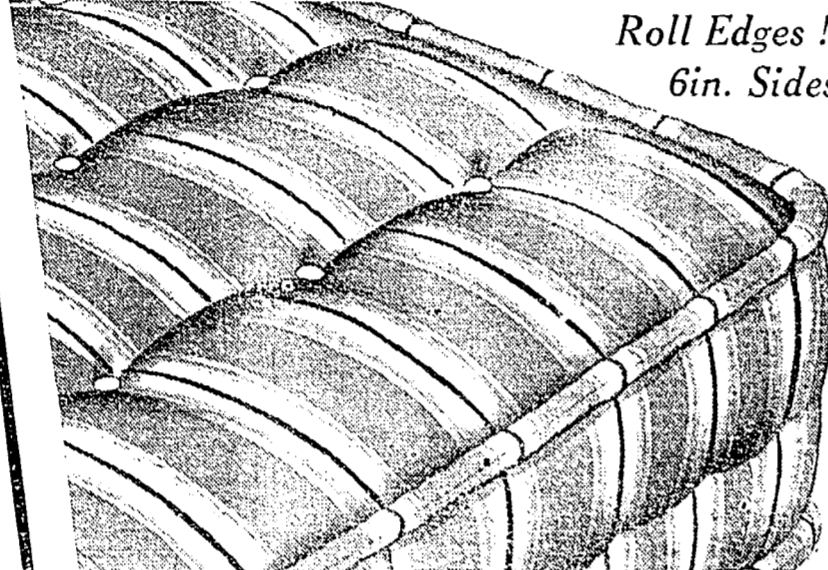
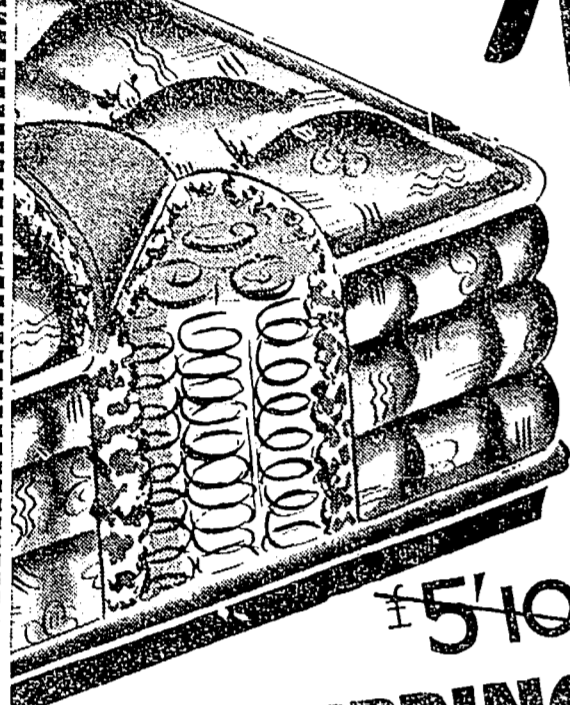

### HOME GUARD S FIELD DAY

At Wattle Glen

MEMBERS of the Preston and Northcote companies, officers and N.C.O.'s of the Home Guard to the number of 175 (105 Preston 70 Northcote) participated on August 21 in the defence of the Yan Yean Reservoir; and so well did they carry out their onerous duties that in 3 hours, working under actual service conditions with full equipment everything was safe.

Significant intelligence corps and anti-tank squads were realistically impressive in repelling the invaders from the direction of Wallan.

The journey was made to Whittlesea by train; our old soldiers paying their fares and expenses and evincing an interest in the whole proceedings that must have brought back many recollections of the 1914-18 war. The companies were accompanied by the Preston Municipal Band of 30 performers who have been attached to the Preston unit as an auxiliary and will become the regimental band on all ceremonial occasions.

On detouring the Home Guard marched through Whittlesea, headed by the band, to the show-ground. The salute was taken at the memorial arch by Major N. S. Osborne. After dinner a programme of drill exercises was gone through and plans prepared for the defence of the metropolitan water supply in the event of invasion. The manoeuvres were admirably carried out.

Boy Scouts from Northcote (with bicycles) acted as runners. They were most enthusiastic and did an excellent job.

Whilst the Band was playing at the show grounds during the afternoon a collection was taken up in aid of local patriotic funds and realised £140. After tea the troops were entertained by W. W. Greenwood ("Bluey") with monologues, and a collection taken in aid of the fund. The proceeds reached £100, making £240 in all.

Captain R. Clark, of 57A, played a big part in the day's activities and the instruction he was able to impart and the assistance he so ably rendered, were greatly appreciated.

The troops left for home at 7.30 p.m. a tired but happy band well satisfied with what they had done, as were those who had the opportunity of seeing them in action.

### Night Patrol At Tobruk

TOWARDS sunset each day in Tobruk an uneasy atmosphere of illness sets in. The outward-bound German aeroplanes would seem to be settling down for the night, but in forward zones all is haste and activity. All day the men have shot and crawled, and night is the time when our patrols move out.

For months the British have completely demoralised the Italians. Each night from a score of different points, there are men out. Some are on reconnaissance; others on straight-out fighting jobs, with one aim—to contact the enemy and hit him hard. The Germans are tougher, but they will rarely stay to fight it out when they are contacted at night.

Here is a story of a typical patrol.

Out in front, the Germans seemed to have been busy laying a minefield. An officer was sent with a sergeant and ten privates to get all possible information about the field.

At about 10 p.m. the officer led his men out of the post and through our wire. All wore sand-shoes, and were heavily armed with Tommy guns, grenades and a Bren gun.

They had covered 1000 yards when they found a row of freshly turned soil. Crawling in silence, the officer found a mine and told a sergeant to examine it while he took some others to trace the extent of the field.

On his return the officer found that the sergeant had lifted the mine and was carrying it in his arms. The party returned and the mine was handed to the engineers for examination.

The uncanny skill of the Italians on patrol has won the admiration of all Tobruk. A tale is told of a lone Australian occupying a listening post. A hand slid round his neck and felt his collar. He was almost very good, as the shadowy figure slipped away, leaving a badly-shaken Australian.

### Canada At War

CANADA'S eleven and a half million people, whether they speak French or English, are throwing all their efforts into war for a second time to help the Empire.

At the outbreak of the war the Canadian navy was composed of only 13 ships and 5000 personnel; to-day, she has 250 ships and 60,000 men, and in six months, 400 vessels will fly the ensign of the Royal Canadian Navy.

During the last war Canada raised and maintained an army of five divisions. Already in the present struggle she has topped that figure. There are 100,000 Canadians manning strategic points in Britain—men from the First, Second and Third Canadian Divisions, a Fifth (Armoured) Division is due in Britain shortly, and a Sixth Division is now being raised in Canada.

The personnel of the Royal Canadian Air Force has risen 1200 per cent since war was declared. Canada's share in the Empire Air Training Scheme, designed to turn out 60,000 airmen a year, is 80 per cent of the personnel and 65 per cent of the total cost, and the scheme is rapidly achieving its object.

In munitions production, Canada will, during the present year, produce more explosives than in the whole of the British war. More than 100,000 Canadian-built trucks and lorries have been produced for duty, mainly in the Middle East. The cruiser tank, 100 per cent Canadian in materials and design, has been brought into production more quickly than any tank of its size turned out by Great Britain.

Starting from nothing Canadian factories have now constructed 1500 aircraft, and they are building airplanes for all types from the infant Catalina to the training planes at the rate of 40 a week.

Canada's shipyards employed only 1500 men when hostilities commenced; to-day more than 20,000 men are working, laying the keels of every type of vessel from destroyers downwards. The programme embarked on last year will produce 1,000,000 tons of cargo vessels in 1942.

In the financial year ending March, 1941, Canada's exports to Great Britain had risen by 45 per cent over the previous year, and those for the current year will be even greater. Canadians are contributing in the use of cheese and bacon so that British orders can be filled.

The Dominion is spending half her national income, Tariff concessions on British imports and financial adjustments to facilitate British and American purchases as part of the heavy drain on Canada's resources. Canada has already made available 50,000,000 dollars to finance British American purchases, and, by March, 1942, this figure will have been doubled.

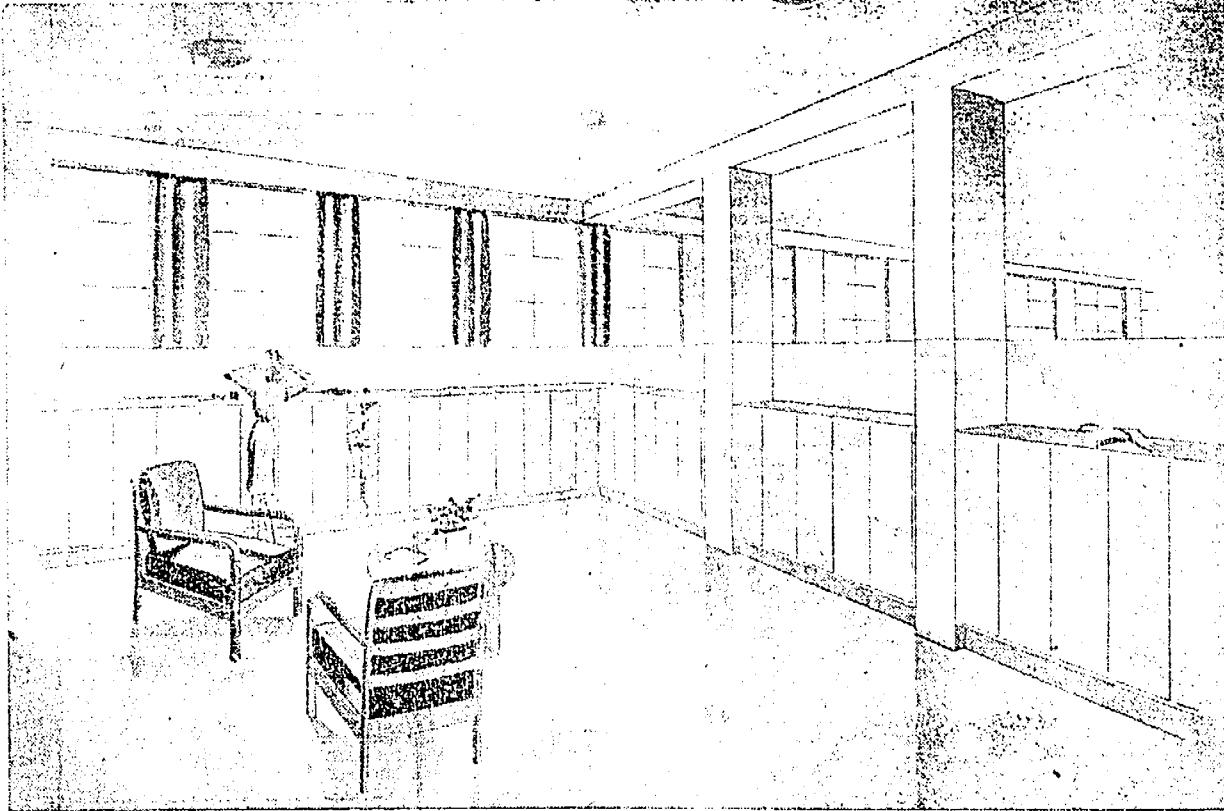

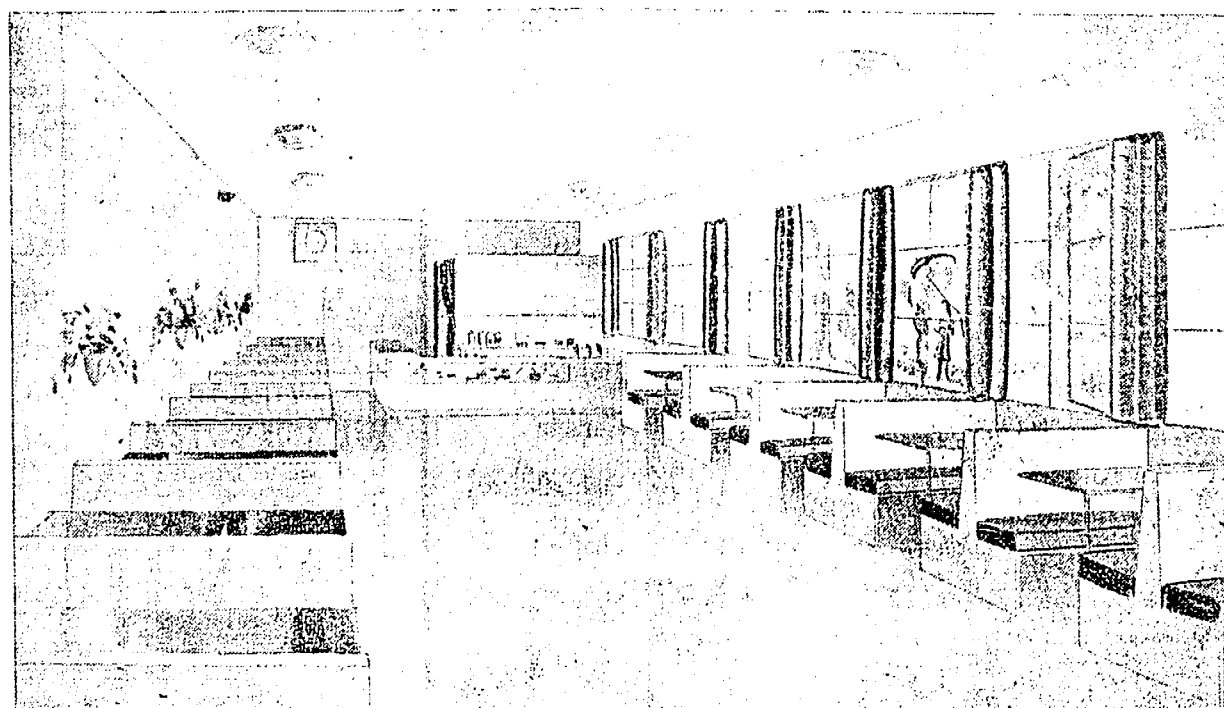
