STORY OF BASE INGRATITUDE POST WAR PROBLEMS

WIDOW'S HOSPITALITY ABUSED BY SOLDIERS

Robbed By Her Guests

The base ingratitude shown to a Northcote woman who had taken two soldiers into her home was revealed in the Northcote Court on September 26. Arburton Archib Robertson, Henry St. Richmond, who described himself as a tinsmith and blacksmith, was charged with having stolen between May 9 and 30, a sovereign, sovereign case and gold mounted cigarette holder valued at £1/1/ of the property of Florence Veal.

According to Mrs. Veal, a widow, of Hastings St Northcote, she received on May 9 a telephone message from Anzac House and as a consequence she agreed to accommodate two soldiers for the week-end. One of these was accused. They stayed for about three weeks, but when accused arrived he said he thought he would be staying for three or four days. On the Saturday night she took them to the pictures because they said they had no money. After they had left she received a communication from the police, and on making a search discovered that a sovereign, a sovereign case and a cigarette holder were missing. On September 23 in Swanston St she saw accused standing outside a hotel. She pointed him out to a policeman and then rang Russell St. She was quite definite accused was the man who was at her house.

Detective Manley said that on September 23 with Mrs. Veal he saw accused outside an hotel. Mrs. Veal said "This is the man who stayed with me in May. I would know him anywhere." Accused said that was right. Later accused said he had been discharged from the Army as medically unfit. Raising Money For Patriotic Purposes

SCHEME RECOMMENDED TO MAYOR OF NORTHCOTE

When proposing the toast of the Northcote City Council at the annual smoke social of the Northcote Branch of the A.N.A. on September 25, Mr. R. Swanson said the Mayor of Northcote (Cr. A. V. Peters) could be depended on as one who fought in the 1914-18 war, to give the men of the fighting forces all sympathy and help possible. Only men who had been through the mill knew how to oil the wheels. It was costing the A.N.A. £7,000 per year to keep their members of the fighting forces good on the books.

In connection with the launching of patriotic appeals, he had given the matter a little thought. The "Leader-Budget" was delivered to 11,000 homes in Northcote which were connected with electric light, and if each house had its charges added to by 1/ per month, it would bring in £500 per month or £6,000 a year for patriotic funds. If the Mayor brought the matter to the right quarter, he felt he would have a large number of the citizens of Northcote behind him.

The Mayor, in responding to the toast, said it was true that he had served in the last war, as Mr. Swanson well knew, and it was but natural that his thoughts should go out to the men who were going through hell and were sick and maimed as a result of their experiences. He had launched an appeal for a Christmas gift for every Northcote fighting man serving abroad. He hoped the citizens would rally around him and give all the support they could in the matter. The Northcote City Council had discussed the matter of placing an additional 1/ on electric light consumers for patriotic purposes, but there had been a legal difficulty. However, he would again bring the matter under the notice of his colleagues.

Junior Rechabite Demonstration

A VERY successful Junior Rechabite demonstration was held in the Northcote Town Hall on September 24 by the eight Junior Tents under the control of the Pride of Northcote (Ladies) and the Star of Northcote (Men's) Tents. The whole of the programme was provided by junior members. The first part of the evening was taken up by a model Tent meeting with the various offices filled by members of the Junior Tents and a complete business meeting with initiation service was gone through in order to prove to parents and friends just how the Juniors can conduct a meeting. A musical programme of songs and elocution was given by the Juniors in Sisters Sylvia, June, Edna and Betty Hyde, Daphne and Dorothy Simmonds, Dulcie Griffin, Eleanor Easton, Polly Durran, Margaret and Viola Findlay and Bro. McMahon.

The final item was the building of "The Order's Emblem" by boys and girls from all the junior tents in Northcote. This was a very fine item indeed, the final tableau bringing generous applause. Great credit is due to the girls and boys who took part and to the superintendents who carried out the training.

During the evening short addresses were given by Bro. W. E. Findlay, District Director, and E. Webb, District Junior Superintendent.

The demonstration was organised by Bro. A. Fillingham, District Deputy Ruler and the Superintendents of the Junior Tents.

CROSS OF REMEMBRANCE FOR POPPY DAY APPEAL
Something decidedly novel is to be introduced by the Preston Sub-branch R.S.L. in connection with the Poppy Day Appeal on November 10 and 11. A Cross of Remembrance will be placed on the lawn in front of the Preston Town Hall, and everybody purchasing a poppy will be asked to place it on the cross. Quite apart from the sentiment underlying the innovation, it is an excellent chance of assisting the R.S.L. and more especially the Preston Sub-branch, which is doing so much for men overseas, those who have returned home, and their dependents.

Discussed at A. N. A. Smoke Night

POST-WAR problems, including the rehabilitation of men of Australia's fighting forces the placing of the army of munition workers in employment, and improving the social standing of the people generally, came under discussion at the annual smoke night of the Northcote A.N.A. on September 26, when the President (Mr. R. Gould) presided.

RAPID EXPANSION IN NORTHCOTE

In proposing the toast of Australia and the A.N.A., Mr. A. E. Watkins said they wanted Mr. A. E. Sharples, a member of the Board of Directors, to know they were loyal to the Board in whose hands their destiny was safe. Northcote A.N.A. was given a charter in 1900, and since then had made wonderful progress. The secret of their success was due in no small measure to the interest the members took in the organization and their wonderful social committee of which they were very proud. It was pleasing to know that the A.N.A. had arranged with the B.B.C. to have a recording of the grand final League football match broadcast for the benefit of soldiers overseas.

MEMBERS MUST BE RETAINED

In his reply, Mr. Sharples said it was a pleasure to visit a branch as the representative of the Chief President, which had such a fine membership and initiative. Some years ago a member of his branch, (Lendigo) had introduced 25 members during one half-year. That man happened to be a policeman. It might be that he had agreed not to prosecute certain young men for offences which were not serious, on the understanding they would join the A.N.A. (Laughter.) Friendly societies were going through stren-

uous times and it seemed as if they might lose many young men who had answered the clarion call to duty. They must do everything possible to hold their present membership. If they could succeed in doing this during the war years, they would be doing wonderful work.

A WELL-KEPT CITY

The citizens of Northcote were proud to be residents of such a fine city, said Mr. H. Swanson, in submitting the toast of the Northcote City Council—a city in which there were good streets, and spacious gardens and parks. The mechanical devices kept the city clean and healthy, and had been made in the municipal workshops, which had reached a high state of efficiency. He would like the Mayor to take particular notice of the lighting of High St. and see if it could not be brightened.

HIGH ST. RE-CONSTRUCTION

The Mayor (Cr. A. V. Peters) replied, and in doing so, said the Council was doing a good job. He was one of those who looked ahead so that the city's progress would not be retarded. It would cost £60,000 to get High St. reconstructed. The parks were in a fine condition and it had been one of his chief tasks during his previous Mayoral term in 1936 to get park lands improved. The lighting of High St was not too good, and whilst it was a problem, he hoped it would not be long before something was done. The A.N.A. was doing a wonderful job and he hoped it very success.

PARLIAMENT'S EFFORTS APPRECIATED

He regretted Mr. F. Brennan M.H.R. was not present, said Mr. T. G. Aldridge (social secretary) proposing "Parliament." Mr. Cal. M.L.A. had been with them

on many occasions. Victory had to be secured in the present war, and if victory was not won, democracy was in imminent danger.

ACTIVITIES OF FASCISTS

Mr. Cain said that Australia had much to be thankful for in the social services they had at their disposal. There were numerous potential fascists in the British Empire including some in Australia. One of the outstanding questions which faced the Allies was that of reestablishing in civil life the men who would be materially perturbed as he result of the war.

HOSPITAL AND X-RAY WANTED

The establishment of a Friendly Societies Hospital was urged by Mr. W. Hogg in submitting the toast "Kindred Societies." Such a hospital would be invaluable, whilst an X-ray plant, controlled by the societies was another matter deserving of consideration.

THE DISPENSARY'S ACTIVITIES

Cr. W. E. Findlay (secretary Clifton Hill and Northcote U.F.S. Dispensaries and secretary of Northcote I.O.R.) said that there were many friendly societies in Northcote, and they could all top the poll in membership. There were 13,000 members affiliated with the Clifton Hill and Northcote Dispensaries, and if these 13,000 realised what could be accomplished, they would be successful in their efforts to get a hospital. The X-ray plant was possible if agitation was kept up. The general secretary of the A.N.A. (Mr. Parker) had put up a great fight for hospital benefits. He could not understand all the things the Government Actuary said down, neither could he understand why present members should not receive the accumulated interest in all societies.

The health of the chairman was proposed by the branch secretary (Mr. R. L. Fitch). An excellent musical programme greatly enlivened the proceedings.

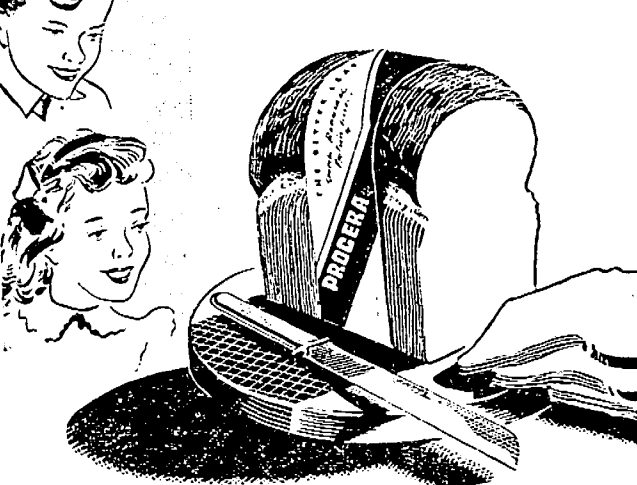

Ambitious Building Scheme Provides Modern Homes

Beaconsfield Pde. Dwellings Nearing Completion

S. J. SIMPSON Home Builder, PRAISES COUNCIL

At the present time when the action of the Housing Commission in acquiring the long disused Fitzroy Racecourse for the erection of homes under its sponsorship is arousing a great deal of interest, and, in some quarters, definite resentment, the time is propitious to view the activities of private builders.

Particular attention is called to the ambitious programme inaugurated as far back as 1928 by Mr. S. J. Simpson, builder, of 23 Veronica St., Northcote. This programme, now nearing its completion in Beaconsfield Parade, has transformed vacant land into an area of attractive, spacious and well-built homes fronting Leinster Grove and two new streets—Ayeria and Veronica Streets.

These homes conform strictly to the building by-laws of Northcote and their erection considerably enhances that quarter of the City. They represent the finest fruits of private enterprise and are being erected and purchased by workers.

The illustrations on these pages are striking proof of the foregoing, and bear eloquent testimony as to what can be achieved in the way of home-building and civic beautification when the planning is done on sound business lines—sound in these respects: that whilst they will make an adequate return on the capital invested, they will at the same time afford the worker an opportunity to buy his own home on reasonable and easy purchase terms.

In respect to home-building in general and its attendant problems, it is only natural after a lifetime's experience, that Mr. Simpson should have certain definite opinions and theories. We have asked him to express these and append them hereunder.

HOME-BUILDING—ITS INFLUENCE ON DEMOCRACY

A great majority of the residents of Northcote are either the owners or are in course of buying, the homes they live in. Through the years, including the dreaded depression era, many had to struggle hard to hold on to what they had bought and were still buying.

The ownership of their homes brought with it a deeper sense of civic pride and many responsibilities. A slight on this aspect is reflected in the time, labor and money that is spent on their gardens. These not only improve the homes, but beautify the streets in which the homes are built.

Naturally, and in their own interests, these citizens take great interest in Local Government. Men, well-educated, represent them as councillors. These fit men have appointed competent and highly trained executive officers to manage the affairs of the Council.

Northcote is indeed fortunate in having in its service men such as the Town Clerk (Mr. J. A. Thomson) and the City Engineer (Mr. V. J. Braden), C.E.D., who are our tools and streets are a monument to the engineer, whilst the building regulations are those of the Council.

Therefore, any person having home built in Northcote need have no fears as to the suitability or solidity of its construction.

Further, there are Council officers regarding the subdivision of land, this ensuring that each house will have light and air space on four sides. Admittedly, levels, plots are allowable, but only on areas of not less than 6,000 square feet. Even so, this type of building is not encouraged. In most cases pairs occur on street corners because road construction on return roads makes the land expensive, and in these cases they have the benefit of street width in light and air. It would be safe to say that there are no more than 50 brick pairs in Northcote.

OWNER-OCCUPIERS SHOULD BE ENCOURAGED

Brick pairs are, in the main, built solely for letting purposes, and are but one remove from the semi-detached structure that

conditions have for years been trying to abolish. The owner-occupiers are the proper type to encourage. They invariably exhibit great pride in their homes and thus in their City.

HOW PRIVATE ENTERPRISE ENHANCED THE RACE COURSE PROPERTY

Very many years ago a large piece of land, known today as the Fitzroy Racecourse, was purchased by certain interests and enclosed by the erection of a 10ft iron fence. Inside, just sufficient building work was carried out to enable the training races to be held on the racecourse.

In the years that followed, the property around this land was being extensively built upon. The occupiers occupying their homes suffered many inconveniences while they awaited street and road construction, the providing of Light, Gas, Water and Sewerage, etc. Furthermore they were paying their rates and also their portion of the cost of road and street construction.

In short, their initiative and shrewdness, being to a degree, advised the value of the racecourse property, which day by day became enclosed on all sides by attractive well-kept homes.

BUILDING OF WESTERN SUBURBS

At this juncture, Mr. S. J. Simpson purchased all the vacant land that was left on the western side of the racecourse. This was subdivided into 44 frontages to Leinster Ave and two new streets—Ayeria and Veronica Sts. and in less than 7 years, 60 modern homes have been erected and sold to workers who paid, in some cases, cash, and in other instances, arranged credit. Further, loans through the State Savings Bank (unfortunately the Bank stopped building loans) the outbreak of war. This step by the bank is a retrograde step, as in most cases its operations allowed purchasers to deal on what amounted to cash basis with the builder. In effect, they did not even need to read the newspapers. They came along inspected the houses, chose one and then went off to the bank to arrange for the loan.

HOME OWNERS EASILY FRAUDULENT

Estimated terms have deposit and interest on the loan, but that is all. The mortgage is a nation of

home-owners. The Government could easily attend to these items. In other States, particularly New South Wales, the activities of Government subsidised co-operatives have been markedly successful. With a proper official lead, the house shortage would soon cease to exist. Hundreds of people can put down a deposit on a house. All they need is to be able to arrange the balance of the purchase money on reasonable terms.

However, in this respect, Mr. Simpson seems to have been able to overcome the difficulty for in addition to having built these homes, he is now erecting seven

En-Tout-Cas tenements for public use. He has also in hand twenty new houses in Beaconsfield Pde and Leinster Ave similar to those built in Veronica St.

The Council has already formulated plans to make roads and plant trees in this area, whilst the sewerage plans are well in hand. When completed the whole will represent a really excellent and praiseworthy achievement for one builder and will add another landmark to this fair city. More important still, the houses will be occupied by owner-occupiers.

DICTATORIAL HOUSING COMMISSION MUST BE OPPOSED

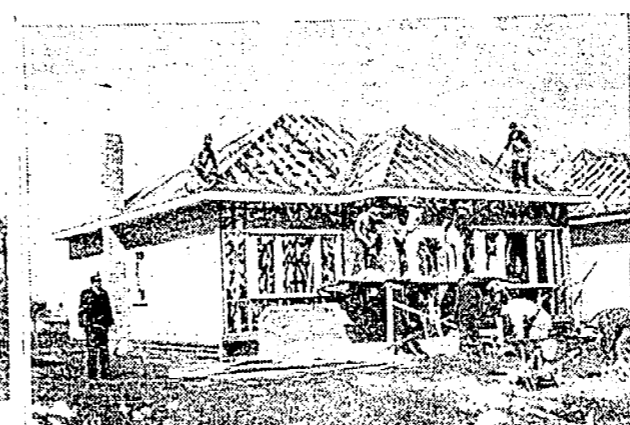
In conclusion, Mr. Simpson has this question: Are we the ratepayers of Northcote as a whole, and of the West Ward in particular, having put up with inconvenience and paid for the improve-

ments that have increased value of the racecourse property, now going to allow a dictatorial body to step in and say "We will compulsorily resume this land and build what we like on it without even paying building fees". His own answer is a definite NO!

Already over 2,000 West Ward residents have signed a petition against this arbitrary action. The petition is to be presented to the Premier at an early date.

It is hardly conceivable that in an allegedly democratic country, a body appointed by a Government (elected by the people) can prevent free citizens from purchasing a block of land under the auctioneer's hammer. The people only want to buy that which they have a perfect right to buy, and not dictate the already erected homes.

PUBLIC AMENITIES NEAR PHOENIX

In addition to the public tennis courts being erected at the end of Veronica St, there is an splendid park and recreation area fronting Leinster Ave. In time, the erection of a new bridge linking the Northcote and Brunswick is proposed. At the Beaconsfield Pde area an Education Department Reserve is being held and the question of further development in the erection of a new school building are also planned for the large area to the west of these tenements.

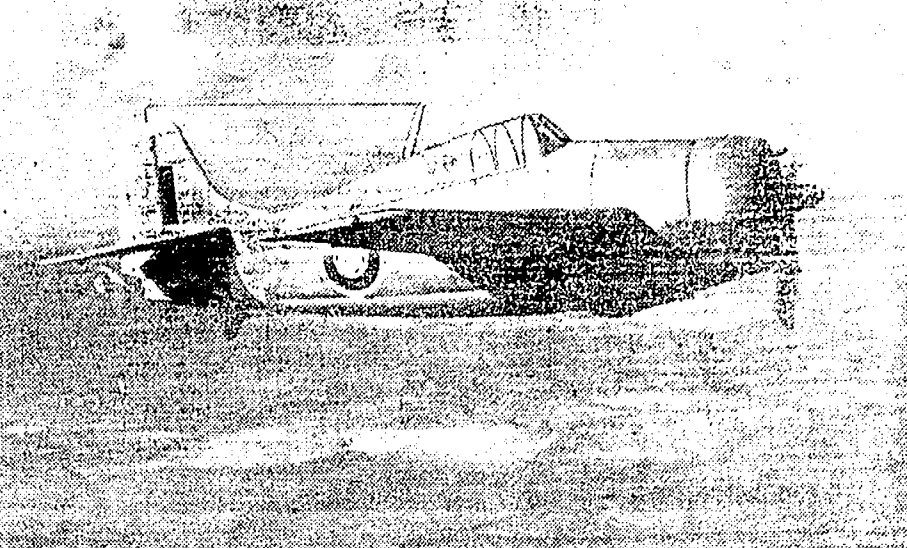

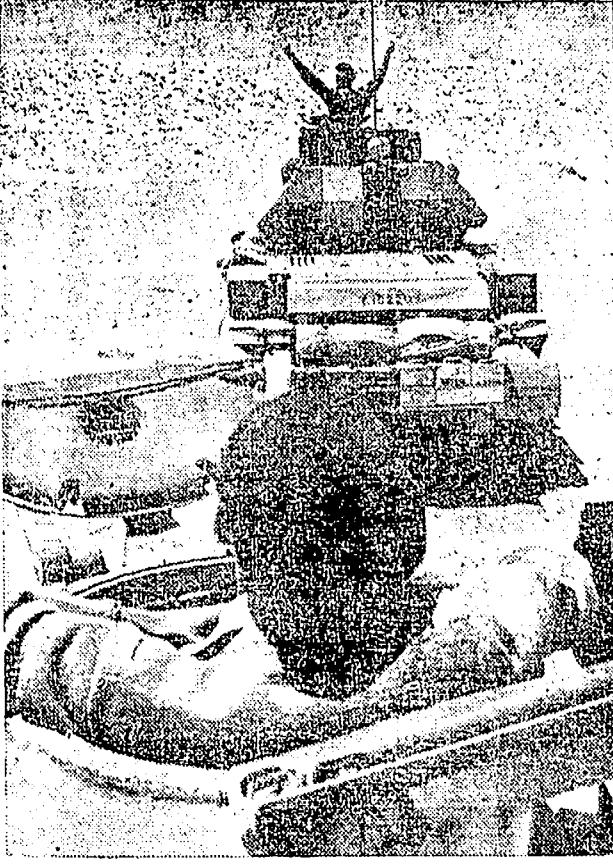
