HOSPITAL AUXILIARY'S WORK PRAISED

CHEQUE FOR £63 HANDED OVER

NOT so very strong in numbers, because there are many similar bodies in Northcote which concentrate their efforts for various institutions, the Northcote Auxiliary of the Women's Hospital has just concluded another highly successful year's operations, as was shown at the annual meeting held on Nov. 27 and which brought forth many laudatory references.

In accepting the invitation of consented to retain the position of the president (Mrs. S. Dennis) she had held for 12 years. The receipts for the year were £190. Donations included £19 from Mrs. Bardsley, Mrs. Hale £2, well and so favorably known as Mrs. W. Peters and Mrs. Mont- gomery £1/1 each. Expenditure was Mrs. Cornfoot, a vice-presi- dent of the Women's Hospital Auxiliary, who was making her first visit to Northcote, and they desired to give her a cordial welcome, together with many others. He trusted she would find her visit not only a pleasant one, but a profitable one also.

REPORT AND BALANCE SHEET

The annual report revealed that during the year £22 in cash, 49 baby gowns, 23 bolts, 6 singlets, 50 dozen bottles, 1929 eggs, and £1 has been sent to the hospital. In conjunction with the Girl Guides £105 was raised for patriotic purposes. In August last the balance owing on the £500 bed in the Women's Hospital was paid and on Oct. 13 the committee entertained members at afternoon tea, when Mrs. S. Dennis unveiled the bed. Appreciation was expressed at the action of Miss Mavis Kruger and her pupils with Miss Maudie Clifford as accompanist, who gave a concert in aid of the auxiliary funds. It was also the birthday of the Mayor of Northcote, who was present, and who donated the cost of the hall. He was presented by the juvenile artists with a birthday cake. The American tea at the home of the secretary (Mrs. W. A. Harley) on Oct. 25 added £12 to the funds, in- cluding donations of £5 from Mrs. A. Howey and £3/7 from Mrs. Brownell Montgomery. Thanks were expressed to all who had assisted in any way.

Sincere appreciation was ex- pressed of the work and loyalty of the foundation secretary, Mrs. A. W. Harley and notwithstanding opportunity of commenting on her removal to Malvern she had such a favorable balance sheet.

WORK MUST BRING GRATIFICATION

In moving the adoption of the report and balance sheet Cr. W. E. Findlay said it was with pleasure he did so as it made very pleasant reading and the ladies must feel gratified with their effort. It must have given them much satisfaction to know they had made the final payment of the £500 on the bed in the Hospital. He did not doubt they would be setting themselves the task to en- dow another bed. If money was hard to get, the women of the auxiliary must have done wonder- ful things to show a balance of £63, which he understood was to be taken away that afternoon. He had repeatedly stated that the re- ward the auxiliaries gained was the good they did to others and in improving the conditions of those who were weaker physically than themselves.

McNabb said it was un- fair to ask him to say in public what he had endeavored to do in the "Leader-Budget" with which he was associated—pay a tribute of esteem and loyalty to those women who comprised the various auxiliaries in Northcote. It might not be fair to make comparisons of the auxiliaries in the various suburbs, but what comparison there was, was all in favor of Northcote and for that the City should be proud.

PRESIDENT HANDS OVER CHEQUE

Mrs. Dennis, in acknowledging the vote, said the officers had done noble work and had done it so quietly, but so effectively. Mrs. Harley (the secretary) was a woman whose heart was in what she did and the officers had got on so well because they understood one another so intimately. Their long and close intimacy could not but bring the best of results. They were really one big family and she expressed her appreciation of a happy 13 years' association with them. She had had an idea she would like to drop out, as also did Mrs. Harley, but they were not allowed to do so. And so it was they were there that after- noon in their old places. She always liked to work for the deserving of so much considera- tion, and was used so largely by Northcote people. The committee of the Hospital was composed of a fine body of women. She had never seen more money about than at present and as everybody was working there was not the call on charitable societies there had been in the past. Next year they hoped to be able to present to the Hospital something better than the amount handed over dur- ing the present year. She had much pleasure in handing over a cheque for £63 to Mrs. Cornfoot knowing it would bring most humanitarian results.

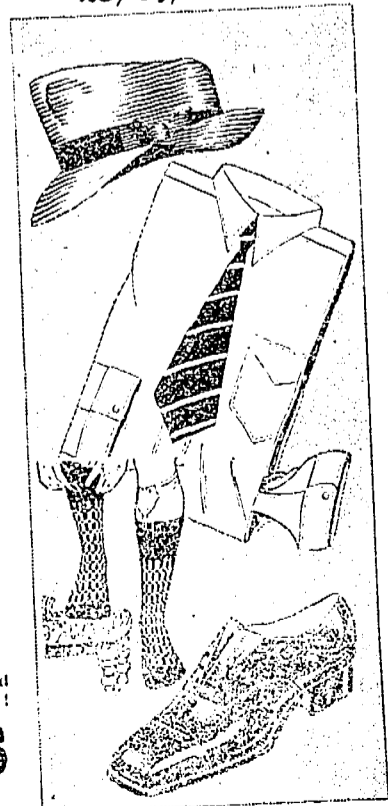

MAN OF MANY JOBS REGULATES OTHER PEOPLE

The Prime Minister (Mr. Curtin) replying in the House of Representatives to Mr. Sheehan (Lab., N.S.W.) said it would be unreasonable to ask the Prices Commissioner (Professor Copland), who was on leave from the University of Melbourne, to sever his connections with his own State. Mr. Sheehan was seeking information of the various posts held by Professor Copland. Mr. Curtin explained that he was a temporary officer of the Commonwealth.

As Prices Commissioner and Economic Consultant to the Prime Minister, he received £500 per annum, plus an allowance of 20/ a day, which included living away from home allowance and travelling expenses. His position as Commissioner of the State Savings Bank had been reduced at his own request during his term as Prices Commissioner to one-half the normal rate of £500. As Chairman of the State Economic Committee he received the nominal amount of £100 a year. Mr. Curtin said that, having regard to the fact that Professor Copland's total emoluments were reduced to 1/2 of his normal rate.

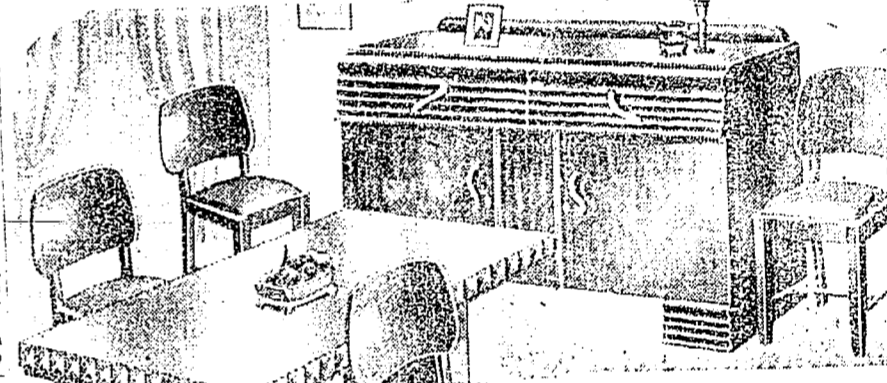

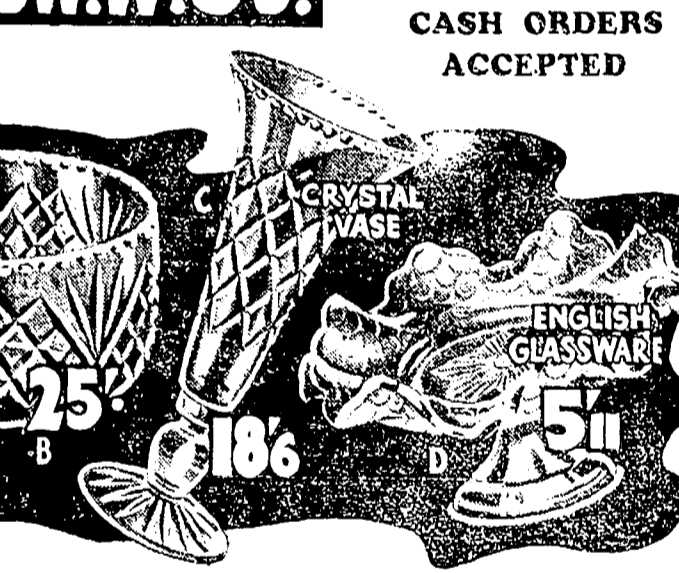

Popular Police Officer Farewelled

The esteem and respect which was earned by Constable D. Breavington during his eight years' duty in Northcote and the surrounding districts, was extended to him by his former officers and comrades who were gathered to bid him farewell in the Northcote Town Hall on December 1. By fellow members of the force in attendance, Constable Breavington in his 15 years' service, has had a most exemplary career and has earned a reputation for himself as an efficient officer who exercised a fine example of diligence and industry which might well be widely emulated. It might be regarded as somewhat surprising that Constable Breavington should have resigned from the force to take up a mechanical profession, and has most likely sacrificed an excellent career in doing so. But where duty calls, an interference can be forgiven, and he can be depended upon to play just as important a part in the defence of his country and of the Empire as he has shown in the zealous and sympathetic way in which he has carried out his duties in Northcote, where he will be sorely missed.

The chair was occupied by Sgt. Gilbert and the gathering stood for a minute's silence in honour of the departed member of the "Squires" who, according to accounts, went down fighting valiantly as well as bravely, and they would, following their previous brave exploits. Some of those present, and other members of the force, had sons or brothers on the front lines.

Mr. A. Fairweather of Northcote, replied to the toast of "The Squires" proposed by Senior Detective Donnelly. Mr. T. Cannon thanked the artists for the numbers they had supplied. Stories were told—only the police can tell them—community singing was indulged in, and Messrs. Soraghan and Bates, joined with others in providing the harmony. It was a very pleasant function, the arrangements for which were most capably carried out by Constable D. Duggan.
