## "HUSBAND WOULD NOT LEAVE HIS MOTHER"

### Says His Wife

#### NORTHCOTE FOOTBALLER MUST PAY MAINTENANCE

Northcote Football Club's rover, Herbert Lodge Simpson, of Kellott St., Northcote, appeared in a new role at the Northcote Court on February 24 when his wife, Iris Irene Simpson, complained that she had been left without means of support. She asked for a maintenance order for herself and her child, Kevin, aged 13 months.

Complaint was represented by counsel, and Mr. H. Gray of Messrs Gray & Gray, appeared for defendant.

Complainant said that for four or five months after their marriage on December 4, 1937, they got on well, but she left him on account of his drinking habits and because she was not getting any money from him. In May, 1938, he threw her in the street and told her to get home. That was when they were at her husband's mother's place. She took him at his word and went. They were apart for three weeks. When she went to see his mother, she asked "Do you want to see me, Mr. Simpson?" As she could not see him, she was intoxicated and told the latter asked witness to come back. She returned to her mother-in-law's home.

At Christmas, 1938, defendant started to go out again with his money and drink. He frequently came home drunk. She told him it would kill his mother if she found out he got drunk. He promised to give up liquor. It was soon just as bad again. At that time she was working and earning 12/10 weekly. She paid her mother-in-law 1/2. On the anniversary of their wedding he promised to take her to a show in town, but went out early in the morning and did not put in an appearance until all hours on the following morning. There was an argument over this. They had frequent quarrels over money and he told her that as she was working she did not want any money from him.

She left defendant at Christmas, 1939, after another quarrel. She was away from him until April, 1940. She was living with her grandmother in Brunswick for some time. She rang him up and asked for some money as she had been sick. He said he had none to give her. They started to go out together again, and once more they lived together at his mother's place. He would come home the worse for liquor and ask her whether the car he had been driving was all right as he did not want his mother to know he had been drinking.

"I told him he could stop drinking and get a home for me, and that if he could give his money to hotels, he could make a home for me," she said.

The wife said she was living with her people when the baby was born. It was five days before he came to see her. They had a quarrel in the hospital.

"I left him finally," said Mrs. Simpson, with the tears running down her face. "My mother had a car in North Fitzroy and I used to go and help her. When I was going home one Saturday night (which was my birthday) I met him. He had a note with him and he said he was going to see his mate's wife," she said.

She went home. He followed her but his mother (with whom she was stopping) told her to go, but at the request of defendant did not leave until next morning when she went back to live with her mother. Some time after the baby was born, she met him and they discussed a home. He said he would see about it later. When she saw him later, he did not mention anything about a home. She had told him she would go to work and help him

by Mr. Gray, said her only complaints about defendant were on account of his drinking habits and staying out late at night. He had never committed any act of cruelty to her or used bad language. Drink never interfered with his work, however. People around the street had told Simpson's mother that he drank but she would not believe them. Witness could not exactly say how many times in 3 1/2 years she had seen him drunk, but it would be nearly every week-end. On two occasions he had smashed cars he owned.

"On what basis do you say he was drunk?" asked Mr. Gray. "By his speech and by his falling over in the room," witness said.

Defendant had never complained about her conduct, continued Mrs. Simpson, and there was nothing in his conduct until five weeks ago which would have prevented her living with him. He had wanted her to take rooms, but she would not do so and a bedroom suite given to her by his mother had been taken back. He suggested they should

take rooms for two years. She knew he would never save anything, however. Defendant had said they wanted £100 to start a home. She did not require so much furniture.

"Outside the court this morning my husband asked me to come and live with him and take (Continued on Page Nine)

### A LETTER FROM ABROAD

An interesting letter from abroad has been handed on to us. The writer enclosed a but twelve 5 inches by 7 1/2 inches of rather stiff paper and printed in Arabic and English. The letter reads—

Dear— I was pleased to receive your letter of the — and to learn that you are well. I have recently received letters from Mr. Young and Mr. McElton so am kept well in touch with things that are happening around the office. I had a very interesting letter from my old friend Alf Atherton last week, giving me lots of news of things that I am interested in.

Things are fairly quiet in this particular place and we are fine well in for the winter I hope. The rains have commenced and does it rain? It hasn't stopped very much for the past week and has been and up to our knees in places. The weather is also very cold. The only thing we have in our quarters are Keroseene Stoves which are not very efficient. I have had a very bad cold for about a week and for 2 or 3 days in bed. I am about again but only get out of bed to stop myself from freezing. I will not get up and will come good again. I can get plenty of medical attention here but if I get near any of the Quacks they will want to put me in the hospital and I am not having any of that.

I have been "av-liv" in the steps with several of our boys and me I am getting pretty good at the cooking. I am now making oranges. Most of our food is out of tin and I am not bad at knocking it into something hot at times. We have been getting local beef and mutton lately and it is not nearly as good as the Australian beef we are getting.

It is raining like-birds outside at present and looks like keeping it up for a month.

We are carrying on with our normal functions as a big Military Hospital and as we are about four or five times bigger than the Melbourne Hospital you can imagine that we have plenty to occupy our minds. On the Quarantine side we are kept particularly busy as we feed, maintain, and transport everything for the hospital leaving our troops that leave us for return to their units. I am continually running across paths from Australia.

The weekend before last I went to Jerusalem for a day and then to Tel-Aviv for two days. At Tel-Aviv I had a good look around the old city, which is completely surrounded with a substantial stone wall. The streets in the old city are very narrow—in fact I have great difficulty in passing a motor car through them. The city is populated mainly by Arabs and poor class Jews. Most of the houses are built on a hill side situated in it. The Garden of Gethsemane is just outside the old city and the streets run along the narrow street of Calvary which is where the Church of the Holy Sepulchre now stands. This Church is one of the oldest, Temples in the East and is surrounded by at least seven different religions. The Roman Catholic Church is situated just north of the Protestant Churches.

The old city is built on the same as it has been for hundreds of years and one when I came through it feels that he is looking at some of those old Biblical pictures for the dress and the people look just the same. Some of the old men have beards at least, maybe a year or two. New Jerusalem is a very modern and built of heavy stone. The buildings are very high. All transport is by bus service. We went down to Tel-Aviv and had a quiet time on the beach facing the Mediterranean Sea. One would not think that only a few hundred miles from there—so much fighting is going on.

I think I told you before of two very large steamers that were wrecked on the beach here. They had brought Jewish refugees from Europe. On arrival they were not permitted to land so they ran the steamers ashore and wrecked them. These steamers have been blown up since our arrival and very little of the wrecks are left.

Tel-Aviv is built mostly of concrete and has some very fine buildings but is not to be compared with our cities. The picture theatres are fine buildings outside, but inside they are nothing like the furnishings of ours. It costs about 2 to 3c to see the pictures decently. The pictures are screened with the talking in English, at the bottom of the screen the words are in French. On the left of the screen they are shown in Hebrew and on the right Arabic. Two shows each night, the last starting at 8.30 pm.

Jaffa, a big, ancient city is right alongside of Tel-Aviv. It is a very old city referred to in the Bible as "Joppa." There are some substantial buildings there but also some very old and shabby ones. The Arabs, so far as morals are concerned, are not very good but they are not so bad as they were. In fact some of them are so bad that the city is out of bounds to Aussies.

I have received quite a lot of parcels from my wife and family. Parcels have been taken about ten months in most cases and in some cases have been damaged badly. Most of the parcels have addressed their people to send caution orders instead of parcels as the parcels invariably contain things that may be bought at the current price. We are all to have an extra ration of 100 Mills and a bottle of beer for Xmas Day. We had some real fun playing cards, table and rackets, so laugh that off. Yours etc., I. BOWLES.

#### DESCRIPTIVE LETTER FROM CAPT. COLE

Bullets often whizzed overhead from the taking machine gun fire of enemy fighters. They were like soldier crabs of the bay beaches when the alarm went. Several G.I.P. To prevent inconvenience and perhaps danger, the Council desires to continue Road and Path Repairs if possible, and to help with this object, makes an Urgent Appeal to all Householders to assist with the work of keeping paths, sides of roads, channels and lanes free of weed and debris.

For the average house frontage the time necessary for the work will be very small, while the results will be manifold. Debris may be placed in garbage tins, but weeds could be buried.

I believe all citizens have a pride in our City and that this appeal will be accepted with that spirit of co-operation which is necessary in these difficult times.

#### Useful Hints Regarding Food-Luggage-Clothes

IF IT SHOULD COME the evacuation of children will prove a very big task, but a task for which the proper authority, the State Evacuation Committee, is well prepared.

Many weeks of intensive organising work, necessitating a huge volume of detailed staff work, has enabled this body to prepare their plans on the most comprehensive lines.

It is, therefore, well to sound a warning note to all parents who have signified their intention of having their children evacuated; and in sounding this note we can think of no better way than by borrowing the Scout's motto: "BE PREPARED."

By this we mean "BE PREPARED NOW." Don't wait until the order is given to finalise your preparation. Do it now. Get everything, as stipulated by the authorities, ready and waiting so that when marching orders are given there will be an absolute minimum of delay.

Below we reproduce salient points from the booklet issued by the Committee.

#### CLOTHING

##### For school children

Children should be suitably dressed for the weather, and the amount of clothing should be taken with them on the evacuation journey as far as possible. The following are the items which should be taken:

#### EVACUATION KNAPSACK

##### Requirements

1. Bag of 26-in wide material, must be durable and light in weight.  
2. Buttons (two) twist or screw cotton.  
3. Strong buttons, approx. 12.  
4. Shoulder straps, approx. 12.  
5. Flaps (two) 5 1/2" x 12 1/2" (cut two).  
6. Reinforcement for button holes 2" x 1 1/2" (cut two).  
7. Flaps (cut two) 5 1/2" x 12 1/2" (cut two).  
8. Facing for button holes 2" x 1 1/2" (cut two).  
9. Turn lin. hem on top edge of bag piece and machine.
