THE DISPOSAL OF £10 NATIONAL BONDS

Public Meeting for May 19

THERE are a number of avenues available in Northcote as in other places whereby those who cannot link up with fighting forces or join the V.D.C. or A.R.P. can assist in the war effort in such a way that the country will be most grateful and the better off for their services, whilst the individuals themselves will feel more contented that in their leisure time they have devoted some of their energies to assist in making this country safer against Japanese aggression and in providing the services of war so badly needed. Nobody need look for war work and turn away disappointed that they cannot get it.

Money is wanted to prosecute the war to the fullest. It is costing Australia £8,000,000 per week for the war, and the Northcote War Loan and War Savings Committee is playing its part most effectively in assisting to get that money from those who would not feel the loss of 1/- per week towards the purchase of a War Savings Certificate or either 3/- per week towards the purchase of a £10 National War Bond.

But the Northcote Committee has not been able to raise £10,000,000 in the last 12 months. A communication from the State Committee stated that it was hoped to raise between £40,000,000 and £50,000,000 yearly from the sale of War Bonds and War Savings Certificates which represented £6 per head or 2/6 each per week. Certain information was enclosed which the committee was asked to observe. Whilst the amount which could be taken out in War Savings Certificates by any one individual could not exceed £250, there was no limit, it was pointed out, to what could be taken out in £10 bonds.

Mr. Clarke said the campaign for the sale of £10 bonds had been going on in the factories by voluntary speakers, and the success was encouraging. Many Certificates were being disposed of in factories. The principal trouble was in being able to get sufficient speakers to visit these places.

Cr. French: You are not unique in that.

Mr. Clarke: We want to hold 100 meetings a day but are only holding 20 on account of this shortage. Letters have been sent to business houses setting out matters in connection with the campaign. In the factories the firms have been allowing the speakers from six to ten minutes and then permitting them to go through the factories. I have been able to acquire the factory psychology, and that is something useful.

COMMITTEE DISCUSSES SITUATION

At a meeting of the Northcote Committee on April 30, Cr. French occupied the chair and there were also present, Messrs. Mitchell (Northern Ice Works), Landy (National Bank), J. A. Thomson (Town Clerk), Clarke (organiser of No. 2 Zone), R. P. Tharratt, A. H. Hill (secretary). Apologies were received from Rev. Father Conkley, and Messrs. Sparks and Holinger.

Cr. French said that amongst the recent business they had in hand was the War Savings Certificates folders, but that had mostly been fixed up through the churches. It had been very satisfactorily attended to so far as Northcote was concerned. It was now desirable to give serious attention to the disposal of £10 National Savings Bonds which carried interest at the rate of 3 per cent. So far as the launching of the next War Loan was concerned, it had been suggested that the quota for each municipality would be most substantial, but nothing definite had been fixed in that direction to the present.

Mr. Hills said applications to the Northcote banks, post offices, etc., in the Liberty Loan, which was £12,000,000 over subscribed, America's £20,000,000 weekly,

which was likely to be doubled.

Several speakers pointed out that on a population basis Australia's sale of bonds and certificates stood out most favorably.

Mr. Thomson asked whether it was intended to concentrate on the disposal of £10 bonds or on the War Loan.

Mr. Clarke: Bonds will be available for the duration of the war.

Mr. Mitchell considered they should comb every factory, large or small, and secure the co-operation of every employer.

Mr. Tharratt said that in the matter of some collections, the services of women were being used largely.

Cr. French thought it might be possible to get the services of a man to operate in each block of streets. A Mr. Edwards, who was operating in Northcote in that way in the disposal of War Savings Certificates had raised £200.

Mr. Landy: In connection with the disposal of War Savings Certificates some people bought 16/- ones and next day walked in and cashed them.

Mr. Mitchell said the men who would prove valuable in the factories were the group secretaries and they were the persons who might be invited to a public meeting.

Mr. Hills thought the wisest course would be to push the sale of £10 bonds.

Mr. Landy: To see the men individually in each factory would take half-a-day.

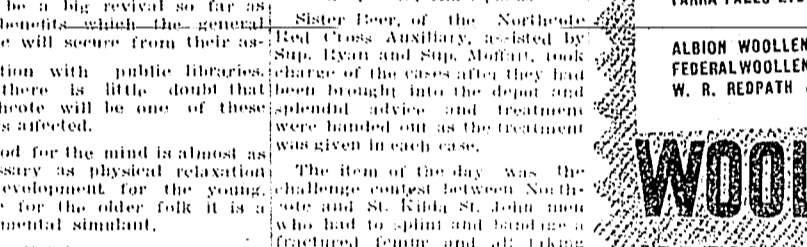

Handy Hints

Drink lemonade out of carbonate of soda with the back of the tumbler, before measuring. Use a dry basin and clean, dry wash when eating white of eggs.

Add a pinch of salt to eggs when beating. This helps to beat them quickly. It also brings out the flavor.

When making cakes attend to oven, preheat cake tins and measure all ingredients carefully before commencing to mix.

It is not necessary to grease cake tins or paper for cakes containing much butter.

Always cream the butter before adding the sugar; it saves time and is much easier. Avoid using wet fruit in a cake; this will cause the fruit to sink.

Do not beat after the self-raising flour is added to the cake; fold it in.

Have a hot oven for scones and pastry, a moderate oven for large cakes, and a slow oven for biscuits.

If a little furniture or floor polish is applied to all the joints and "runners" in a chest of drawers, also to that part of the drawer which runs in the holes, and to top edge of sides of drawers, they will make in and out with ease. Apply the polish with a piece of rag in the ordinary way.

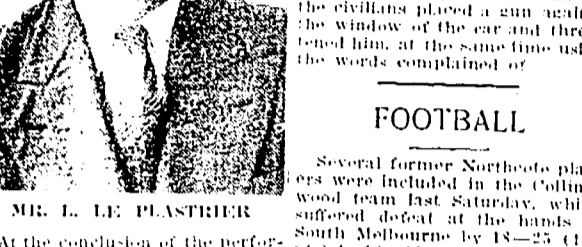

Colossal Industry Transformed
America's greatest industry—the making, marketing and servicing of automobiles, which provided direct and indirect employment in the U.S.A. for some 6,000,000 people, has now been fully transformed, looking that nations' war effort. As the American writer put it, "The U.S.A. automobile manufacturing business looks like the carcass of an Xmas turkey—Washington has picked the bones so clean."
The manufacturing end of the U.S.A. motor industry, capable of annually producing 6,000,000 cars and trucks, recently appointed a powerful committee comprising the leaders of the automobile and allied industries.
As Australasia now looks for material assistance and the greatest cooperation from the U.S.A. in the fight for freedom, the text of the statement of purpose of the Committee, adopted as a resolution, is noteworthy, says the Dunlop Bulletin.
"The Automotive Council for War Production pledges its limited effort, and facilities in aiding all plants in the industry to get up the mass-production of war material that will win this war."
"We pledge, on behalf of the entire automotive industry, not only a cooperative spirit in the production task, but complete inter-change of mass-production, time-saving techniques, product improvement, tooling, shortcuts and developments which the individual concerns have now effected or will bring about in doing their portions of the work."
"We know that this mutual readiness to assist one another will bring better results, for it has been tried and tested in the war work already given the industry, and it will be increasingly effective on the entered scale which coming war requirements will inevitably bring."
"The Nation will not lack for war cars, one tank, one engine, that the capacity and ingenuity of this industry's producers can add to the forces of our nation and its fronts on all the fighting fronts."

Famine In Occupied Europe
Every month now reports in the output of many items, conditions are being established in Italy's ordinance factories. In Italy, bayonets, cartridge cases, high explosive shell forgings, cases for anti-tank mines, binoculars, prismatic compasses, are steadily increasing in production.
India may soon justify her name as the arsenal of the East, according to Dr. Wilhelm O'Grady, head of the Technical Mission sent from the United States to arrange American assistance for developing the industrial resources of India as a supply base for the armed forces of the Allied Nations in the Middle and Far East.
Manufacture of several new items was successfully established early this year. These include light anti-tank contact mines, filled 2 High H.E. mortar bombs, 3 ft. 7 in. anti-aircraft driving lands, percussion primers and sighting telescopes.
India has also agreed to supply ten million pairs of brown rubber soled canvas shoes to meet the requirements of the "Technical Services. Delivery is to be at the rate of one million pairs a month beginning this month. Immense orders for war supplies have been placed by China, including several million yards of cotton cloth for uniforms and a substantial quantity of cotton yarn.
Orders placed by China are being made mostly confined to textiles but the possibilities of obtaining steel, iron, machinery, medical stores, industrial equipment, hand tools, electrical goods, etc. are being investigated.
