Second Racecourse Auction This Saturday Afternoon!

49 Home and Villa Pair Sites Offered

To Be Sold In Separate Lots

SATURDAY next, June 6, at 2.30 p.m. will see the second step in the subdivision of the Racecourse Estate (the old Fitzroy Racecourse subdivided) when 49 home and villa pair sites will be offered, in separate lots, under the hammer.

Building Ban Relaxed

CANBERRA, Monday.—Regulations prohibiting the erection of new buildings in densely-populated areas throughout Australia are to be relaxed.

Control of these building regulations has been transferred from the Treasury to the Minister for War Organisation of Industry (Mr. Dedman). Mr. Dedman will appoint a supervisor in each capital to handle all applications.

Permits will be restricted to essential building where manpower and materials are available without hindrance to war projects. Replacements of houses lost by fire and additions will be considered favorably.

A.R.P. Demonstration at N.C.C.

Attendance Marred By Weather Conditions

APPEALS MADE FOR SUPPORT FOR CIVIL DEFENCE

THE A.R.P. Pleasant Sunday Afternoon on the Northcote Cricket Ground last Sunday afternoon was robbed of a considerable amount of its effectiveness by the unpleasant weather conditions, but it was a brave and interesting showing all the same apart from the motive which prompted the organisers to hold it—that of securing many hundreds more people in Northcote to link themselves up with civil defence. It was unfortunate that the appeal did not reach the ears of many more people who would have been present but for the weather. The addresses by the various speakers and the marching of the different units made for an afternoon which embraced many pleasing features. Those who braved the elements—about 1500 spectators—were complimented on the part they played in such a splendid cause.

When the procession arrived at the park the different units took their positions with a snap and precision which was most praiseworthy. The three bands participating were Northcote City, Northcote Boys, and Preston Municipal. The March Past was most impressive and was led by the Girl Guides, displaying the flags of the Allied nations, followed by the V.D.C., who were appearing for the first time in their new uniforms. And how smart they looked! A.R.P. Wardens were led by the Area Wardens, Messrs J. Fogg, Cr. J. C. Watson, Williams, A. Skands and A. Kidd, with Mr. A. Clewley in charge. The Commandant (Dr. W. E. Brownell) led the First Aid personnel, and the Red Cross Emergency Service was piloted by the Superintendent (Mrs. Dean). Mr. E. Moore had the Northcote Auxiliary Firemen in hand, Miss Baxter led the V.A.D.s, Council Ambulance drivers were also in attendance.

The most spectacular part of the proceedings was furnished by the Chinese in their highly lustrous costumes, and they were led by Area Warden A. B. Johnson. It was announced that the Chinese, who came from Melbourne, had been only too pleased to cooperate, and they earned hearty applause. It was stated that the costumes had been donated by Mrs. L. Chung an influential Chinese lady.

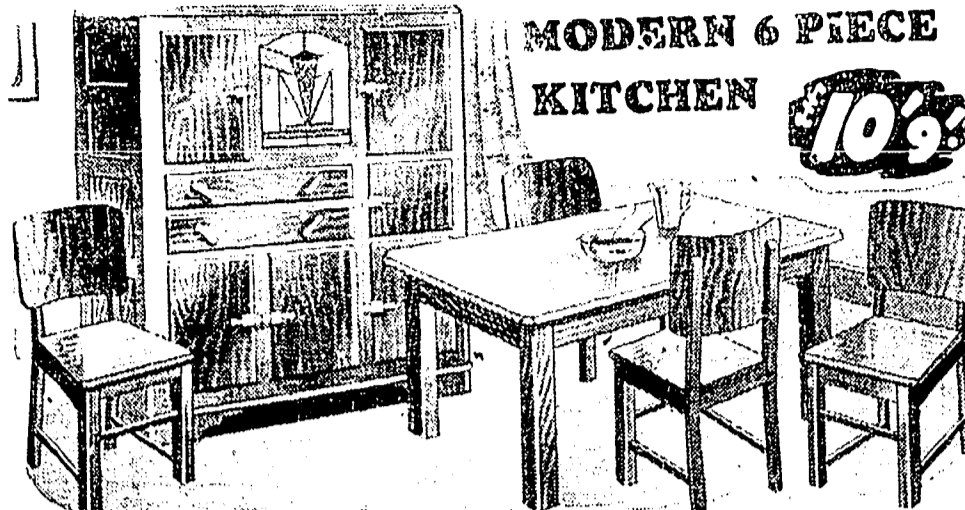

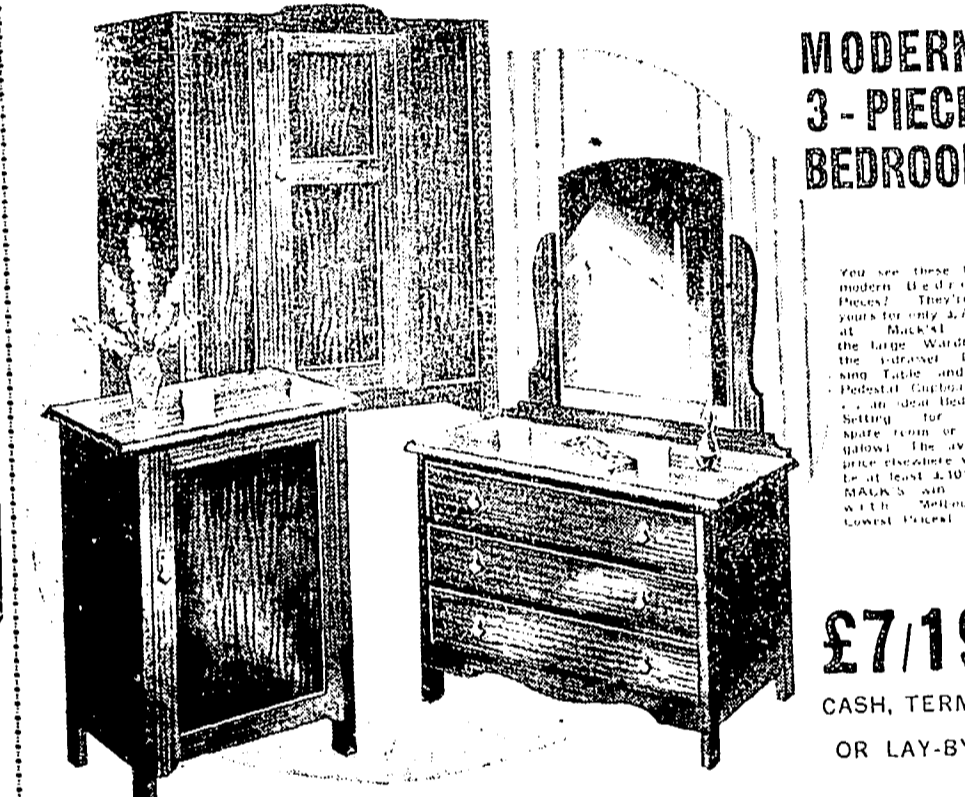

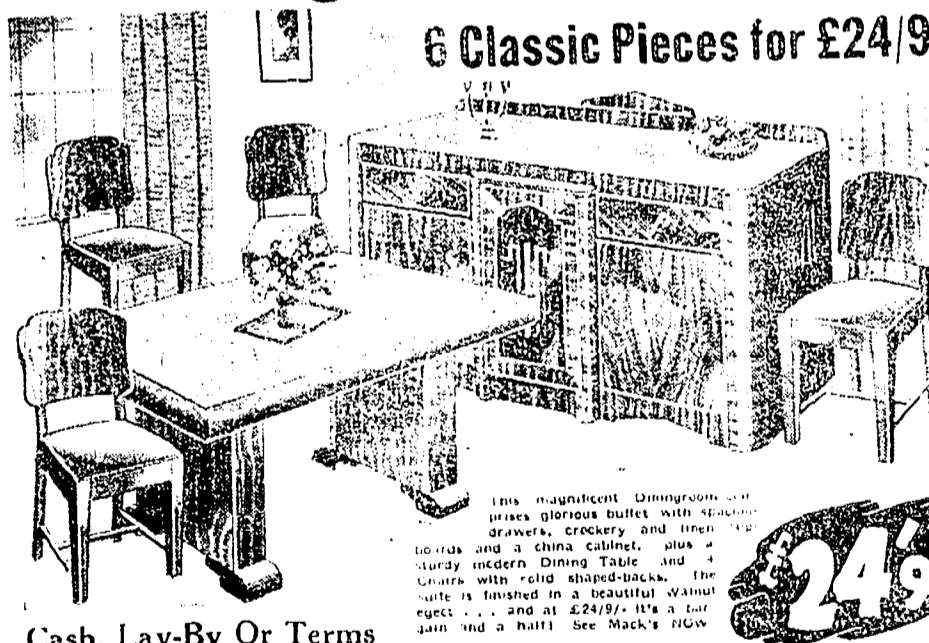
