Northcote's Efficient Fire Fighting Service

MEMBERS OF FIRE BRIGADES' BOARD GREATLY IMPRESSED

If this fair city of ours should be subjected to a blitz there is one body on whom the work will fall exceptionally heavily—the volunteer fire fighting service. Even if life's highway becomes more dusty, life's sea becomes more stormy, human tiredness becomes more apparent, and the danger of invasion just as real or even more so than ever it has been, we have a body of volunteers at Northcote who have been prepared to go through a course of training, dangerous in the extreme and who are keen to remember that there are other forms of helpfulness quite apart from being in the fighting services.

What these men are doing, and what they are qualifying themselves to do should a crisis occur should be an inspiration to many others to pause and consider for a moment, "Am I making any serious contribution to the war effort?" These men don't want sympathy; they don't look for publicity torches are not lit in their honor. They are conscientious and public-spirited citizens banded together to give service—and what service it is we know from England and other streets—when a call rings out for help.

Members of the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board and members of the Northcote City Council, at the invitation of Cr. M. C. Jones, of the Northcote City Council (who is the representative of the Northern Municipalities of the Board), had an opportunity to see these men on through their paces under Station Officer Moore last Sunday morning, and they acquitted themselves in such a manner as to win the highest commendation from those who viewed the demonstration. It would be beneficial if many citizens could catch the infection and enthusiasm of these men who have co-operated so well and so effectively with Mr. Moore.

Watson, of Northcote, together with the Town Clerk (Mr. J. A. Thomson), and the Electrical Engineer (Mr. G. H. Thomas). Mr. J. S. W. Marshall represented the Northcote A.R.P. organisation.

Lighting Arrangements

Northcote City Council and its Electrical Engineer (Mr. Thomas) came in for favorable comment at the meeting of the Northcote Progress Association on July 28th when references were made to the restrictions which had been lifted on the street lighting arrangements. The secretary (Mr. C. S. Gorman) stated that in the West Ward the arrangements had been all that could be desired and Mr. Thomas and his staff had done an excellent job under difficult conditions.

Cr. A. C. Bird agreed that the work had been carried out expeditiously and efficiently, thereby affording that measure of relief which the people desired. Mr. Thomas had shown much enthusiasm for his work and nothing appeared to be too much trouble for him. They were fortunate to have been able to secure the services of a man of Mr. Thomas' ability and he was one of those who viewed matters from a scientific basis. The greatest highbeam had been the lighting of High St. which would probably be one of the first jobs to be taken in hand at the conclusion of the year.

McNabb said he was one of those who were critical of one of the town arrangements but Mr. Thomas and his staff had made a very fine reconstruction job and one which he felt sure had not been surpassed in any metropolitan municipality both as to the excellent results provided, and on the motion of Mr. McGrath it was agreed to send a letter to the Northcote City Council commending it and Mr. Thomas on the effective measures which had been put into operation in the new arrangements.

Local Committee Makes Evacuation Arrangements

The regulations provide that it is necessary that the Town Clerk (Mr. J. A. Thomson) shall be the Evacuation Officer and the District Warden (Mr. J. I. McColl), the Medical Officer of Health (Dr. Brownell), the Transport Officer (Mr. Thomas) a representative of the Police Force be members of the Evacuation Committee. This would be compelled to function in the event of air raids. It was open to the Northcote City Council to appoint six others, four of whom have been appointed in the persons of the Mayor (Cr. A. V. Peters) and Cr. M. C. Jones and a representative from each of the Protestant and Catholic Churches, with two yet to be chosen.

The committee met on Wednesday evening last, when Mr. Neal, Deputy Director of Evacuation in Victoria and Mr. Peters, coordinator of Rest Centres in Victoria, attended and discussed matters in which the committee had to participate.

It was pointed out that the regulations set out that provision must be made for attending 2 per cent. of the population who might be affected by enemy action and it is proposed to establish clearing houses in either the State or the town arrangements but Mr. Thomas and his staff had made a very fine reconstruction job and one which he felt sure had not been surpassed in any metropolitan municipality both as to the excellent results provided, and on the motion of Mr. McGrath it was agreed to send a letter to the Northcote City Council commending it and Mr. Thomas on the effective measures which had been put into operation in the new arrangements.

Publicity will later be given regarding residents to make their own arrangements for accommodation should they be affected by enemy action and it is anticipated that the rest centres will only be utilised as clearing houses.

As soon as the halls are determined by the sanctions or operation of the owners, a committee of ladies and gentlemen will be formed at each hall and from time to time rehearsals will be undertaken in conjunction with A.R.P. exercises.
