Many Fires

Northcote Fire Brigade has had a very busy time during the hot spell, there having been many calls to fight fires. Most of the outbreaks have been in Preston, though Northcote has had a fair share also.

On Thursday night at 10.23 a grass fire broke out at the corner of Arthurton Rd and Railway Pl., Northcote, in which a quantity of grass and rubbish was destroyed.

Fire at Woodyard

First Aid Post No. 35

OBITUARY

PTE. GEORGE ALFRED COCHRANE By the recent death of Pte. George Alfred Cochrane at his residence, 281 St. George's Road, Groxton, a highly respected citizen of 53 years' standing has passed away, leaving cherished memories of his war activities with the Australian Forces in the Great War in 1914-18. As a member of the 1st Anzac Army Medical Corps 5th Division Field Ambulance, he went to Gallipoli and other battles in which he obtained various medals including the Gallipoli Star. After over three years' service he was on his way home when peace was declared. But Pte. Cochrane, in his war service had unfortunately sustained ailments which invalidated him for many years, but which he bore stoically, knowing he had given his best for King and Country. Pte. Cochrane was the son of the late George and Theresa Cochrane, old residents of Groxton district, and the eldest member of a family of 12 sons and daughters. He was educated at Alfred Crescent State School, Northcote and later joined his father in the bootmaking industry in Perry St., Collingwood. At the time of his demise he was a member of the firm of T. A. Cochrane Pty. Ltd. and a much respected member of the Clifton Hill U.A.O.D. Lodge. The funeral was representatively attended, the remains being interred in the Coburg Cemetery. Rev. W. Hewison, Collingwood, conducted an impressive service. Numerous floral tributes provided expressions of condolence for his brothers and sisters.

SOLDIER CHARGED WITH STEALING

But Is Released On Bond

Kenneth Vivian Tyrrell, a soldier, of Brighton, was charged before Mr. Pyvis, P.M. and Messrs. Holden and Theisz, J.S.P., at Northcote Court on January 29, with stealing.

Jim Nickolien, soldier, of Heidelberg Military Hospital gave evidence that he was an inmate of Ward 5. He had been wounded in the head. At 7.30 a.m. on Jan. 22 he left a purse containing two one pound notes and 8/ in silver on a locker beside his bed. Shortly afterwards he went to breakfast. When he returned at about 8.30 a.m. the purse was gone.

Const. Grundy gave evidence that at 11.30 a.m. on January 23 in company with Det. Donnelly he went to the hospital and interviewed accused. Tyrrell denied all knowledge of the offence at first, but later admitted taking the purse and money. He produced 38/ and said he had thrown the purse away. Witness took a written statement and later a summons was issued. Accused was at the hospital for eye treatment.

On being charged accused pleaded guilty. He was convicted and sentenced to one month's imprisonment. This was suspended on accused entering into a bond of 125 to be of good behaviour for 12 months.

"Fare Scalers" Warned

A wish that heavier penalties could be imposed on "fare scalers" was expressed by Mr. H. H. Bell, chairman of the Tramways Board. Between November 1 and January 30, 74 persons had been reported for failure to tender fares. Of these 49 had been warned, 7 had been prosecuted, and fined 27 with 29/5/6 costs, 10 prosecutions were pending and eight were in hand.

Mr. Bell said the worst feature of the report he had received was that during the period mentioned no fewer than 1,200 persons had been discovered "waiting" for conductors to come for their fares. Passengers detected over-riding numbered 1,892.

It was the responsibility of the passenger to actually offer the fare to the conductor.
