Northcote Civil Defence Services "Stand To"

AN AIR RAID ALARM WAS RECEIVED THROUGHOUT THE MITTROPOLITAN AREA ON SATURDAY, APRIL 3REFOR THE PURPOSE OF THOROUGHLY TESTING COMMUNICATIONS AND GENERAL ORGANISATION.



presented and said the executive of the Children's Hospital was extremely grateful to them for their work throughout the year and for the wonderful donation which had resulted from it. When the war started the committee of the hospital realised that many avenues of income wou'd be closed to them, while their responsibilities would become greater. On the whole the war seemed to have drawn the workers closer togething children. She had to thank the Northcote Auxiliary for their help in many minor ways also, such as street appeals, collection of goods, materials, garments and waste products, and also valuable work done in the background, at the hospital. The speaker then gave a highly interesting resume of the new branch which had been undertaken at the hospital at the request of the Victorian Society of Cripples, in the care of children with spastic cases of paralysis. These children had no idea of coordination or control of the muscles of the hody, and doctor until lately said very little could be done in such cases. When the Children's Hospital set aside certain wards as a Spustic Department, hospital doctors took up research work in this field. The children look normal until one tries to pick up a cup, or other articles, or another tries to walk, but cannot go through and co-ordinate the necessary actions to achieve their purpose.
