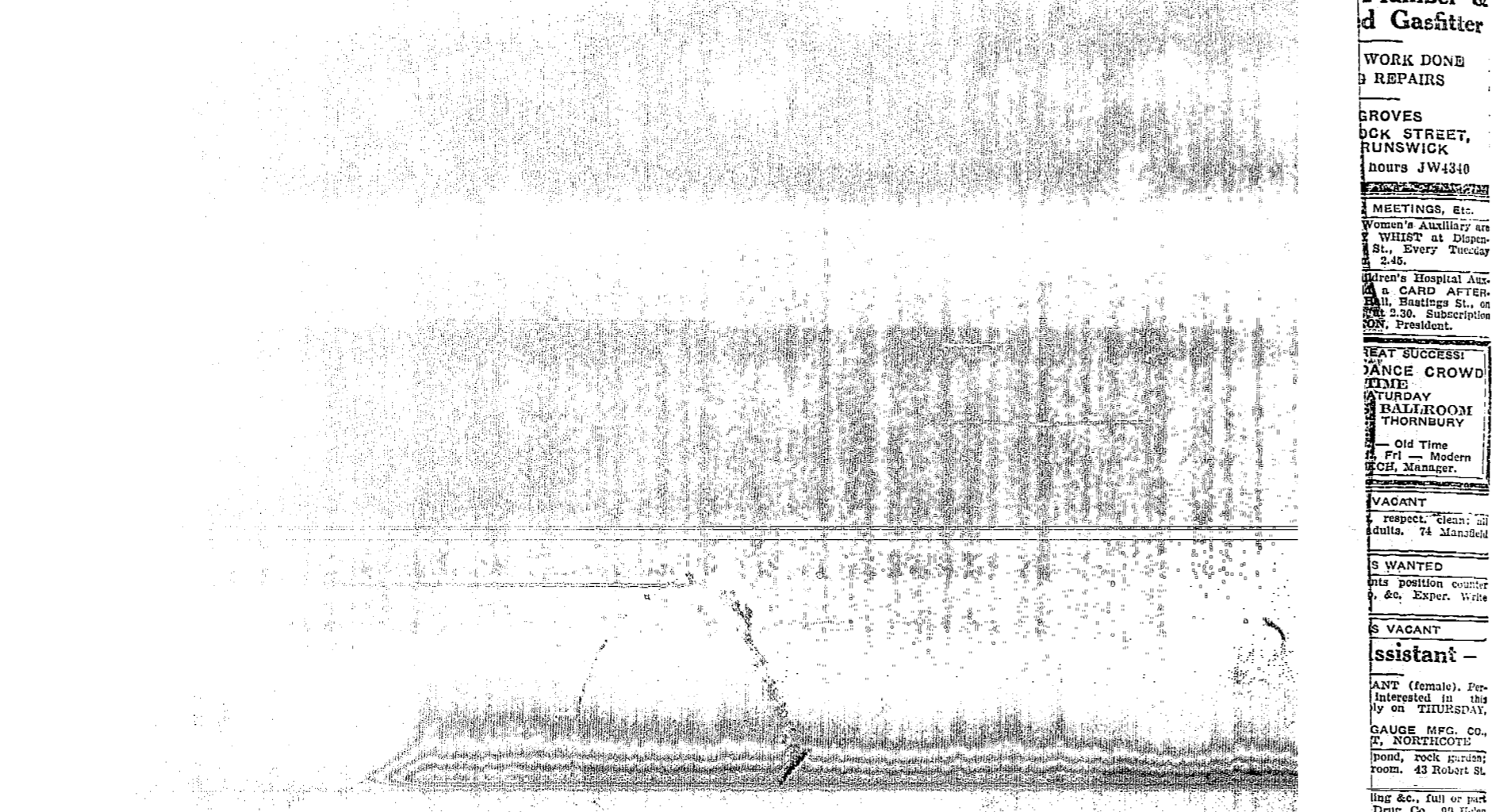

Northcote's Loan Contribution — £167,000

UNDER QUOTA BUT WELL ABOVE AUSTERITY LOAN FIGURE

Disquieting Features
Northcote citizens, to the number of 1389 touched their pockets to the tune of £167,200, as their contribution to the 3rd Liberty Loan.
Whilst this figure is well below the quota set (£250,000—a pipe dream in any case) it is an advance of £27,000 over the city's contribution to the Austerity Loan and represents all fresh money. Conversations did not operate for this loan.
The most disquieting fact revealed by the release of the completed figures is that of Northcote's population of 45,000 (of whom 20,000 would be in a position to invest), only 1,389 saw fit to do so. Probably closer examination would reveal that the majority of these people had carried the city's burden in previous loans.
Whilst there were one or two factors militating against 100 per cent. subscription, the inescapable fact emerges that thousands amongst us intend confining their war effort to cheering and backslapping.
Just what has to happen to make them realise their responsibilities is something known only to themselves. The only remedy appears to be the introduction of a compulsory saving scheme and as the Prime Minister has repeatedly pointed out this method is most repugnant in a free and allegedly democratic country.

He then led his platoon in a thrilling and successful attack on the enemy's position.
Latest advice to hand is that Sgt. Gibbons has been promoted to the rank of Lieutenant.

ESTIMATED COST £750
Reporting to the meeting of the Northcote City Council on Monday, Cr. W. H. Turner said that with the Northcote Engineer (Mr. Hill) he had met Cr. Blake and the Preston Engineer on the site to discuss a proposed pedestrian crossing over the tramway bridge in Miller St., on the boundary of the two municipalities.
After some discussion, and the submission of an estimate of £750 by the Northcote engineer as the cost of a separate footbridge, Cr. Blake had agreed to strongly recommend this scheme to his council.
Cr. Turner pointed out that there was need to move quickly in the matter, as the prices of materials altered from day to day.
Cr. Turner was thanked for his report, and on the motion of Cr. A. C. Bird, the matter was referred to the Committee of the Council.

Northcote Direct Giving Appeal

For the eight months of this month's year, £3,450 has been received from the Northcote Direct Giving Appeal.
The Town Clerk (Mr. J. A. Thomson) said last week that residents are maintaining the average of giving, despite many other calls, and it was highly satisfactory that such should be the case. Those who gave had the satisfaction of knowing that every penny subscribed was passed on by the Northcote Patriotic Society for the purposes for which the money was given—there were no deductions for expenses, as these were met by the Northcote City Council.
A meeting of the Northcote Patriotic Committee will be held on Thursday, May 13, when further money from the fund will be voted to the Red Cross, Comforts Fund (which between them receive equal shares of 50 pc. of the total money raised), and there will probably be some allotments to other war service or relief funds.

Thieves at Redmond's Maternity Store

On Thursday night, or early Friday morning, a fallow thief entered the store of T. E. Redmond, 174 1/2, car High and Redmond St. and stole between \$2 and \$3 in money.

Then, removing a sheet of iron from the roof, the rope was affixed to a beam above the man hole in the ceiling, and so entrance was gained to the shop. It is thought that the thieves were only seeking money, as nothing else was disturbed.

Maternity Allowances

The Maternity Allowances Bill, which has passed through all stages of Parliament without amendment, provides for increases in the minimum maternity grant, from £10 to £12, and for a week for eight weeks to provide nursing, domestic and other assistance.

Until the Bill went through Parliament there had been a means test conducted before allowances were granted. Parents received £4/10 for their first child if their total income did not exceed £27. For their second or third child they received £5, if their income did not exceed £33.

With the removal of the means test, allowances will be paid irrespective of parents' income after July 1.

The grant for a first child has been increased to £5, and for a second or third child from £5 to £6. The grant for families of four or more children is unaltered at £7/10.

AN INTERESTING LECTURE

Some Aspects of Typhoid Fever

An interesting lecture on a topical subject—an outline of typhoid fever—was given by Dr. W. F. Brownell (Commandant), at the Northcote Branch of the Workers' Educational Association on Friday night last.

The lecture was given at 8 p.m. and was held in the hall of the Northcote Branch of the Workers' Educational Association on Friday night last.

The lecturer said that at the end of the 19th century typhoid fever was a common disease in the South African and World War. It was a disease peculiar to an aggregation of people under insanitary conditions and was also known as "typhoid fever".

The only similarity between typhoid fever and typhus is the name and the typical rise in temperature. The temperature rises each day for the first 7 days; stays at a fairly high temperature for the next 7 days; and then gradually falls during the third week. In 5 per cent of cases a relapse occurs when the temperature repeats the same process.

BOOKS for the TROOPS

Charcoal Must Be Dry

After damp weather, many owners of vehicles equipped with gas systems need more attention. The cause is excessive moisture in the charcoal. Steam distillation dries the filters.

Charcoal should be stored in a warm, dry place, off the ground, and covered against rain. The washhouse is ideal, if possible, dry out wet charcoal near a fire.

If you are on a trip and do not have a charcoal canister, you can use a tin of charcoal. As you lift the tin, steam will rise and charcoal will dry. Charcoal can be used for a few miles and then replaced.

Top-up more frequently on long runs when using wet charcoal. As the fuel is added, excess will be allowed to burn low and excess will be necessary, excess steam will be generated.

Refuel immediately a stop is made instead of waiting until the fuel is nearly used. This is especially true when the fuel is slightly wet. Charcoal will be dry when you are ready to move on.

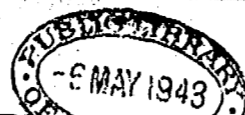

SPEED AND PETROL

Why Consumption Increases

The principal reason that your automobile petrol mileage rides a see-saw with your speed, going sharply down as the speed comes up, is because of greatly increased air resistance with an increase in speed.

Both water and air resistance increase rapidly with speed. It usually requires eight times the power to double the speed of a ship. This can be modified to some extent in small boats by modelling the hull so that the boat climbs almost entirely out of the water, or hydroplanes, at high speed.

In an automobile, however, we are at the bottom of the "sea" of air, and so cannot practice hydroplaning and the air resistance builds up enormously. For example, a racing car, even though beautifully streamlined, when travelling at some 200 miles an hour, has to overcome an air resistance of more than half a ton and uses up 500 horsepower meeting this resistance alone. High speed, consequently, is expensive. Some interesting experiments have been made which shed light on the cost in petrol or fast driving. For example, it was found that a car which would consistently deliver 20 miles to the gallon at 20 miles per hour would only go 8.1 miles per gallon when driven at 70 miles per hour. And if you drive at 30 miles per hour instead of at 60 miles, it will take 40 miles per hour—5 extra h.p. or 1.7 per cent grade.

If you longer to reach a distant destination but actual road tests indicate that the extra time required pays a cash dividend in petrol savings of 5/ an hour.

The increased air resistance is not the sole reason for decreased mileage at high speeds. Motors are designed to give their best and most economical performance at certain speeds. At higher speeds their operating efficiency drops somewhat. Then, too, there is some increased friction in bearings, and some rear wheel slippage to be added to the increased air resistance at high speeds.

As speed increases on a level road it is equivalent to ascending an increasingly steep hill of the grades shown hereunder:—

60 miles per hour—20 extra h.p. or 3.5 per cent grade.

80 miles per hour—48 extra h.p. or 6.3 per cent grade.
