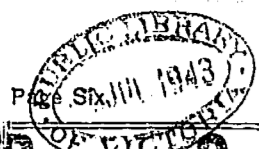

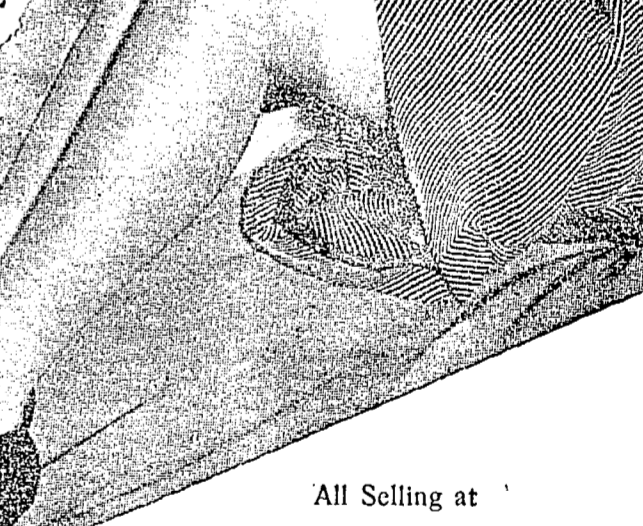

Tippling of Garbage

On Monday night the Northcote City Council was advised by the Public Health Dept. that permission had been granted for the establishment of a tippling rubbish from Fitzroy at Northcote, to cover garbage being tipped at the new site at Comas Gve.

Cr. W. H. Turner moved that the letter be referred to the Public Works Committee, and said he felt the Northcote Council should be far more strict with Fitzroy in regard to the type of rubbish dumped. The people of the Comas Gve locality have under protest decided to put up with the tip, in view of the ultimate decision to be gained by improvements to the locality. He had already heard a complaint of how two men had gone to the tip and had found several dead rats which had been tipped with garbage from Fitzroy.

Cr. A. C. Bird: That is a very serious allegation.

A voice: It would have been far more serious had the rats been alive.

Cr. Bird: Such refuse should be sent to a destructor and not to a tip. We should be very firm as to the type of rubbish sent out.

Cr. M. C. Jones: The financial arrangements in regard to Fitzroy tipping at Northcote are very advantageous to us, and by the use of Fitzroy garbage the tip will be filled much more quickly.

Cr. Bird: I consider we should safeguard the health of our ratepayers, and am not so much concerned with the financial aspect.

The matter was referred to the Public Works Committee.

On Friday night last the medical officer of the Northcote First Aid Post (No. 25) lectured on "Blood Transfusion."

Speaking on a Russian paper issued in 1942 Dr. Brownell said that Soviet scientists had made remarkable progress when it came to blood transfusion, and experiments were made to increase the time it could be kept in the body for 10 days; or 10 days if subject to handling and transport. To-day the blood is kept for 25 days; or 20 days if transported.

Universal Blood Group

Russian scientists largely use a universal blood group instead of our 4 groups, styled No. 0 for the blood in question. This universal group is not always satisfactory, but it saves time in an emergency. In the army a great deal of work is done in classifying the different blood groups. One drawback of the universal group transfusion is that it should not be used twice on the one person.

Although the use of the four blood groups gives a more reliable Soviet practice has shown that in the present war the majority of blood transfusions are made in the blood group of the donor.

Hundreds of tons of blood are transfused yearly in the Soviet in the war with gratifying results. The blood is collected in a bank and sent by special train wherever needed.

Three methods of transfusion used are (1) the drip method, which takes a long time; (2) plasma; and (3) serum. The plasma method is used largely in the army and is the most efficient. Plasma contains all the essentials except the corpuscles and the document was placed inside a writing pad. The pad had been sent since Mrs. Tucker on 12/12.

Contractor Alleges Money Owing

A CLAIM DISMISSED

Arthur Tucker of Elstowick, took proceedings before Mr. Justice Glynne at the Northcote Court on July 27 against Alfred W. Griffin of Elizabeth St., Northcote. Plaintiff alleged that money owing for work done had not been paid. Mr. P. P. Walsh appeared for plaintiff and Mr. Gray (Gray & Gray) for defendant.

Tucker gave evidence that he had done a brick fence for defendant. The contract was for £15. Defendant said he would pay £5 and give witness the balance of £10 when the excess material was removed. This amount of £10 had not been paid.

Cross-examined, Tucker denied the £10 had been paid before the 25th. Many questions were asked of him about the job. It appeared that he and his wife had been at the defendant's house while work was being done. He admitted that he had been drinking and that he was drunk at the time. He thought he was overcharged and did not intend to pay.

A MISSING DOCUMENT

Defendant stated that he arranged with Tucker to have the fence built. He asserted that he had paid Tucker £15, of which £10 was uncertain as to what he saw his solicitor do with the money. The document was drawn up and it was signed by Tucker. The document was a receipt for the amount of £15, but now he could not find the document.

An application was produced in court and was identified as a copy of the original by witness.

Mrs. Griffin gave evidence that she was present when Tucker signed the receipt for £15. The claim was dismissed. Costs £2/12 were awarded to defendant since Mrs. Tucker on 12/12.

Northcote & Preston Community Hospital

At a meeting of the Provisional Committee held in July, there was a full attendance of members. The meeting was of a special nature, as it was the first since the Secretary (Mr. A. E. Jones) reported some interesting news which had been discussed at an interview with Mr. McVilly, Secretary of the Charities Board. The latter advised that the Hospital Committee was now incorporated under the Hospitals and Charities Act, 1925, and it was advisable to consider the appointment of architects to submit plans and specifications for the proposed hospital.

The Committee decided, after considering many letters from firms of architects, to appoint a sub-committee to secure further information regarding the work of the architects before making a decision.

The appointed committee has since interviewed Mr. McVilly and some very valuable information was obtained. The committee will meet before the next meeting, at which the architects will be appointed.

Ejection Proceedings

AN APPLICATION REFUSED

The application for a warrant of ejection was granted, but its issue was stayed for one month.
