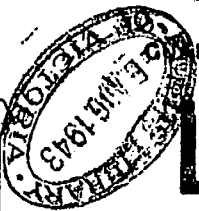

## Mr. Brennan Opens Campaign Labor's Municipal Aspirations

### FINE RHETORIC MARKS SLASHING ATTACK ON U.A.P.—C.P. OPPOSITION

With the staging of Mr. F. Brennan's public meeting in the Northcote Town hall, Thursday night, July 29, it can truly be said that the big guns have commenced to boom in the "Battle for Batman." Rarely has Mr. Brennan been in greater rhetorical form. Caustic wit, biting comment and impeccable logic marked his speech. It was an able presentation of his own and the Labor Party's case.

Supporting the candidate on the platform were Mr. John Cain, M.L.C., State Parliamentary Labor Leader, Mr. A. D. McFraser, M.L.C., Crs. W. Turner and A. Bird, whilst Mr. Devery was chairman.

Opening the meeting, the chairman referred the vital importance of this election and its tremendous influence on our nation's future. He stressed the absolute necessity for voters to correctly mark their ballot papers for both the Representatives and Senators.

Mr. Brennan opened by emphatically upholding the necessity for elections being held. The spacious and shallow reasons advanced by people who claimed an election would interrupt the war effort would not bear close examination. If we found time to follow, as we were doing, our normal lives, surely time could be found for us to go to the polls and exercise our right to elect our national Parliament, guardian of all our democratic institutions. He entirely disagreed with Mr. Menzies when that gentleman stated that this election would be one of the most filthy ever to be fought. Personally he, and he was certain also his opponents in Batman, would not find descent into the

### TO CONTEST EAST AND NORTH WARDS

#### New Contestant In Mr. Alex. Smith

Retiring councillors in Cr. F. Capp and Cr. M. O. Jones, of the North and East Wards respectively, are to be opposed by endorsed Labor and resident candidates in the persons of Mr. Tom Walsh (who opposed Cr. Capp previously) and Mr. Alex Smith is contesting municipal honors for the first time.

Cr. Jones, it will be recalled, retired from the North Ward in 1939 and succeeded the late Cr. Ben Johnson in the East Ward. He was unopposed and therefore has not, as yet, faced the ratepayers in this Ward. The result should be interesting.

#### MR. A. SMITH FOR EAST WARD

Mr. Alex Smith, of 6 Grandview Ave, Northcote, has been endorsed as an official candidate by the Labor Party for the East Ward in opposition to Cr. M. O. Jones.

Mr. Smith is factory manager for Chas. E. Kennott, and his organizing ability has been utilised by this firm in sending him to Brisbane and Sydney to take charge when branches of their business were being established in those cities. He has been for many years a member of the Federated Furniture Trade Union and has given considerable time to social and industrial conditions. Mr. Smith has lived in Northcote for over 30 years, and has for the past 13 years been a resident of the East Ward. Therefore he can claim an intimate knowledge of both the ward and of the City in which he aspires to be a councillor.

Quietly spoken, Mr. Smith brings keen reasoning power and considerable acumen to his aid when presenting Labor's case for municipal government.

#### CR. CAPP'S MEETING

A vote of confidence in Cr. Capp was unanimously carried, several speakers eulogizing him for the excellent service he had rendered to the ratepayers of the North Ward in the brief time he has held his seat.

Cr. Capp briefly outlined the work he had done, and stated that he felt confident, with the help and support promised him, the result would again be in his favor.

It was decided to hold a further meeting on Wednesday, August 4, Cr. Olver being appointed Campaign Chairman, and Miss M. Ede and Cr. Alex Gray honorary secretaries.

Mr. Tom Walsh, endorsed resident Labor candidate for the North Ward, was confirmed in his decision to oppose Cr. F. Capp, when a deputation of ratepayers pointed out to him the

fact that of the present three councillors representing that Ward, two are non-residents. He is vice-president of the Thornbury ALP branch and his activities as Officer-in-charge of the ALP Messenger Service are well known. An ambitious programme has been mapped out for presentation to the ward voters, and incorporates seats and shelters to be erected along the Victoria Rd-Dundas St bus service route, rectification of the neglect evidenced by a half-fenced quarry hole alongside the children's playground in Clarendon St; improved approaches to the Northcote East State School; rate reduction for the duration of the war, and other improved civic amenities.

By notices appearing elsewhere in this issue, both Cr. A. McAdam J.P. (South Ward) and Cr. M. C. Jones J.P., (East Ward) announce their intention of seeking re-election.

Cr. McAdam is, of course, at present contesting the Batman Federal electorate against Mr. Brennan, the retiring member, and so far there has been no notice of his being opposed in the South Ward municipal election.

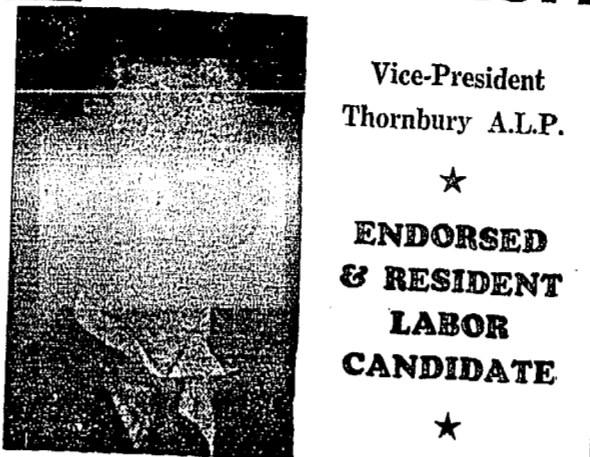
