At the time of judging it will not be necessary for all vegetables to be fully matured and if the sowing time coincides with judging time, plots sown for future harvest will be allotted points. Residents are urged to prepare plots immediately and to prepare a planting time table.

All rubbish in the form of grass, weeds, lawn and hedge clippings should be buried under the proposed plots, thus serving the double purpose of improving the fertility of the soil and helping to keep the garden free of insect pests.

No Private Auto Taking Planned
U.S.A. ASSURANCE
IMPORTANCE OF KEEPING CARS IN OPERATION
 Complete assurance has been given to the American automobile industry by the War Production Board that the Government positively has no intention of confiscating private cars out of seizing spare tyres either now or as far as can be seen into the future, the National Automobile Dealers' Association announced on March 22.
 The dealers made this statement to silence recurring rumors of possible confiscation of cars or spare tyres which were interfering with new car sales and sales of new automobiles to defense workers. Conditions do not suit such drastic action as car or spare tyre seizures, said Mr. Donald M. Nelson, chairman of the WPB, in a letter to the Dealers' Association. The Under-Secretary for State (Mr. Patterson) was quoted by the dealers as saying recently that the Government might have to confiscate all private cars in excess of 20,000,000 and possibly take all spare tyres. Mr. Nelson's statement said: "There is no question of the importance of keeping the 27,000,000 motor cars and 5,000,000 trucks in operation, and we have already indicated the essentiality of these services."
