LEARN-TO-SWIM CAMPAIGN

At Northcote City Baths

During the week, with suitable bathing weather, enrolments for learning to swim at Northcote baths have been larger than usual so the instructors have had a strenuous time, but they feel that the good results achieved more than justify their efforts.

SOME WATER HAZARDS AND THEIR REMEDIES

The reason for the study of swimming and causes of death by accidental drowning rests upon bed rock—self preservation—the very first law of nature.

Satisfactory adjustment to water—a physical environment to which we are not adaptable by nature, yet irresistibly are drawn to by instinct—involves a twofold acquired adjustment—a mental as well as a physical one. The physical adjustment involves the attainment of a degree of technique sufficient to permit safe water sport participation. The mental adjustment involves competent self direction, intelligent choice in the matter of taking risks and safe and sane conduct.

In a brief study of causes of death by drowning in this State it can be said that there are eight of these causes (with elaboration) are: (1) Inability to swim; (2) swimming alone; (3) Swimming too far from shore or bank; (4) Swimming too soon after eating; (5) Diving into shallow water; (6) Attempting to rescue others without training; (7) Swimming ashore from a capsized boat or canoe; (8) Swimming at unguarded swimming places.

As has been repeatedly pointed out in these columns most of the deaths by accidental drowning are preventable and the following rules with regard to the above should meet the case: (1) Learn to swim; (2) Never swim alone; (3) Swim only near shore or bank; (4) Wait an hour after eating before swimming; (5) Dive only into water of sufficient depth; (6) Never attempt a rescue without previous training; (7) In case of a row boat or canoe accident—stay with the boat or canoe; (8) Swim only at guarded bathing places.

Many competent swimmers and lifesavers have assumed certain definite responsibilities and duties, of which they must be ever mindful. Firstly in educating the public in swimming, as a safety measure. Secondly, warning others against known dangers and lastly, volunteering their services in the prevention of drowning.

mers and life saver instructors have taught many who have seized the opportunity to learn to swim which is provided free by the Herald in co-operation with the Northcote City Council and supported by the Leader-Budget. 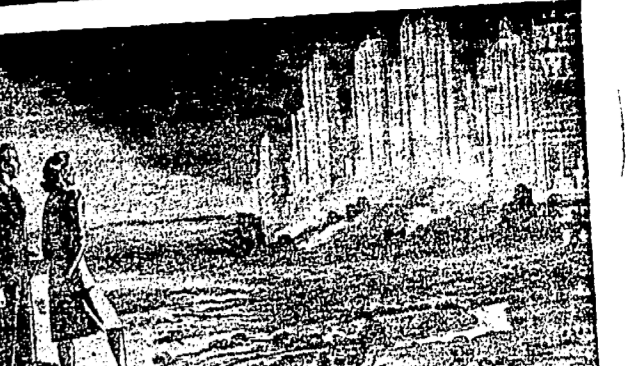
