STOP INDISCRIMINATE CLOSING OF HOTELS

SELFISH PUBLICANS' UTTER DISREGARD FOR PUBLIC PROVIDES AMMUNITION FOR ANTI-LIQUOR INTERESTS

Failing the development of a greater sense of their responsibility to the general public, action should be taken against certain hotel licensees, who by indiscriminate and lengthy closing of their premises, are causing considerable inconvenience to the people and no small embarrassment to their fellow publicans who are trying hard to do the fair thing.

Investigation has proved that any action taken would apparently have to be done by invoking the National Security Regulations. Both the Licensing Court and Police are powerless to act.

As a matter of self interest, the licensees indicted should realise that they must introduce a better system than the prevailing one. There is in our midst a small, but very noisy group, who never cease attempting to press their views on to the statute books. When one considers the use they make of material which is little better than a figment of their own disordered imaginations, it is much more serious to think of the use they'd make of material that has some foundation in fact.

WHEREIN LIES THE FAULT?

The cut in liquor supplies has been in operation long enough for the licensees, or their official organisations—the Licensed Victuallers' Association—to have formulated a plan whereby there would be a methodical and orderly closing of individual hotels in rotation instead of the present haphazard rules system, whereby about four out of every five close together and make it impossible for the one hotel open to render any sort of service. Scenes in Northcote last week at one prominent High St. hostelry (whose licensee has persistently done her best for the public) as men jostled and struggled to obtain a glass of ale, almost beggar description. Month after month this sort of thing continues. With a few exceptions, the attitude of certain hotel licensees seems to be one of "take it or leave it and be damned to the public."

Inquiries addressed to the deputy registrar of the Licensing Court and Inspector Day of the Licensing police elicited the information that both of these authorities are powerless to act even though they may feel certain the public has been in his cellar. Every phase of retail business has been more or less seriously affected by war conditions. Services and goods supplied to the public have, of necessity, been curtailed, but despite these difficulties, the various retailers and their official organisations, rapidly organised so they could continue to serve the public with the least possible amount of discomfort or dissatisfaction.

Insofar as the Licensed Victuallers' Association are concerned, their main interest in life seems to be keeping Professor Copland convinced that \$3d. for an 11oz. pot (usually not obtainable) and 7d. for a 7oz. glass is an equitable deal for the customer! Should the situation not improve, citizens should immediately agitate to have these irresponsible licensees forced into line and compelled to realise that they too, along with other businesses, have a responsibility to the public. Copies of this article are being forwarded to our Federal and State Parliamentary members and citizens are asked to support these views by also lodging their protest with Mr. Cain, M.L.A. and Mr. E. Brennan, M.H.R.

WASTE PAPER BASKETS

IN A DILAPIDATED CONDITION

At the meeting of the Northcote City Council on Monday, Cr. W. H. Turner said that some time ago the Council had granted permission for the placing of waste paper containers at various points in the city as part of the State wide salvage scheme, to help the war effort. Many of these baskets had been shifted about from place to place, and they were getting quite dilapidated. He would like a report on the matter especially in reference to one basket near the corner of Hutton St and St. George's Rd which had changed its location three times.

Cr. H. Ellis seconded the motion, and said at the same time he would like a report concerning the basket opposite Hawthorn Rd in St. George's Rd where a heap of scrap-iron had been left.

Cr. J. W. French: A wire basket which is supposed to be located at the corner of Andrew St and Mitchell St has been carted round and emptied out by children and the contents have been blown all over the locality.

Cr. A. J. Gill said that at the corner of Westsarth and High there was a basket and another on a vacant allotment opposite Union St. These containers were frequently full and when more was deposited it simply blew

away. Suggestions had been made that binged loose-covers made of wire mesh should be fitted to the baskets.

The Town Clerk (Mr. J. A. Thomson) said that the remarks passed by councillors would apply to almost every basket for waste located in the city streets. The containers were somewhat of a nuisance and were often tipped over. The baskets had to be ported to allow of ease in emptying them.

Cr. W. Oliver: Unless the baskets are anchored the children will continue to tip them over. It seems to me that the only way to get over this trouble is to educate the children. If the baskets were secured with locks and chains the extra effort to unlock them and lock them up again for emptying would make the proposition un-economic.

The matter was referred to the Engineer (Mr. A. R. Hill) for report.

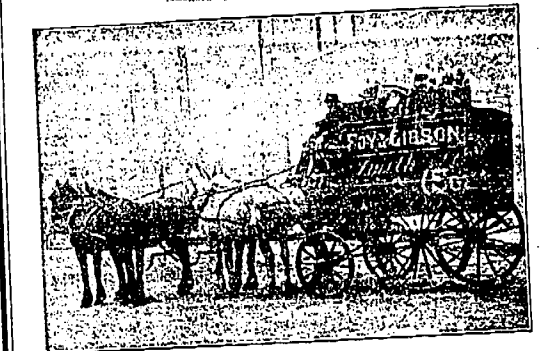

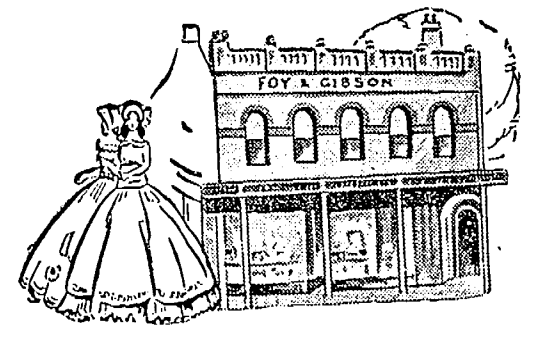

TIPS ON COOKING VEGETABLES

In these days of meat rationing, these hints on cooking vegetables will be found of service. Vegetables are usually plentiful, and will help out the meat rations. Always cook green vegetables in a small amount of water, tightly covered, and in the shortest possible time, to get the fullest flavor and the most food value. It is a good idea to add the salt (no soda, please!) half way through the cooking.

Adding half a teaspoon of sugar to vegetables such as corn, peas or carrots gives extra flavor, especially if the particular vegetable in question happens to be a little on the elderly side.

It's better to wash leafy green vegetables such as spinach, silver beet and lemon juice or vinegar added to the water, helps to remove grit easily, and you'll find that water sufficient for the cooking will cling to the leaves.

When cooking cauliflower, cabbage, onions or beetroot, one teaspoon of lemon juice or vinegar added to the water, helps to retain the full color of the vegetables.

To shorten the baking time of large jacket potatoes, cut out a one-inch cylinder half way through each potato with an apple corer.

More about potatoes in their jackets—which is a very economical way to do them when you have the oven going already for a casserole or a roast dinner. Scrub the potatoes well first, and rub them over with a pinch of softened butter. This keeps the skins soft, and helps to form a good firm shell if you want to have baked stuffed potatoes on the menu.

In the interests of variety, try these ways of treating carrots. Brown a little butter in a pan, and heat up cooked sliced carrots therein. Or bake alternate layers of sliced carrots and onion circles with scallions in a casserole containing a little water. A moderate oven for this, and just before cooking is finished, sprinkle with shredded cheese. Or cook your carrots in long strips, then season with melted butter, salt and pepper, and sprinkle thickly with finely chopped parsley.

Parsnips dull? They are delicious when cooked with a little sugar. Cut cooked parsnips lengthwise, spread with half a cup of brown sugar, a little melted butter, and a tablespoon of water, and let them cook gently until the mixture is syrupy.

You have something special when you cook cabbage with one third of a cup of (thick) or fresh phenepie juice and two thirds of a cup of water. The phenepie flavor will disappear, leaving the cabbage with a brand new and delicious flavor of its own.

Perhaps spinach DOES need some disguising. Here's how! Make a cheese sauce with 6 ozs cheddar cheese and 1 cup of milk. Shred the cheese in a double saucepan with two tablespoons of milk and stir until melted. Keep on low heat and add remaining milk slowly, stirring until the sauce is blended smooth. Place freshly cooked spinach in a casserole, pour the cheese sauce over it, garnish with huttered breadcrumbs and pop in the oven for ten minutes or so until the top is lightly browned.

1 1/2 cups sliced, baked carrots.

1 1/2 cups bacon sauce.
3 rashers bacon.

Put the carrots in a greased casserole. Cover with the beans and top with bacon sauce made as follows: Chop or dice three rashers of bacon and fry until crisp. Add two tablespoons flour and stir till smooth without browning. Add 1 1/2 cups milk, stir till boiling and simmer two minutes. Season with salt and pepper. Place three rashers of bacon parallel along the top. Bake in a moderate oven (350 degrees F.) until crisp. Garnish with sprigs of parsley. Serves five.

Savoury Supper Sandwich

6 slices of bread.
6 thick tomato slices.
4 oz. packet of tasty cheese.
12 short strips of bacon.

Mayonnaise
Toast bread slices on one side. Spread unseasoned side with mayonnaise or sandwich relish and place slice of tomato on each piece of bread. On top of each to make into a sandwich. Spread with the unseasoned side of the bacon upper the unseasoned side of the tomato and the unseasoned side of the cheese. Cook under grill until the cheese is melted and the bacon crisp and the bread toasted. Serves six.

Thin slices cooked bacon.

Cut slices of bacon in half, spread each half with shredded cheese and a dash of pickle or relish. Roll up firmly and pierce or prick. Cook slowly under grill. Drain on paper and serve hot.

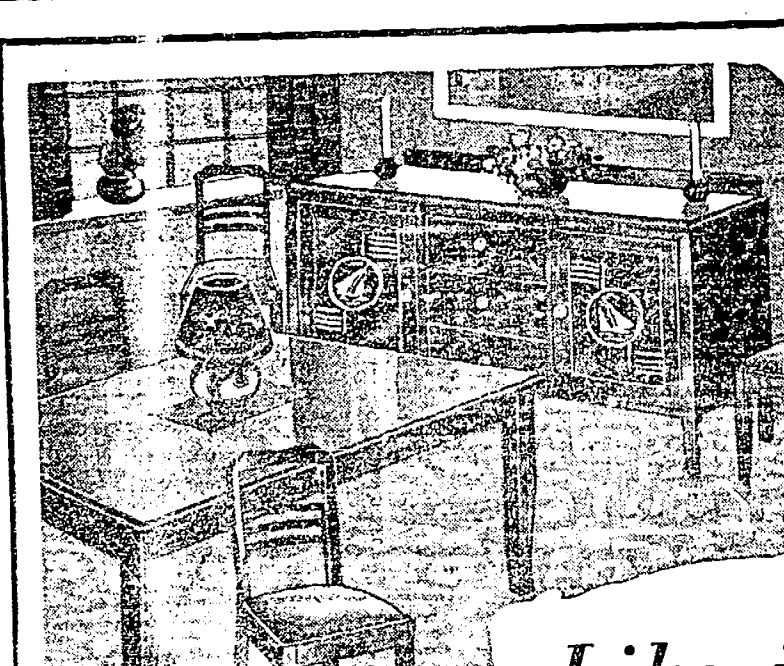
