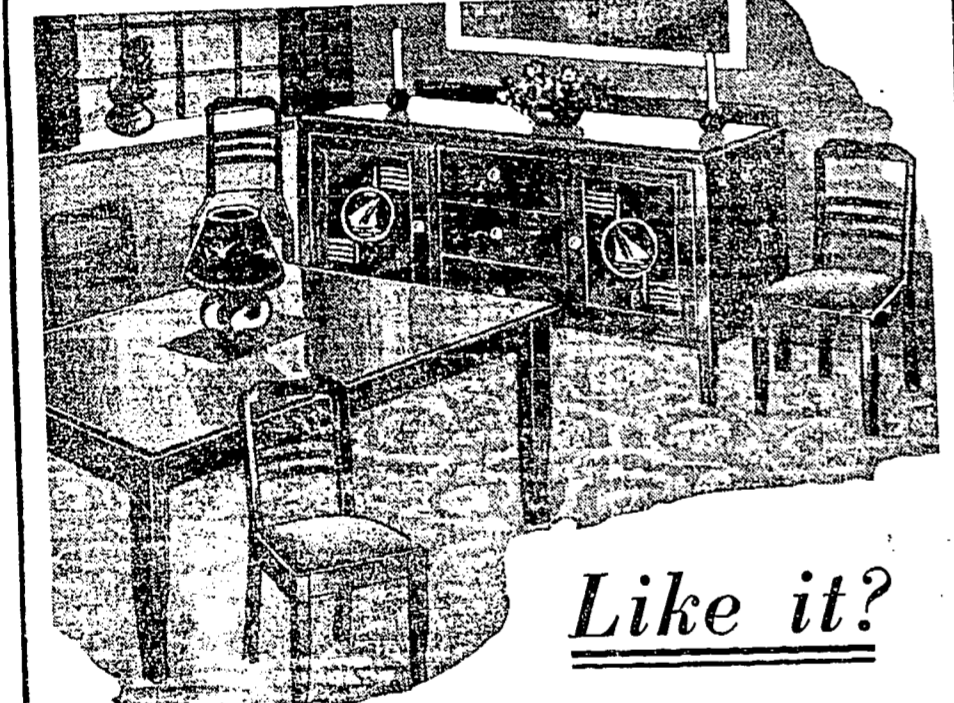

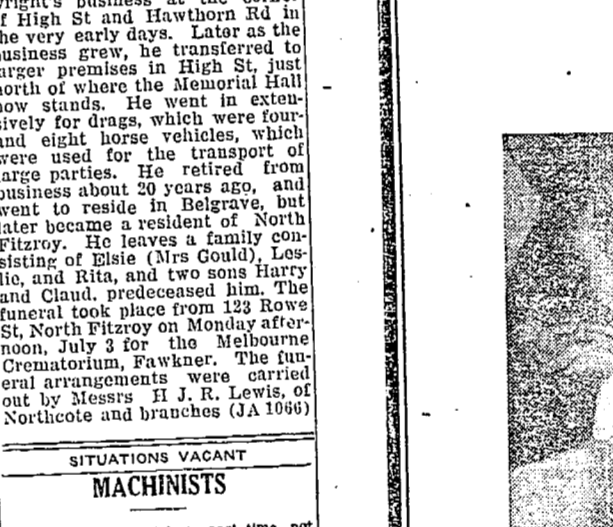

Questions In Parliament On Thornbury Level Crossings

Interlocking Gates Needed At Woolton Av, Normanby Av, And Smith St.
From time to time requests have been made to the Railway Commissioners for the protection of pedestrian crossings at three level crossings over the railway Thornbury, where there have been several tragedies, quite a number of "near accidents."

Petition to Minister
Disheartened by the narrow vision of the Railway Commissioners in their outlook on the safety of the public, the West Ward Progress Association resolved to circulate a petition asking the Minister for Railways to take action in the matter. This petition was signed by many thousands of ratepayers and residents, and was forwarded through the Northcote City Council to Mr. J. Cain.

It will be recalled that the late Mr. J. S. Whalley killed some months ago when he was run down by a train when crossing the line at one of these crossings. Matters stand at present it is possible for pedestrians to enter the crossings at any time as the present pedestrian gates are not locked upon the approach of a train; and due to bends in the line, it is not possible for pedestrians to see trains approaching. The remedy sought is the provision of interlocking pedestrian gates at the Normanby Avenue, Woolton Avenue and Smith St. crossings. This would be simpler and less expensive than regading the line.

Questions by Mr. Cain
On July 6, in answer to questions by the Leader of the Opposition (Mr. Cain) in the Legislative Assembly, regarding Northcote level crossings, Mr. Oldham, Minister for Railways, advised that the Railway Commissioners were investigating the practicability of regading a section of the line and providing an overline bridge at Ballantyne St. This would eliminate level crossings at Normanby Ave and Smith St. The work would be a post-war project. The new proposals seem to be a method of "killing the scheme with kindness." No doubt it will be found when the estimates are put to hand that the "heavy cost" does not warrant the work being put in hand—a favorite excuse so far as the Railways are concerned.

Better Traffic and Transport: Strong support for better transport facilities from the northern suburbs and provision of adequate routes for transport within the City of Northcote. 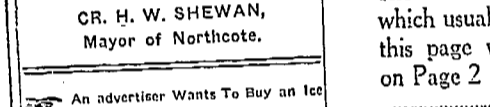

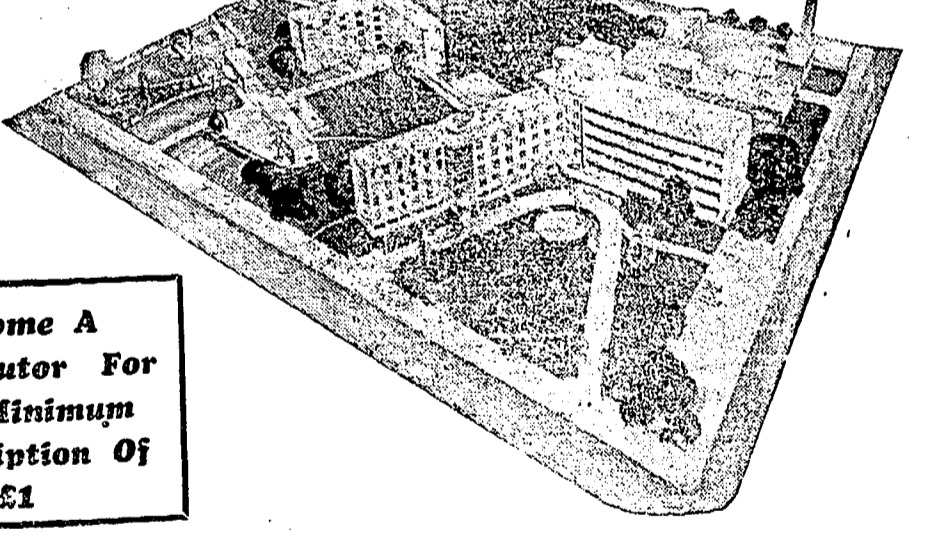

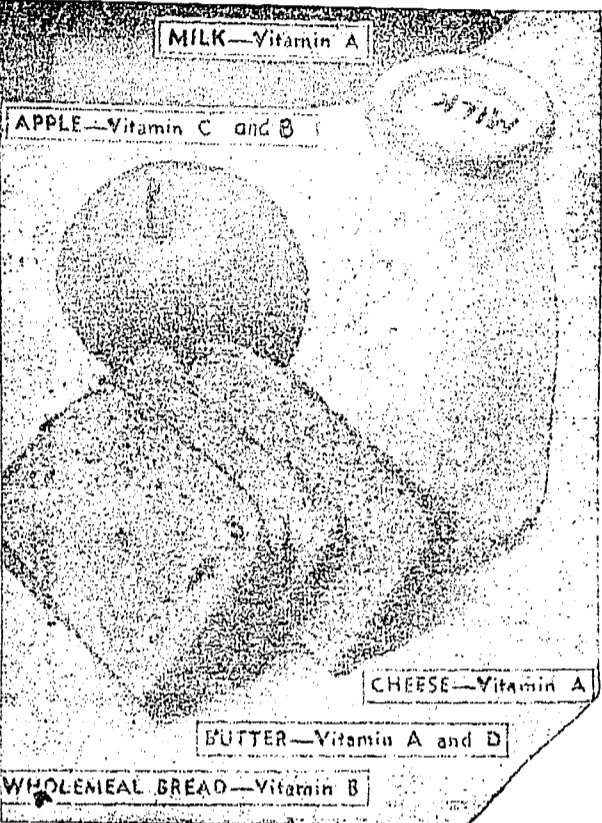

Memorial Hall To Be Rebuilt

APPEAL FOR £15,000 LAUNCHED

At a well attended meeting of the Northcote Sub-Branch on Monday evening the president (Mr. G. J. Peach) launched an appeal for £15,000 to rebuild the Memorial Hall. The idea accepted is that the hall shall be of two storeys with a hall on the ground floor with facilities for catering and that club, reading, library, writing, billiard and recreation rooms will be on the first floor.

Mr. Jim Foley, who reported on the activities of the building committee, said that the present hall was erected at the end of last war with money raised by voluntary subscription. The Northcote council had also been a large contributor and had had material assistance in the committee in their efforts.

The Northcote Council and the City Engineer had proved most helpful and at a recent conference it was decided to co-operate.

It was decided to raise the money by public subscription and the sale of tickets at 1/-, 5/-, 10/- and 20/- each. The City had been zoned preparatory to launching the drive.

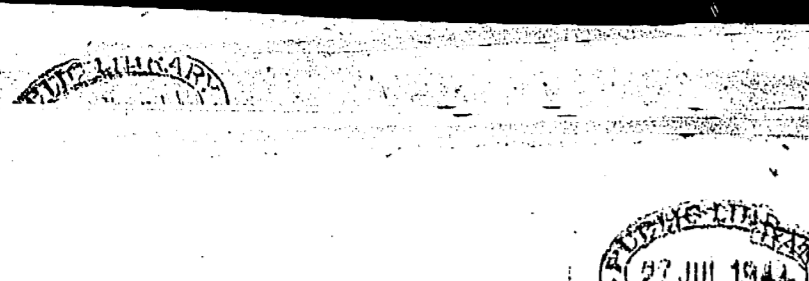
