High St. Lighting — What Of Its Future?

The Northcote Council at its meeting on Monday, September 25, authorised the Electrical Engineer (Mr. G. H. Thomas) to purchase 50 street lighting fixtures for the extension of fluorescent lighting of High St.

Cr. A. V. Peters said the purchase and installation of these units would complete the lighting of High St.

Cr. H. E. Ellis said that when the lighting restrictions were lifted, councillors were informed that the council had in stock a number of fluorescent lighting fittings and it was suggested that these be used, and that the question of the permanent lighting of High St be deferred until such time as the council as a body had had a chance to inspect systems of highway lighting in other areas. He himself favored the use of sodium units for highway lighting, and he understood that sodium lighting gave 75 per cent better lighting for a given wattage.

Cr. Peters said that at present sodium lighting units were unobtainable, and it might be years before such units could be obtained. In the meantime 50 fluorescent units were available, and the question was: "Would the council buy them or not?"

Cr. Ellis: If fluorescent lighting is installed now, it will be very difficult in the future to have the system changed. Then again, if it was decided to make a change at some future time what would be done with the fluorescent units? He contended that if the sodium lighting was the best system for use in High St, then the same type of lighting should be

used in the side streets also. It had been argued that fluorescent lights could be transferred to dangerous intersections as an extra warning to road users, but he considered sodium lights at these points would be just as effective—if not more so, and at the same time give better lighting.

Cr. W. H. Turner said he objected to the council being "crowded" into a decision on a matter of this kind. He felt that both sodium and mercury vapor (fluorescent) types of lighting were ghastly, and would prefer a return to white lighting. As it was, almost every authority dealing with the lighting of streets, considered the matter from the viewpoint of motorists. The colored lighting was unearthy.

Cr. W. Oliver: Maybe the colored lighting is unearthy, but all the same it helps to keep people on earth. (Laughter.)

Cr. Turner: We have installed some fluorescent units, and this type of lighting is also in use in Preston. These 50 units have become available, and if we do not buy them, we do not know when we will be able to get any more. Perhaps under the circumstances it would be as well to go ahead with the installation of fluorescent lighting, rather than have a "pickah" system of lighting.

Cr. M. C. Jones said that in the days of the blackout, Northcote had had the best lighted "blackout." (Laughter.) He meant by that, that under the maximum lighting permitted under the regulations, the visibility was better in Northcote streets than in other municipalities. Since the lighting restrictions had been lifted, Preston had put into operation its big highway units, and he felt that Northcote Council would have to do something to improve the lighting in High St. While he agreed that the councillors had decided to make inspections for the purpose of determining the relative merits of sodium and mercury vapor lighting, he also felt that it would not be of much use making such an inspection
